



## Agreement weds county and China

Chairman of the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders, Daniel Sullivan, and the mayor of Wenzhou, China, signed a Sister City Agreement last week that will enhance the county's economic development opportunities abroad as well as add to educational, technological, and scientific exchanges in the near future.

Sullivan said that it has been four years since the county established relationships with Wenzhou. "In the second stage of our exchange program, major results may be achieved in economic trade, science, technology, culture, education, and sports," he said. Sullivan said he considered Ma Shende a driving force behind this cooperative effort.

Freelancer Joe Churchill, Nickel City Sports, Union County, said, "We have had a lot of economic development. Both are located in industrial seaports and international airports, and we are in the process of expanding our economic bases," he said.

"One major difference between Union County and Wenzhou is their population. We have just a million residents while their city boasts a population of close to seven million," Churchill said, adding that both are interested in trading in the global marketplace.

During the three-day visit, Wenzhou delegates viewed the Elizabeth Neighorhood, a jughead-owned and operated by Teekay Refinery. They stopped at Kent University to pursue greater understanding of our education system and toured the Union County Utilities, located at the

Resource Recovery Foundation, owned by Old Mill Martin No. 1 Railway. The Wenzhou delegation included the city's mayor, Deputy Secretary General, Consul General, Counsel for Intergovernmental Affairs, Director of Overseas Chinese Affairs, and Vice-Chairman of the Wenzhou Overseas Investment Corporation.

Wenzhou Mayor Qian Zengzhong said that signing the sister city agreement emphasizes Union County's full potential, which will be achieved, "We hope that both economies will be broader and enjoy greater results," the mayor said.

Sullivan said that "the team emphasizes the importance of our place on economic development and the County's strong tie to foreign markets."

This mission stands along with

Resource Recovery Foundation and the Saudi Arabian Development Fund in May as examples of foreign countries that recognize the economic and geographical amity.







## Toyota Solara gets ready for 1999

Toyota Motor Sales, USA Inc., unveiled the all-new 1999 Solara coupe concept at its world premiere press conference at the North American International Auto Show in Detroit.

The new Solara coupe is based on the Camry front-drive platform and will share the Camry's elements and transmission. It will be built exclusively at the company's recently expanded plant in Cambridge, Ontario, Canada, and will arrive in dealer showrooms in the United States first in July, and in August.

Solara was developed to target new opportunity in the sport-specific market, an emerging market reflecting long-term growth potential. David Litzwitz, Toyota Division Vice President and general manager, U.S. market development, said "The name Solara means light, which will be emphasized in its styling. The car will bring value to the sporty consumer without losing the safety and reliability of the Camry," he said.

Tech will be more important than styling. The Solara will be equipped with three 2.4L engines, four-cylinder and V-6 engines, and a five-speed manual transmission. The V-6 will make the product appealing and less expensive and more efficient.
