From The Editor's Notebook

A majority of us own and/or operate computers for various reasons. Whether it's a housewife inputting her grocery list for the end-of-the-week shopping excursion, a banker reviewing his list of clients and the transactions they recently made, a student brushing up on his daily homework lessons, or a newspaper editor writing his weekly column, many of us are becoming accustomed to turning on our computers as part of the routine of feeling comfortable in our environment.

Playthings for some, computers rapidly have made an impact on all our lives, yet this column is not being written to detail all the progress we have made because of advancements in the Technology Era. That would take tomes.

It's the thought of how much computers will be able to do in the future that's frightening to me.

Katherine and I went to see "The Net" last week. "The Net" is a film starring Sandra Bullock as a computer genius who acquires information from the Internet and has it on a computer disk. That disk, if revealed to the public, could spell the end for the programmer, who guarantees security on these disks, but gets into the purchasing companies' computer files and wreaks havoc.

To stop Bullock, the enemy virtually wipes her life away and gives it to another person. As far as computers are concerned in the film, Bullock is a completely different person. Her driver's license and Social Security numbers are given to another person, her house is sold when she returns from vacation and her car is no longer in the spot she left it when she went away. The impersonator accepts an employment position designed especially for Bullock.

Bullock, in the meantime, learns, much to her dismay, that she has a police record for convictions on drug dealing and prostitution, among others, all because her enemies can tap into practically any computer they want and change information. It's a simple plot to follow, but when you let your imagination run, it can take you places you might not want to go.

I know how to operate a computer, and I know how to work with programs, but beyond that, I'm not very literate in computer lingo and how much a computer can do. So for me, this film was a frightening indication of our future — a time when anyone who has the capability can tap into our lives with the press of a button.

Credit card transactions could reveal when and how often we shop, phone usage could reveal whom we talk to and for how long, video store visits could reveal the kinds of movies we enjoy, and virtually anything that required giving our Social Security number could appear on the little screen known as the computer monitor.

The theory is not far-fetched. Visit Epcot Center in Florida and discover just how close we are to a world like this with rapid advancements in technology — and refer to See NOTEBOOK, Page B3

Freeholders honor Gibson for his service to county

Former Deputy Union County Manager and Director of Public Safety Harold Gibson recently was honored for his service to the county with a resolution by the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders.

Gibson, a resident of Plainfield, left the county June 30 to take the job of chief of investigators with the Essex County Prosecutor's Office.

"We will miss Harold dearly, as a person and as a professional," said Union County Manager Ann Baran. He not only served a deputy county manager, but as director of Public Safety, which included overseeing the county jail, the county police and other divisions. "We are sorry to see him go," Baran added.

Gibson often liked to get out on the street, to see what was going on in the areas for which he was responsible. This hands-on approach even had him assisting in carrying a suicide victim

through rough terrain in the Watching Reservation to an ambulance.

He began his career in public service in 1961 as a police officer walking the beat in the City of Newark, and he was on the force for 25 years, attaining the rank of lieutenant. During this time he attended school at night for 11 straight years, and received a bachelor's degree from Rutgers University in political science, and a law degree from Seton Hall.

He became director of Public Affairs and Safety for the City of Plainfield in 1986, and took on the additional duties of city administrator in 1988, and began working for Union County in 1990.

"Harold did an excellent job for us, and we are sorry to see him leave," said Freeholder Chairwoman Linda DiGiovanni.

Plant fined before explosion for matter unrelated to blast

A Pennsylvania trash-to-steam plant was fined more than \$140,000 before suffering a fatal explosion that killed two workers, according to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection.

That facility was constructed by Ogden Martin Systems, the same company that built a similar plant in Rahway.

The Lancaster County, Pa. burner was fined for emissions and record-keeping violations that occurred between the time of the plant's 1991 opening and 1993.

However, the fines were for violations that are deemed minor by both DEP officials and company representatives.

"What these two events demonstrate to the Union County Utilities Authority and the Board of Chosen Freeholders is that their jobs didn't end when garbage started burning in Rahway," said Walter McNeil, a Democratic freeholder candidate.

"It should be more apparent that the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders should hold a public hearing to assess the results of the ongoing OSHA investigation into the deaths, and also review why there are so many environmental fines regarding emissions at a plant which is virtually identical to the

Union County facility," he added.

When the Pennsylvania facility was being planned, Ogden Martin agreed to limit the emissions of pollutants like carbon monoxide, sulfur dioxide, hydrogen chloride, oxide and nitrogen.

It also assured the Lancaster County Solid Waste Management Authority that it would provide the DEP with plant emissions reports.

The plant was fined for exceeding its emissions limit of pollutants such as sulfur dioxide, and for mistakes made in its reports, said Sandra Roderick, coordinator for com-

munity relations for the South Central Region of the Pennsylvania DEP.

However, Roderick noted that the amount of hazardous materials released did not pose a health threat to the surrounding area, and instead were the result of strict code requirements.

"The operating requirements are extremely stringent, and most of the violations were not severe," said Roderick. "We put the regulations together on the best available information at the time, being that we have always been extremely conservative in the way we allow facilities to operate. We have now realized that some of those regulations could not be attained."

"Pennsylvania might have the most stringent sets of regulations in the country," said Gail Petersen, spokesperson for Ogden Martin.

"The violations that we were fined for were mainly for temperatures in the boiler that lasted three to six minutes," she explained. "There were a few other things but they were very minor. We are comfortable with the facility."

The fines are unrelated to the July 28 accident, when a burner burst after two lightning strikes occurred during a 15-minute span.

Hot gas poured out of the rupture. See LOCALS, Page B3

Workers approve three-year contract

A three-year contract settlement has been ratified by Union Council No. 8, which represents about 1,000 county workers, mostly health-care employees at Rummells Specialized Hospital of Union County in Berkeley Heights, announced Union County Manager Ann Baran.

"The settlement provides for the transfer of all the employees in the traditional full indemnity health-care plan to a Preferred Provider Network or an HMO," said Baran. This move to Blue Select from the Blue Cross/Blue Shield P.A.C.E. plan, and a pharmacy network along with a co-pay increase to \$10 for brand-name drugs, will realize projected annualized cost savings of \$370,000, she said.

By changing to a managed-care grouping of hospitals and physicians,

members will avoid co-payments for their health care. The contract also calls for salary adjustments to offset cost-of-living increases for each year of the agreement, and the introduction of a performance-based employee evaluation system.


General wage increases of 3 percent this year, 3.5 percent in 1996 and 1997 were agreed upon, which when combined with the annual health insurance savings add up to a net increase of 6.75 percent, or about 2.25 percent per year, said Union County Freeholder Chairwoman Linda Di Giovanni. The terms of the performance evaluation system are to be finalized during the next 90 days, and the system is to be implemented in 1996 for use in assessing the issuance of increments in 1997, and for outstanding performance.

"I am very happy that an agreement has been reached, one that is fair to both sides and fair to our taxpayers," said Di Giovanni.

Baran said the performance evaluation system represents the first time the county has been able to negotiate a merit system for contractual employees. It will begin to bring those employees in line with the non-contractual employees, who have had such a system in place since 1993.

"I am extremely pleased that both parties have utilized the collective negotiation process to reach a fair agreement. This agreement provides significant cost controls for the benefit of the taxpayer, and also fairly meets the legitimate needs of the workers," said Baran.

Law enforcement officials take heart in drop in domestic violence cases

It's been 10 years now since the Union County Prosecutor's Office became the first law-enforcement agency in the state to seize firearms in domestic violence cases.

And now, more than 1,000 gun seizures later, law enforcement officials are talking comfort in the latest data showing fewer injuries and deaths from domestic disputes.

"It's not been an easy road, but one well worth traveling," said Prosecutor Andrew K. Ruotolo Jr., highlighting a number of safeguards built into the laws that began in Union County and have taken hold throughout New Jersey.

Improved training, mandated by

Ruotolo's office for all 1,800 police officers in the county, has resulted in an increase in the quality and quantity of domestic violence arrest cases and prosecution in the courtroom.

In addition, he said, the figures showing a rise in cases yet slight decreases in the deaths and injuries reflect the real punishment and deterrent factors that result when police officers, prosecutors and judges follow the letter of the law with regard to New Jersey's tough statute.

First Assistant Prosecutor Michael J. Lapolla said the policies developed in Union "have pretty much become the standard operating procedures throughout the state." The first man-

datory gun seizure policy took effect in August 1985, following an incident where a wife wrote to police in Linden asking for the return of her husband's gun. He used the weapon to kill her and then himself.

Now, according to Assistant Prosecutor Laura A. Hook, the procedures allow for seizure of weapons under four separate scenarios: when there are weapons present at the scene, by order of the court, as a condition of bail, or in the execution of a domestic violence search warrant.

"Every week in the courtroom of Superior Court Judge Rudolph N. Hawkins, the gun hearings are held," See RUOTOLO, Page B3



tured boiler tube, burning the two plant employees.

Ogden Martin found 10 ruptured boiler tubes in the exploded burner.

The UCUA is keeping tabs on Ogden's investigation, its executive director, Jeffrey Callahan, assured Union County freeholders last week.

"Because it happened in another jurisdiction, we have no high degree of ability to manage the investigation," said Callahan. "But we are in close communication with Ogden Martin to find out all the information they learn as they go on."

"We want a thorough and complete review of what happened," added UCUA Chairwoman Blanche Banasiak.

"We want them to implement any other safety procedures they can, and we gave them a large list

of questions we want answered," she added.

"It's still too early to find out what happened at that facility, and if it could happen at our facility," said Callahan.

Ogden Martin made a public presentation to the UCUA recently in which the company outlined the possible reasons for the Lancaster plant's deadly explosion.

Because of the lightning connection, Ogden Martin is checking the lightning suppression systems in all its facilities. The Lancaster incinerator is the tallest building for several miles around, noted Callahan.

Company representatives also said they are investigating the possibility that the site's propane auxiliary fuel burners malfunctioned when the lightning struck.

Banasiak said employees at the Rahway facility are "pretty much at ease" over what happened at the similar Lancaster site.

Ruotolo recognized for domestic violence decline

she said, estimating that weapons are generally returned to the owners in less than 20 percent of all seizure cases.

Ruotolo said that while other forms of violent crimes are up slightly and overall crime is down, the recent compilations from the New Jersey State Police reveal the number of domestic cases involving gun-related injuries commonly referred to as aggravated assault dropped by 16 from 224 to 189 throughout New Jersey last year while other gun-related offenses dropped from 135 to 128.

Moreover, according to Capt. William Jagusak of the Prosecutor's Office Administrative Services Unit, there have been 171 cases to date in 1995 where county residents had weapons taken from them and that does not include the City of Elizabeth,

where police store their own seized weapons.

"In these 171 cases, police and Union County sheriff's officers took 758 weapons, with about two-thirds being guns and the balance other weapons," Jagusak said, pointing out the cases have increased steadily for the last three years with 189 cases in 1993, 155 in 1994 and this year's total expected to top 225.

What happens to the guns when the court orders they not be returned? Assistant Prosecutor Robert P. O'Leary said detectives bring the guns and other weapons to a corporate facility where they are melted down.

Detective Jerome Kotlarz said the destruction of weapons totals are 154 for 1993, 155 the following year and 201 so far for the first seven months of 1995.

Because of the intense training initiative, the policies and the domestic violence protocols developed under his direction, Ruotolo was presented with an award this week by the Elizabeth-based YWCA of Union County.

Authorities said uniform crime reports reveal the number of domestic violence murders statewide dropped 22 percent last year, from 54 to 42.

Even when weapons are returned

by Hawkins, there are severe conditions attached. For example, Hook said, the court in most instances orders the offender to install trigger locks, making it impossible to operate the firearms without physically unlocking the trigger with a key and then taking the time to actually load the weapon with ammunition.

Then, once purchased, the locks have to be physically brought to the weapons vault and placed on the weapon before it can be signed out.

In cases involving police officers, said Ruotolo, the court and his office sometime require a handgun to be kept at headquarters.

Fest ends season with Russian production

It's not difficult to determine why New Jersey Shakespeare Festival Artistic Director Bonnie Monte decided to bring Russian dramatist Alexander Ostrovsky's "Artists and Admirers" to the stage.

The play, which is the final offering in the fest's uneven 33rd season, examines the lives of artists and society's treatment of them. In many of her pre-show introductions and in the Director's Notes for "Artists and Admirers," Monte decried what she considers to be an attack on the arts in this country. She has urged people to write to their elected officials and demand they show the creative world the respect it deserves — by this she means, keep their hands off the funding. This production fits neatly into Monte's beliefs and is probably meant to serve as one big nudge to the audience.

Still, there are many people who will be unmoved by Monte's passion for the stage and a few cynical folks might question her motivation — after all, she does make her living through the theater. It's difficult to determine how many people flocked to the show to register their mirroring of Monte's beliefs as opposed to those who were just looking for a night of good theater.

So, the question is: did Monte manage to put across her message in an entertaining way?

Partially. "Artists and Admirers" tells the story of Alexandra Nikolavna Negina — Negina for short — who is forced to choose between her life as an artist and the more conventional ways of marriage. There are people in her life who support her, those who undermine her, those who want her to completely embrace the life of an artist and

those who want her to abandon it all together.

The play's strength is its lively, vibrant female characters, each which possesses a personality quirk or two which makes her distinguishable from the rest. Unfortunately, there are only five women on the stage out of 15 — three in major roles. The male characters are not nearly as interesting and many of them are unnecessary. In fact, two of the men bear such a strong resemblance to each other it is difficult to tell them apart — and strangely enough, it doesn't matter.

The stand-out cast member of this play is Judith Anna Roberts, who portrays Negina's mother, Domna Pantelyevna. A devoted mother who truly wants what's best for her daughter, the character vacillates between her unconditional support of Negina's acting talents and her desire to see her daughter live a life of luxury. The mother is sensitive — but she's also sharp, able to come up with a snappy retort at a moment's notice. Robert portrays all the nuances of her character skillfully.

Amanda Ronconi brings a graceful air to Negina, the play's emotional core. At times her character becomes a bit shrilly — due in no small part to the amount of pontificating she must do about her love for her craft — but it's still one of the better roles for women that can be found in a theatrical piece. This is even more astounding considering "Artists and Admirers" was written more than a century ago, a time when strong women were rarities. This detail makes the play easily transferable to the '90s.

Other noteworthy cast members are Edmond Genest as Ivan Semyonich Velikatov, the man who offers Negina wealth if she's willing to give up her dreams; and Kate Hampton as Nina Vasilyevna Smelskaya, Negina's rich — but envious — friend.

Admirers," two ballerinas change the scenery along with the characters who are on the stage at the time. The character of Negina "directs" the scene changes, turning them into a play within a play.

Let's hope others don't follow Garcia's lead

It's been a little more than two weeks since Jerry Garcia of the Grateful Dead died. Every day since, we've been subjected to tributes that make Garcia seem like a cross between Beethoven and Jesus Christ.

This column is not another tired recount of Garcia's talents. Rather, it's my dismay at the canonization of a man who led a life others should not emulate.

In many of the recently published columns and stories, the fact that Garcia died in a drug rehabilitation clinic seems to be ignored. The medical reason that Garcia died was a heart attack; the actual reason was that he pushed his body beyond human endurance. Ever since I can remember, Garcia has looked much older than his years, and in the pictures that ran in newspapers and magazines after his death, he looked worse than any 53-year-old I have ever seen.

Garcia was an outspoken proponent of the legalization of drugs, and we're not just talking marijuana for medicinal purposes either. His drug of choice was heroin — a narcotic noted

for its physically and psychologically addictive qualities. I'm sure if Garcia was ever asked if it did him any good, he would probably fall over laughing.

Of course, Garcia was not the first public figure to die directly or indirectly from drugs and it would be remiss of me to ignore what made him famous. Also, it would be rather hypocritical of me to chastise Garcia when my personal musical idol — Pete Townshend of the Who — is himself a recovered heroin addict. There's "the music," after all, two words that have been spoken with such reverence lately that I've actually tried to listen intently to the Dead's songs. The truth is, I don't like them. In fact, I hate them.

I listened for some great musical

virtuosity and could find none. Sure, the band members can sing and play instruments better than I can, but I never claimed to be a musician. And what's all the fuss about these lyrics, anyway? For all you non-fans, I offer you the following vignettes — please keep in mind that most of the lyrics are undecipherable so please forgive me if I've misconstrued a line: "Truckin' on a one way street... just keep truckin' on," "whistle through your teeth and spit, but it's all right," and, my personal favorite, "drivin' that train, high on cocaine. Casey Jones, you better watch your speed." The last line is from a band that fans have been swearing up and down never promoted drug use in their songs.

Oh, I almost forgot about the fans. The Deadheads. Most of the press coverage seems to be as enamored with them as it is with Garcia. From the contact I've had with these overzealous fanatics throughout my life, I can say with all confidence that I have never found them to be any more spiritual, enlightened or profound than the rest of the population. As a matter of

fact, I always found them kind of dopey — no pun intended — with their '60s retro, unshowered, hippie looks. One fan said that Grateful Dead shows contain the least amount of violence out of all the rock shows, but that's probably because everyone is stoned out of his or her mind. Bear in mind these shows are often seven plus hours long and if these people are anything like me, there is nothing I want to sit through or do for that stretch of time. I'm sure if I was so inclined to do anything like that, I'd need my brain numbed as well.

Another reason Deadheads are so fascinating is that many of them have made careers out of following the band from place to place. Ever the considerate ones, the band has been on the road for what seems like an eternity, and the members even have side projects to keep the fans occupied on their off nights. I've read stories of people who have been to hundreds of concerts and have been on tour for years. I don't think this is a noble feat nor a reflection of the superiority of the band, considering there are people

who watch the cult film "Rocky Horror Picture Show" again and again and no one would say that is the best movie ever made.

I find it disturbing that the Grateful Dead — which was supposedly made up of such fine people — never encouraged the Deadheads to, oh, do something more constructive with themselves. And now that Garcia is gone, I've heard more than one say, "Well, what are we going to do now?"

In some way, with his death, Garcia gave the Deadheads their lives back. Now they will have to get jobs in addition to selling trinkets at concerts. They will have to blend in with the rest of society. Hopefully, they will look beyond the Dead's wing-jing lyrics and at the life Garcia lived and make a decision not to follow him to an early grave.

Was Jerry Garcia a hero? No. Was he a genius? No. We are doing a disservice when we use those words to describe someone who had millions of people hanging on his every word yet never gave them the encouragement to find their own salvation.

New Jerseyans who have grown tired of having to endure bleak winters these past few years can take heart; help is available. All they need to do is look to the east — Eastern Europe, that is.

Eastern Europeans, it seems, know a thing or two about cold weather and the ways to survive it. They can't make the wind stop blowing or the snow stop falling, but at least they know that, when the temperature drops, nothing can warm you faster than a hot bowl of borscht with sour cream or some potato pierogies fried with onions.

That unique taste of Eastern European cooking can be found tucked amid the charming brick-lined sidewalks and red spire pear trees of the Cranford business district at Margie's Place, 27 North Union Ave. In a rare blend of "old country" cooking and "new world" convenience, Margie's somehow manages to offer the best of both worlds.

The atmosphere is rather unassuming; it is neat and comfortable, with none of the attention-grabbing mirrors or eye-popping decorations that seem to bog down so many modern restaurants in a mire of glitz and pretention. The people at Margie's definitely show a belief in function over flash, making up in the quality and affordability of the food and service whatever pomp and circumstance they may lack in appearance.

For first-time samplers of Polish, Russian or Ukrainian cuisine, it should be noted that Eastern European food is not for wimps. There's no vegetarian-rabbit food here. This is for real "meat and potatoes" people.

Some of the tastiest of these "meat and potatoes" dishes include Beef Stroganoff, thin strips of

boneless steak cooked with onions and mushrooms in a sour cream sauce. The slightly more adventurous soul might want to try Zrazi, a ground chicken and beef concoction that is sauteed with onions, sandwiched between mashed potatoes, and served with a creamy mushroom sauce on top.

For those whose tastes run to more standard American cuisine, Margie's also offers roasted turkey, meatloaf and flounder dinners and even a spectacular Chicken Milanese for those with a taste for Italian.

Most attractive of all about Margie's is its prices. No dish is priced at more than \$6.95, and most include a choice of rice, noodles or potatoes and any one of a number of delicious soups like vegetable cabbage, borscht, and beef lentil.

All in all, Margie's offers a unique, inexpensive break from the American norm of fried chicken and hamburgers. Glasnost has come to Union County, and it is delicious.

On my last trip to the restaurant, I enjoyed the Hungarian Goulash — big, tender chunks of beef doused in a thick, rich gravy and served over noodles — and the "vareniki kartofelem," or potato pierogies. Pierogies are the Ukrainian version of meat dumplings, with potatoes deep-fried inside of a fresh, homemade dough, and these particular pierogies — thick and moist, with loads of sauteed onions and fresh sour cream — were among the best I'd ever tasted.

Sunglasses are more than just a fashion statement

Sunglasses have become an essential accessory to our summer attire. Americans today sport "shades" in every color and style, even our best known designers and celebrities are making their mark in the world of sunglasses.

Wearing these spectacles, however, gives you something of greater importance than high-fashion; they give you protection. The Outpatient Ophthalmic Surgery Association of New Jersey is spreading the word about the true benefits of wearing sunglasses.

A good pair of sunglasses will block out the sun's short and long-wave ultraviolet rays, which have been linked to a number of serious eye diseases that can lead to vision loss, according to Prevent Blindness America. New research now indicates that even the sun's longer UVA rays can cause damage to our eyes. Long-term exposure to UV can contribute to the development of cataracts. It has also been associated with pterygium — a tissue growth on the white of the eye that can block vision, skin cancer around the eyelids and macular degeneration.

Dr. Jordan Burke, whose eye surgery center is a member of OOSA, said, "It is not only adults that should heed this warning, but parents are being advised to protect their children's eyes from UV rays as well." Because children spend a great deal of time outside in the warm months, they are at greater risk for eye

damage than adults. One of the immediate dangers Prevent Blindness America reported is photokeratitis. This is a painful type of corneal burn often associated with intense sunlight reflecting from beaches and ski slopes.

"We are not recommending families stay away from the beaches this summer. However, we are advocating the protection against harmful UV rays for the entire family," said Burke.

Sunglasses are available today that block 99 to 100 percent of both types of UV rays: UVA and UVB, and have the UV warning posted on the frame. "The cost is minimal to purchase a good pair of sunglasses in comparison to the amount of damage a low UV pair will do to the eyes," said Burke.

- OOSA members are providing these few tips:
- Keep children out of direct sunlight during the peak time which is from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.
 - Look for sunglasses that block close to 100 percent of UV light.
 - Ask before you purchase a pair of sunglasses if they provide ultraviolet protection.
 - Buy sunglasses for the entire family and wear them outside at all times.
- The American Academy of Ophthalmology joined Prevent Blindness Ameri-

ca and the American Optometric Association in pressing for the maximum UV protection in sunglasses and uniform labeling regulation. Information can be obtained directly by contacting (800) 331-2020, or for more information on purchasing UV block sunglasses, contact the Summit Eye Group at (908) 464-4600, or your closest OOSA member.

More people are walking for fitness

Most people who start fitness programs drop out during the first six weeks. These well-intentioned people do too much too soon, often suffer injuries and become too discouraged to continue, according to Union Hospital Physical Therapist Stephanie Garey.

Fitness walking, however, is praised by health experts as an effective exercise program because it is injury-free and, therefore, has a low dropout rate. It is also a flexible program that can be done at almost any time, anywhere and at any age.

"An estimated 50 million Ameri-

cans currently are reaping the benefits of this form of exercise which used to be dismissed as 'too easy.' They realize that done properly, walking provides aerobic conditioning for your heart, lungs and muscles. It can help fend off high blood pressure, obesity, stress and depression, too," Garey said.

Tests show that walking one mile in 15 minutes at a fairly brisk pace burns about the same number of calories as jogging a mile in 8.5 minutes.

"The President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports recommends a goal of three miles in 45 minutes," she

said. "Beginners, however, should begin by walking 20 minutes every other day at a pace that feels comfortable, going perhaps one-quarter to one-half mile."

Check your heart rate before you start your walk, five minutes into it and again when you are done. To determine your target heart rate, take your pulse for at least 10 seconds and multiply the result by six to get your rate per minute. Then use this equation: (220-your age) X 70 percent. If you are 58 years old, for example, your target heart rate would be 113 beats per minute.

"Ideally, you should exercise at your target heart rate for at least 15 minutes, but use common sense especially when you are just starting your fitness program. In general, if you are too breathless to carry on a conversation as you are walking, you need to slow down — no matter what your heart rate," Garey said.

Garey recommends that any fitness program, of course, should begin with warm-up exercises and muscle stretches, and end with cooling-down exercises to prevent injuries. "Choose shoes that have arch supports, elevate your heel one-half to three-quarters of an inch above the sole of your foot and have uppers of leather or nylon mesh which allow your foot to breathe," she said.

Consult your physician before starting any exercise program, especially if you have a history of medical problems. If you experience any difficulties while you are walking, contact your physician immediately.





BACK TO SCHOOL



Women spend over \$65 billion annually on automobiles

Influenced the purchase of 90 percent of the 1.4 million minivans sold in 1994

Women represent nearly half of U.S. car buyers, spending up to \$65 billion annually on car purchases. Statistics reported nationwide in publications like the Christian Science Monitor, USA Today, Atlanta Constitution confirm the impact of women in the automotive industry.

According to Ford Motor Company research, women influenced the purchase of 90 percent of the 1.4 million minivans sold in 1994. Another Ford study shows the "woman's touch" in escalating truck sales which have climbed since 1986 when 15 percent of the buyers were female. By 1993, 24 percent of truck purchasers were women. A nationwide poll in 1994 revealed that not only do women buy 49 percent of the cars and trucks, but they take care of them, too. 70 percent can check the oil, 58 percent can change a flat tire, 52 percent can charge a battery and 41 percent can do all three.

Sales professionals at Fette Ford/Imports agree with one market researcher recently quoted in a Wall Street Journal article. Citing priorities of dependability and safety, she claimed, "Women view cars as a tool, not as a toy."

Kitty Connolly has noticed this trend among the customers she serves at Fette. A woman is particular about a car's safety, reliability, ride, handling, comfort in the seat — visibility and seat belt adjustment — and space for family and gear. "She also wants a fair price, but is likelier to view price in relation to value."

As her showroom colleague Frank Marx puts it, a woman customer is more likely to insist on certain features important to her, though she understands there may be an addition-

al charge to get exactly what she wants. She is less interested in giving up these features just to get a better price and is frustrated with limits like "you can get that equipment/color in another model, but it doesn't come in this one." Perhaps women, who frequently are a family's primary shopper for apparel and home furnishings — where typically there are a multitude of options — are less conditioned to accept a limited array of options.

Manufacturers have begun to adapt designs to meet women's needs and preferences. Lower step-in heights and more adjustments for seats, seat belts and steering wheels are examples.

Both Connolly and Marx agree that while women want to know more about the product and its features and to know exactly what they're buying, male shoppers are more often focused on price and view the specifics of a vehicle as secondary in importance.

A Fette manager, Tony Yosco, says, "It still amazes me how often a customer will want to get right to the 'bargaining' and he's never even taken the car for a test drive! It's as if 'winning' in the deal is more important than the vehicle."

Connolly's observations also confirm results of a recent J.D. Power survey showing that women car buyers prefer to purchase from other women. She has seen a visible relaxation in women shoppers who sometimes say they are relieved to be able to deal with a woman.

As Connolly observes, "Unfortunately, women have come to expect a patronizing 'sales pitch' and to be treated as if they don't know anything about the product — especially cars. No one likes to be talked down to. One married career woman who

bought her own car from me recently told me she had been to two other dealers closer to her home. She knew exactly what she wanted to buy. The first salesman was too personal, wanting to talk about her instead of the car she was interested in. The second was pushy and arrogant. He lost the sale when he told her to bring in her husband so they could negotiate."

Connolly is sympathetic when she hears such tales because she has experienced similar treatment herself in the past. Since she has been working at Fette, however, she has

observed that a male salesperson who takes the time to present his product in a professional manner and who treats all customers with respect and courtesy can be effective and can make the car buying experience pleasant for both women and men.

Yosco sees most of these stereotypical male salesman/female car shopper problems arising in showrooms that stress high volume sales instead of building relationships and repeat business with customers. One of his jobs is to continuously support and train sales people to deliver sensitive

and professional service to customers.






