From The Editor's Notebook

"The point is our government and legislators can put the squeeze on our newspapers when they have no respect for the working press and certainly no fear. Fear of free press is what makes our form of government work. But not in New Jersey, which explains why we all are in such a sorry State."

I found the above quote in a personal letter to me from a reader who was responding to an editorial we had published in July. He couldn't be more accurate.

A recent series in the *Star Ledger* which exposed corruption in parts of Essex County and the favorable reaction by the public to the series makes a statement. The public was surprised by the publication of the series and thought highly of the newspaper because it went beyond the normal, day-to-day surface coverage for which newspapers today have become known.

One of the biggest criticisms leveled against the American press today is that we roll over and play dead and allow government to do as it pleases. Government no longer fears a free press and has become accustomed to legislating and indulging in corruption without expecting scrutiny from newspapers.

It's gotten to the point that when we hold government accountable for its actions, and perhaps are a little too thorough in our criticism and scrutiny, suddenly, the mouthpieces of our detractors come out in full force and use the "kill the messenger" approach to thwart our efforts.

We're in the midst of the election season and we're seeing these attempts on several fronts.

In Springfield, the Democrats running for Township Committee are asking citizens to boycott our *Springfield Leader*. It seems the Democrats in Springfield are upset that we scrutinize each piece of campaign literature and point out to the public some inaccuracies in the flyers.

By asking the public to boycott the newspaper, the Democrats are hoping that any further scrutiny of their campaign will go unnoticed. That's a campaign strategy that I've never seen before. It will not, however, stop us from continuing to perform our role as watchdog over government and friend to the taxpayer.

One of the statements made in the most recent campaign piece is that "the *Leader* is delivering Republican campaign literature with the newspaper." That literature is called an insert, and at the same cost, we would "deliver" Democratic campaign literature to the citizens of Springfield.

But that's just one example of how "The Truthful Times," the title of the campaign piece, will try to thwart our efforts to exposing truth. Gee, "Truthful Times," newsletter, government, distortion. Kind of sounds like *Pravda* in Springfield.

In Bloomfield, where our newspaper is among the most crusading of our 22 newspapers, we're being

Port dredging plan unveiled for city

State Senate President Donald T. DiFrancesco has unveiled a comprehensive plan to preserve the economic activity at the ports of Newark and Elizabeth by dredging the Newark Bay and the Kill Van Kull.

DiFrancesco will introduce the \$450 million Environmental Cleanup and Containment Act, \$300 million of which will be earmarked for the dredging project. The project considers environmental concerns along with economic necessity of improving the depth of the channels in the port region.

"The Environmental Cleanup and Containment Act is the most ambitious investment New Jersey has ever considered making in its maritime industry," DiFrancesco said. "It is one of the wisest investments this state could make to strengthen its economic future."

DiFrancesco's plan will include the following:

- Improve the depth of the channels in the Newark Bay and the Kill Van Kull to 45 feet;
- Construct subaqueous pits in which dredge materials will be buried, and
- Build a containment area to dispose of the materials after those pits are full.

"The ports of Newark and Elizabeth are two of New Jersey's powerful economic engines, generating \$20 billion in economic activity and sustaining 180,000 jobs annually," DiFrancesco said Oct. 18 at the New Jersey Society of Environmental and Economic Development Conference legislative luncheon in Atlantic City. "The ports are truly the gateway to prosperity for all of North America."

"However they are in danger of extinction," he said.

DiFrancesco said the slowdown in dredging efforts has caused the channels to become shallower. Without expedient action, the channels could become unnavigable, forcing large shippers to move operations to other ports.

"The exodus of shippers will cause a great economic engine to sputter and stall," DiFrancesco said. "Twenty billion dollars in commercial activity and 180,000 jobs will fade away."

DiFrancesco said because of contamination in the dredge materials, ocean disposal is a questionable option. He said the subaqueous pits would be constructed in the floor of the port area and filled with dredge materials. The pits would be capped with clean soil.

After the subaqueous pits are full, the materials would be placed in a containment area, which is an artificial island with an outer perimeter of dikes and pilings that keep the dredge materials from seeping into the surrounding environment. Containment areas are being successfully used to dispose of dredge materials from the harbors in Baltimore and in Norfolk, Va.

DiFrancesco said the subaqueous pits and the containment area would bridge the gap until technology can find a way to decontaminate the dredge materials.

"This proposal does not abandon the hope that technology will give us a means to clean the sediment and make it environmentally safe. It merely gives technology time to catch up," DiFrancesco said.

The DiFrancesco proposal will do more than sustain port activity at its current level. It will improve it by deepening the Kill Van Kull — which naturally is only 40 feet — to 45 feet by dredging up bedrock along with the silt. This will eliminate the need to download the most heavily laden cargo ships and tankers at other ports.

"The Environmental Cleanup and Containment Bond Act is more than good policy. It is real investment. It is a guarantee that New Jersey's ports will be accessible and continue to be a great economic gateway," DiFrancesco said.

County group dares to sponsor hockey game

The Union County Drug Awareness Resistance Education Officer's Association, in conjunction with DARE New Jersey, will co-sponsor a New Jersey Devils vs. the Calgary Flames hockey game at Meadowlands arena.

The event is a benefit fund-raiser for local DARE programs. A limited supply of tickets for the 8 p.m. Nov. 8 game are available at a discounted price of \$24 each.

Support for last year's game was "tremendous," according to Union Police DARE Officer Bob Christie. "Parents, students, teachers, DARE supporters and Devils fans came out in masses to support the event which raised several thousand dollars for DARE," he said.

The DARE program enables police officers to interact with young people on a daily basis, instilling trust while teaching drug, alcohol and violence prevention skills, the importance of rules and laws, assertiveness, self esteem and conflict resolution.

According to New Providence Police Detective Sergeant Scott Torre, the opportunity to build this relationship between young people and the police is just as important as the DARE curriculum itself. Torre, a former resident of Union, also serves

as the president of the Union County DARE Officers Association.

Torre said he views the program as a successful one. "This success is really a tribute to the dedicated efforts of all of our DARE officers," said Torre. "By sowing the seeds of a drug-free lifestyle, the dividends will keep on paying off in terms of

County cutting deputy post

The Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders will move to introduce an ordinance tonight in its regular session to abolish the position/office of deputy manager, according to Freeholder Chairwoman Linda DiGiovanni.

The deputy manager reports directly to the county manager and is responsible for assisting the county manager with day-to-day administrative operations.

The position/office of deputy manager became vacant with the July resignation of Harold Gibson. Because of Gibson's law-enforcement background, he served in the dual capacity as deputy manager/department head of Public Safety. Duties and responsibilities of the deputy county manager, as set forth in Article V of the Union County Administrative Code, are "to serve at the pleasure of the county manager, and...be qualified to perform the duties established."

As Public Safety director, Gibson managed the county's two jails, county police, medical examiner, weights and measures, emergency management and consumer affairs.

With the abolishment of this position/office, the county man-

ger, who if the appointing authority, would be responsible for reassigning those duties. Gibson served as deputy county manager from July 1990 until his resignation to become chief of detectives in the Essex County Prosecutor's Office.

"The freeholders have worked closely with County Manager Ann Baran to carefully evaluate the county's needs, and this decision has been made because it is in the

best interests of Union County," stated DiGiovanni. "We are working hard to do more with less, and continually improve the way we do things." This action will abolish the Union County deputy manager position/office, with an annual salary of \$88,467.

"The Board of Chosen Freeholders and I have been working to reduce the cost of government while maintaining the level and quality of services," said Baran. "Partnerships and teamwork taken a stronghold in Union County government. Consistent with county government's effort to utilize a total quality management approach to reduce costs, increase productivity and eliminate unnecessary layers within the county government structure, I implemented a cross-functional team approach commencing on Oct. 1, 1995, with department heads assuming the functional responsibility of the deputy manager." This cross-functional team manages internal day-to-day activities, with rotating team leadership.

"We no longer live in a world where individuals can act alone, or

It began as an idea, it's still going strong, and now it's being copied by other counties throughout New Jersey.

It is the Union County Youth Academy, and this month a sixth class of youngsters who have had their first brush with the law began learning about ways to avoid further delinquency.

Every Saturday morning when a lot of other teen-agers are still in bed sleeping, young people climb out of two packed vans in the parking lot at the John H. Stamler Police Academy in Scotch Plains to begin light exercise, raising the flag and class workshops ranging from law-related education to problem solving and anger management.

"It's a great concept, developed by Drew Ruotolo, and it works," said First Assistant Prosecutor Michael J. Lapolla. "We have the total support of the courts, probation and our county juvenile officers." Ruotolo is the late Union

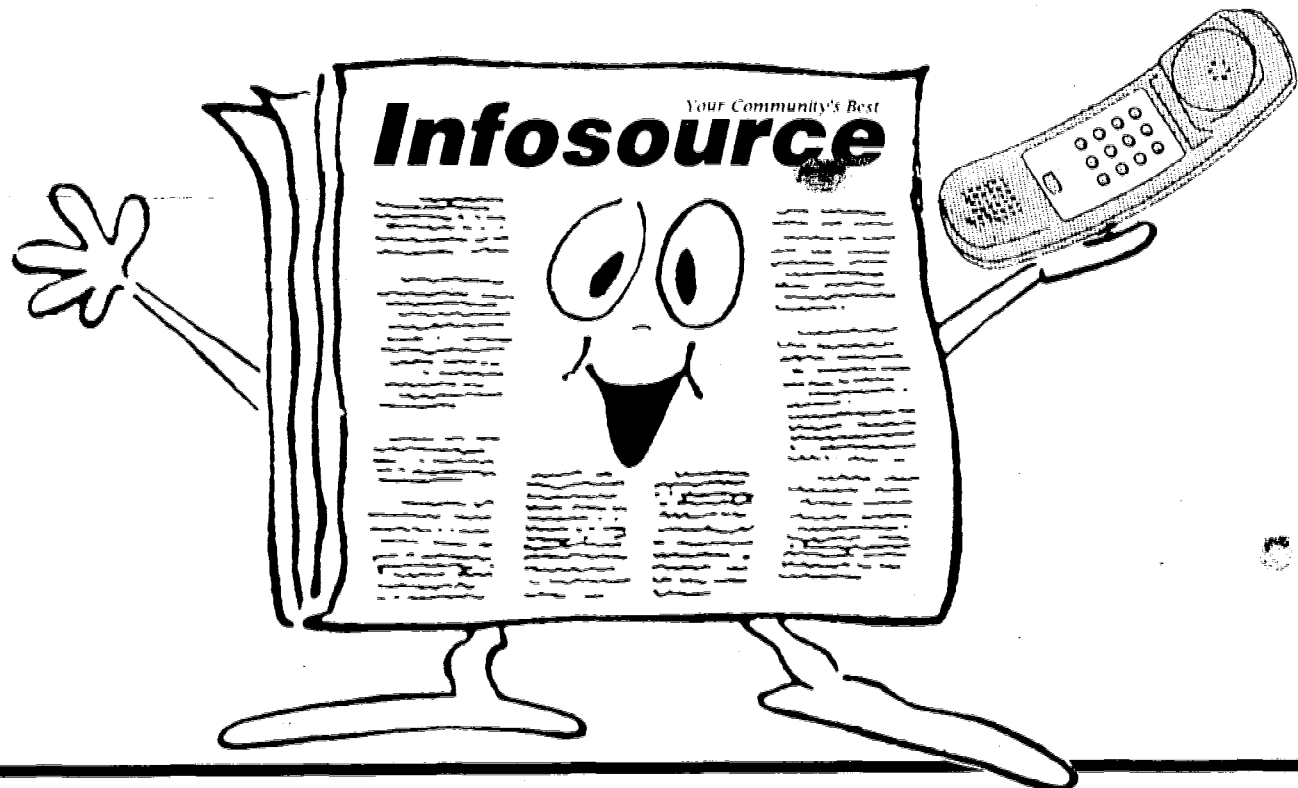

 County prosecutor who died last month.

Since the first class in the spring of 1993, 96 students have graduated from the youth academy and had their juvenile complaints dismissed and their records wiped clean.

This past week, for example, Plainfield Police Officer Rodney

Sanders and Detective Thelma Nieves did a class on "The Role of the Police Officer." Superior Court Judge Rudolph N. Hawkins Jr., the presiding judge of the Family Part in Elizabeth, will be judging a mock trial next month.

And other classes, according to Executive Assistant Prosecutor Robert P. O'Leary, will cover sub-

stance abuse, auto theft, municipal court, conflict resolution and employment training.

The staff, headed by Magann Johnston, includes Pat Elminger, Larry Haman, Detective John Odin, Sheriff's Officer Gail Smith and Debbie Davidson.

The sessions often begin with role-playing, getting the youngsters

to think about why there are laws and consequences of crime.

While the current class has a full 37 teen-agers, with the average age of 15, the class usually loses a few candidates who either fail to attend or become involved in new offenses. The last group that graduated in June lost 6 of the original class of 26, officials said.

Johnston coordinates the entire process, setting up the schedule and ensuring the attendance of parents who must come to at least three of the 12 sessions.

Edward M. Neafsey, acting prosecutor, said he is interested in the results at the academy and knows from going out into schools himself that early intervention pays off.

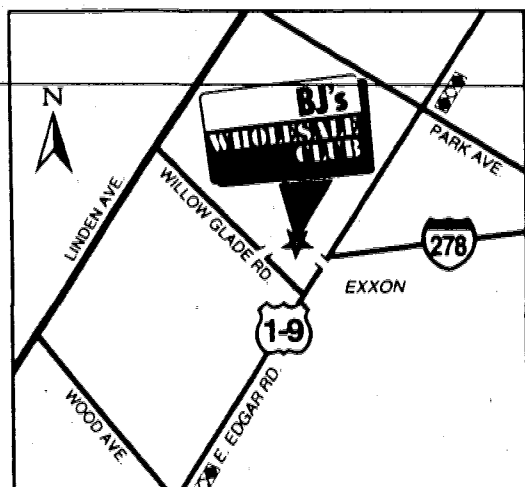

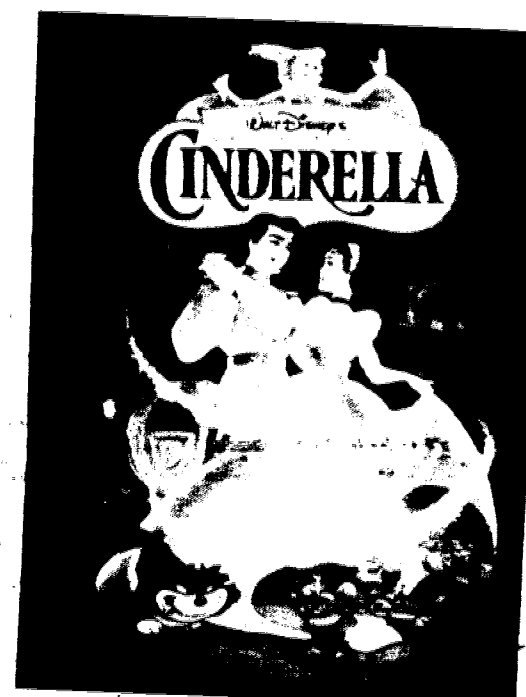

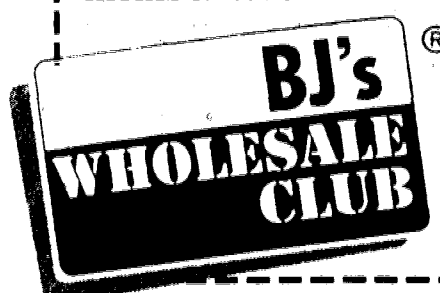

Tony winner 'Dreamgirls' begins run at Paper Mill

"Dreamgirls," the winner of six 1982 Tony Awards, including Best Book of a Musical, opened at the Paper Mill Playhouse yesterday for a run through Dec. 10.

Created by Tom Eyn (book and lyrics) and Henry Krieger (music), the musical chronicles the rise to superstardom of a famed singing group.

"Dreamgirls" closely resembles the career of Diana Ross and the Supremes. The fast-moving story, driven throughout by a rock-and-roll and rhythm-and-blues score, follows three girls from Chicago who, discovered by a manipulative promoter, climb from a back-up vocal group toward the top of the charts.

Effie, the lead singer, is replaced when it is decided that the group needs a sleeker look and sound, causing heartbreak and recrimination. All eventually realize that their chase after show business success has been destructive personally.

Mark S. Hoebee's direction of "Dreamgirls" at the Marriott's Lincolnshire Theater in Chicago recently won him a nomination for the Jefferson Award for best director. He now brings his conception to the Paper Mill.

It underlines the human element in the struggle between the personal and professional lives of the lead characters, and the artistic compromises made by black singers in the '60s to gain acceptance by white audiences. The hi-tech stage design worked out by the director and Paper Mill set designer Michael Anania utilizes a series of hydraulic lifts to separate the stage floor into different performing areas, and sliding panels move on and

off as if choreographed.

Heading the cast are LaTonya Holmes as Lorrell; Deidre Lang as Michelle; Angela Robinson as Deena and Sharon Wilkins as Effie. Alton F. White plays the manager. Other principals are Curtis Cook, Herb Downer, and Marshall Titus.

Kenny Ingram, nominated for a Jefferson Award for best choreography for the Chicago production, is choreographer. Costumes are by Gregg Barnes, lighting design by Tim Hunter and sound by David Patterson. Wendy Bobbit is the musical director.

Tom Eyn was one of the most prolific and successful playwrights of off-off Broadway from its early days through the 70's, and a writer for the satirical television series "Mary Hartman, Mary Hartman" and The Bette Midler NBC Special, for which he was nominated for an Emmy.

Henry Krieger has composed numerous off-Broadway and off-off Broadway productions, as well as films made for television. He shared with Eyn a "Dreamgirls" Tony Award nomination for best score and, with Eyn and record producer David Foster, a Grammy Award for best cast album.

Performances of "Dreamgirls" are Wednesdays through Sundays at 8 p.m., Thursday matinees are at 2 p.m., Saturday and Sunday matinees are at 3 p.m.

Cranford Rep will perform 'Diary' for war anniversary

The Cranford Repertory Theater will perform its fall play, "The Diary of Anne Frank," on Nov. 30, Dec. 2, 3, 7, 9, and 10 at Randolph Hall in Cranford.

The year 1995 marks the 52nd anniversary of the rescue of 95 percent of Denmark's Jewish community. Protected by their Christian countrymen — from the simplest fisherman to the king himself — 7,200 Danish Jews were hidden, housed, and smuggled to safety in Sweden.

Danish rescuer Preben Munch-Nielsen will be a guest speaker for this special program. When the Germans occupied Denmark in 1940, Preben joined the resistance as a courier. In October 1943, when the Gestapo began the roundup of Danish Jews, Preben and his group in the resistance began to help the Jews. They hid them in houses near the shore and brought them to waiting boats. Under cover of darkness, Preben and his friends took up to 12 Jews at a time across the straits to Sweden. The four-mile trip took about 50 minutes. Preben helped transport 1,400 Jews to Sweden. He fled to Sweden as well in November 1943 when the Germans seized the Danish government. Preben returned home in May 1945.

Other special guests will include Tove and Niels Bamberger who were Danish survivors boated to freedom by Preben and his group.

The town of Cranford will also be honoring two of its own residents: Orest and Helena Zahajkewycz.

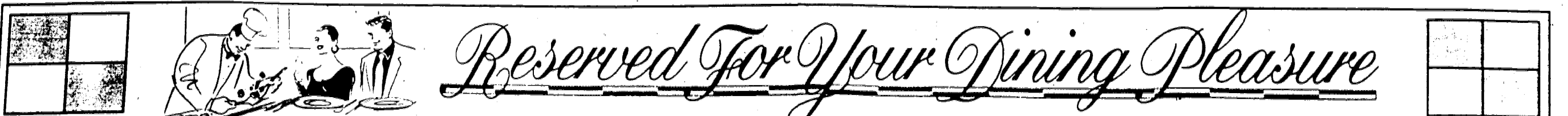



Rebel seeks answers at Parsley's 'Tar River'

Not all "rebellious runaways" are teenagers. Jett Parsley's new play, "Tar River Love Story" tells the story of a woman in her 60s who runs away from her 30-year marriage.

Dining Review October 26, 1995

Too often, these days, when people dine out, they are looking for a cheap meal served quickly so they can, I assume, return home to watch television.

That's what I was thinking while I sat down to eat at Costa Del Sol in Union. My caustic thoughts were about our downwardly spiraling culture because, for the evening, I knew I was no longer in America, and, as usual I was happy to be away.

Costa Del Sol is one of those places that has managed to transplant a little bit of European culture onto United States soil. The Spanish and Portuguese flavors of the menu and in the general ambiance make the restaurant the kind of place one has in mind when they yearn for a night out.

It should be mentioned, however, that Costa Del Sol was not always Costa Del Sol. The owners purchased what was The Old Cider Mill Grove in 1982. The outdoor facility remains open from May through October and is available for private outings or picnics for up to 3,000 guests.

On the other hand, for a more intimate evening, Costa Del Sol offers the ideal atmosphere for a romantic dinner. Imagine sipping sangria as night drops through a sky light overhead; the soft sounds of piano music mingle with the fragrances of seafood, meat and poultry dishes being prepared with the care of master chefs. At Costa Del Sol this is a scene you won't have to imagine.

You also will not have to conjure fantastic meals that you can only dream of making — Costa Del Sol's menu is loaded with tantalizing choices.

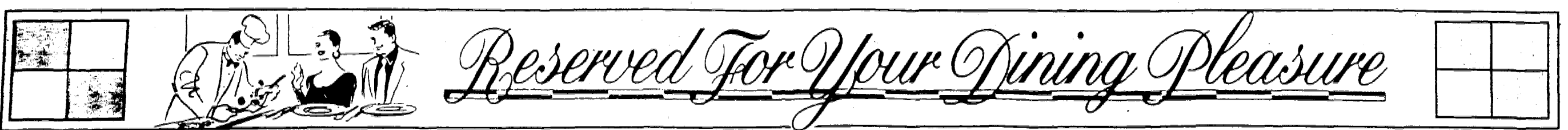
cardinal, sauteed large shrimps on a bed of mushrooms, covered with Hollandaise sauce. (my choice); palometa roja, boneless orange roughly baked in white wine, diced peppers, onion, herbs and light tomato sauce; tamboril a la espanola, monk fish fillets sauteed in butter, lemon and garlic sauce and garnished with capers; and salmon du chef, a fresh Norwegian salmon fillet sauteed in olive oil, minced shrimps, fumet de poisson and a touch of cream.

Of course, I have not forgotten the ever popular paella valenciana. It's like taking a bite out of the ocean — a superb mixture of shrimps, scallops, squid, mussels, clams and lobster with white meat chicken and spanish chorizo, sauteed with diced onions and pepper, then cooked with saffron rice in a paellera.

ers are also worth a sampling. I learned why the manager calls almejas bulhao pato his favorite; who can resist steamed clams with wine, garlic and fresh coriander? The calamares fritos are lightly breaded and served with a mild tomato sauce, not heavily fried and soaked with an obnoxious spicy dipping sauce, which is the norm when it comes to American restaurants and squid these days.

Yet, as I said, Costa Del Sol is not of these days; it's a place that remembers the sight, smell, sound and taste of another time and place and has captured those precious sensations for today's diners who are starved for a special eating experience, and that means all of us.

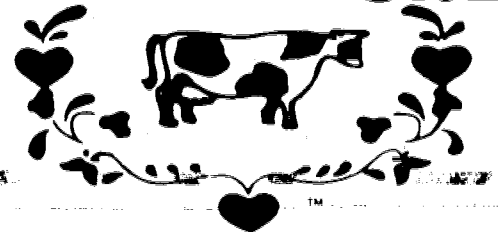

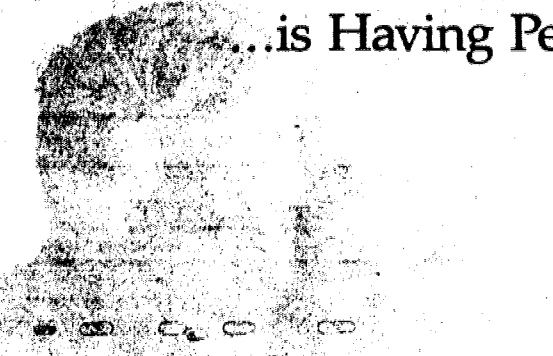

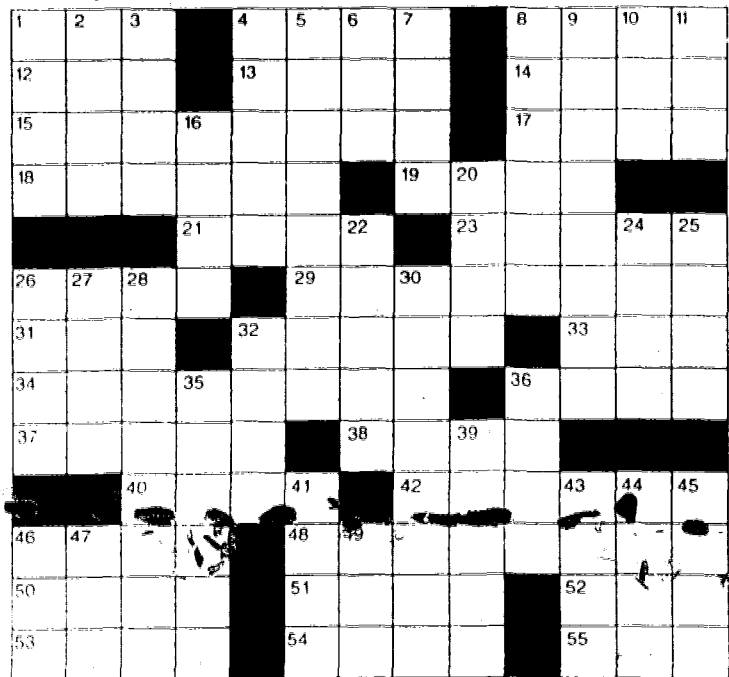

Grass clips offer natural fertilizer

Millions of Americans reduce, reuse and recycle... but grasscycle?

Grasscycling is a natural process of decay and renewal that recycles the nutrients present in grass blades. You can grasscycle by simply leaving short clippings on your lawn. Since grass is 85 percent water, short grass clippings decompose quickly, returning up to 20 percent of their nitrogen to the soil.

Proper mowing is the key to effective grasscycling. Specially-designed mulching mowers make grasscycling easy by chopping clippings into tiny pieces and blowing them into the turf.

Dead roots block movement of air, water and nutrients

If there's one culprit that ought to be stopped, it's thatch — scourge to homeowners everywhere, it's a build-up of dead roots that blocks the movement of air, water and nutrients to roots and harbors insects and disease.

To check your thatch, cut a small plug of turf out of the lawn and measure the thatch layer. The plug can then be returned to its place in the lawn. A 1/2-inch layer of thatch is beneficial — it acts as a shock absorber to relieve ground compaction and helps hold moisture in the soil. But too much thatch can act like a sheet of plastic, stopping the flow of air, water and nutrients from getting to roots.

If excess thatch stifles your lawn's growth, you can stop the problem by renting a core aerator or a dethatcher with vertical blades that will slice through the soil and remove excess thatch.

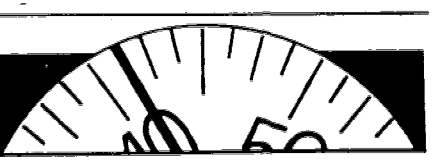

With aging, forgetfulness may hint at more problems

Forgetfulness is a common sign of aging, but when an elderly loved one begins to show more serious signs, such as drastic personality changes, forgetting that he or she has prepared a meal or who family members are, a family may begin questioning their loved one's health. An older adult who shows these symptoms may have Alzheimer's disease, according to Michele Elkins, director of Geriatric Services at St. Barnabas Health Care System.

Elkins supervises clinical services for elderly residents of St. Barnabas Nursing and Rehabilitation Centers, including Greenbrook Manor in Green Brook; Llanfair House in Wayne and Ashbrook in Scotch Plains.

"Since older adults are living longer, the number of cases of Alzheimer's disease in the next few years will increase significantly," Elkins said.

"Alzheimer's disease affects nearly 10 percent of those under 65, and 47 percent of those over 65."

Alzheimer's disease affects an estimated 4 million American adults, and by the year 2,030, the number of Americans with Alzheimer's disease is expected to grow to 14 million. More than 100,000 people die of Alzheimer's disease annually, making it the fourth leading cause of death in adults, after heart disease, cancer and stroke.

The cause of Alzheimer's disease is unknown. Researchers believe genetics play a role. Scientists are conducting diagnosis, treatment and transmission research. "Genetic transmission has been confirmed in the younger cases of Alzheimer's disease," Elkins said.

"Long-term care is sometimes a necessity for adults suffering from

this debilitating disease. It is important for caregivers to realize when they can no longer meet the needs of their loved one," she added, "especially when the individual's safety is at risk."

Approximately one-half of nursing home residents have Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder. "When Alzheimer's patients live at home, they sometimes require heavy sedation. In many cases, when they are getting 24-hour care in a nursing home, their medication can be reduced and their quality of life is enhanced," she also said.

If nursing home placement is not necessary or possible, adult daycare or part-time home care can provide respite for family caregivers. "This gives caregivers the time to do neces-

sary chores or simply have some relief from the incessant physical and emotional stress of caring for a person with Alzheimer's," said Cornell Hall Administrator Theresa Edelstein.

Elkins suggested asking the following questions when considering placing a loved one with Alzheimer's disease in a nursing home:

- Is there an area in the home, where care is specifically geared for patients with Alzheimer's disease or dementia? Some facilities have specific units. Others match residents with similar disabilities in certain areas.
- Are there activities designed to meet the specialized needs of the resident? Even long-term care facility should provide specific activities programs for residents of all levels of

physical and mental health.

• Is the facility equipped with safety devices for wandering residents? Many facilities either have locked units, or they provide residents with wander-guard wrist or ankle bracelets with sensors that trigger an alarm when the resident attempts to leave the facility. This allows the resident to move about freely within the facility.

• How does the facility resolve behavioral problems? Sedation should be the last alternative to resolving a behavioral problem. Treatment can range from specialized activities, to one-on-one visits from volunteers. The use of medication should be the last resort.

• Can the family have input in developing a care plan? Since the most effective treatment for a person with Alzheimer's disease is to deve-

lop a care plan that provides them with a familiar, regular schedule, the family's input is extremely helpful. Activities can be tailored to the resident's interests.

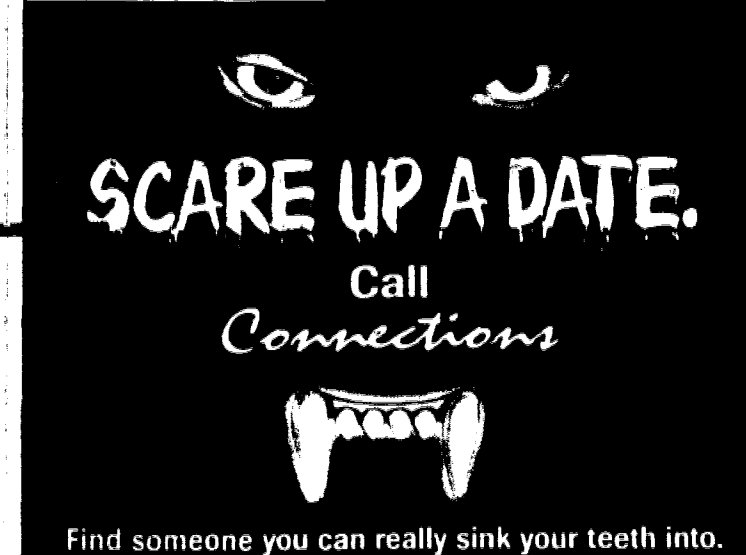



door lock has been activated. This can be overridden by pressing the driver's door lock button twice.

Security feedback provides the remote keyless entry used with a horn "chirp" or exterior lamp flash to signal that the lock command — or an exterior lamp flash for the unlock command — has been received. The user can also choose no feedback.

Perimeter lighting provides personal security by turning on headlamps, parking lamps and back-up lamps for 15 seconds when the remote keyless entry unlock button is pushed. With Twilight Sentinel lighting, this feature will activate only if it is dark outside. This feature can also be deactivated.

With available memory driver's seat and mirrors, when the driver uses the keyless fob to unlock the car, the driver's seat and outside rear-view mirrors are automatically adjusted to that driver's programmed preference.

For 1996, the remote keyless entry has an "instant alarm" feature, allowing the driver to activate the lights and horn in an emergency situation.

In addition to Personal Choice, Buick, offers standard "Convenience Plus" electrical features.

For example, there is a delayed entry and delayed exit lighting feature. The interior lights remain on for 25 seconds after a door is closed, making it easier to enter the car. The interior lights turn off when the key is inserted into the ignition. When exiting the car, the interior lights will

The interior lights also have "theater dimming." The lights fade down over about five seconds instead of switching off all at once.

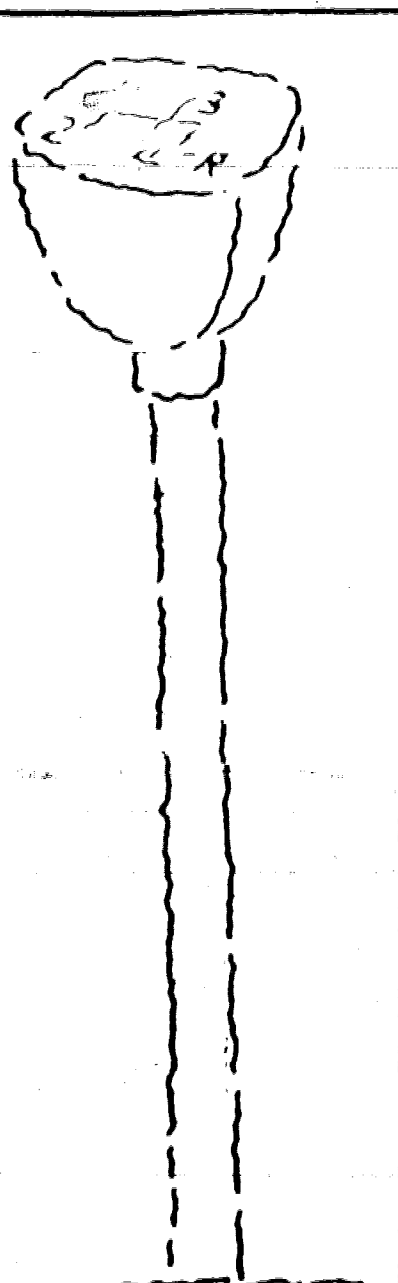
