I stayed loyal through the changes to United Counties, to Core States and then to the North Carolina-based First Union. The lines got longer, there was less hours of service, and even the temporary loss of a large deposit didn't motivate me to leave. Waiting on the Saturday morning lines, I listened to the diversity of world experiences of the other people patiently waiting to give back their money.

Lydia Allen of Cranford told me to be happy because things are worse at the Cranford branch, where her questions were dismissed as those of a non-customer. The nostalgia for the friendly local banker and pre-ATM era is a world not coming back.

Last year, saw a \$161-billion merger between Core States and First Union. With Union assets of \$327 billion, First Union is big time. Two weeks ago, the big time bank cut 6,000 jobs, some 725 in New Jersey, including 50 in Summit.

While waiting on the Saturday line, I used to think about the Democratic control of the Assembly. The First Union number one primary, Assemblyman Neil Cohen of Roseland might chair the Assembly Financial Institutions Committee, which oversees banking legislation. Cohen refers to First Union as "consumer public enemy number one" because of their excessive service fees and use of fingerprinting of non-customers looking to cash checks.

The Associated Press reported that the most recent restructuring will produce by First Union "pre-tax cost savings of \$400 million" for their shareholders. Well, this customer has found another financial institution, where my banking is reevaluated, and my loyalty is more than a hot iron investment.

Democrats replace Goncalves on party line incumbents, Elizabeth Board of Ed member get nod

Union County Democrats replaced incumbent freetholder Don Goncalves on the party line in favor of Elizabeth Board of Education member Angel Estrada. Estrada will run with incumbent Nick Scutari and Linda Stender in the long primary.

Municipal chairman from throughout the county met Monday night at Gallop Hill Inn in Union to unanimously award the party line for the freetholder race in addition to selecting candidates for Assembly elections.

Goncalves called his replacement on the line a move by Elizabeth Mayor J. Christian Bollwage to prove "the still has the political capital to ditch a sitting freetholder. There was no legitimate reason for this, because I'm supporting Angel Estrada, so we put forth a strong candidate."

more representative than we've had in the past," said Elizabeth Democratic Chairman Bill Malone.

The decision had little to do with Goncalves' record "than the potential for the next three years," said Malone. In Elizabeth public 5th Ward Councilman Tony Alonzo and Don Goncalves worked closely and "that's where issues lie."

Goncalves said because his friends on the Elizabeth City Council — Member and 6th Ward Councilman Angelo Paternoster — have "batted heads" with Bollwage, the mayor wanted to show "the still can affect county government."

He said he is suffering the "political repercussions" of "not making deals" to keep his freetholder seat.

According to one Democratic source, the shift between Bollwage and Goncalves was the reason behind the change.

This is a decision that came from

the Democratic chairman," Bollwage said. "I know nothing about dropping Don Goncalves from the party line."

"I say he didn't know," said Goncalves, "in consulting to everyone's intelligence."

"Our choice is not meant to denigrate Goncalves," said Union County Democratic Chairwoman Charlotte DeFilippo. "Municipal chairman and others thought Estrada was a more viable candidate."

"Members like to protest too much," said DeFilippo of Goncalves. "If there was an agenda that came into play, it's in Don's mind."

"Elizabeth is a very large city with many talented people. It's a very sensitive thing when you have nine people on the board to decide that they are not 'lulled' into complacency."

Letters received from members of the Portuguese community were in support of only Goncalves, not Stender and Scutari, said Malone.

Citizens were a presence Monday night with signs of support for Goncalves, which made Malone and DeFilippo question whether the freetholder had his own agenda. "We look for team players," said Malone.

He said candidates who are not chosen are asked to support the team selected and usually are more than willing, but not in this case.

The committee screened the three candidates selected, according to Malone, while Goncalves said he did not receive the nod to endorse that year.

Estrada, who plans to finish his second three-year term in the Elizabeth Board of Education which ends in 2000, said Malone asked him on Saturday to appear before the county committee Monday night. He said he's been interested in becoming active in county government for the past five or six years.

"I'm an independent thinker but a strong Democrat. I don't believe those are mutually exclusive," said Goncalves.

"It is about being a good party person," said Goncalves. "For good government? This is a question we all have to pose when we see the take place."

"This is politics at its worst," a Roseland resident of Elizabeth, Gunshier said he will sit down with his family and supporters before making any decision about what he will do politically.

On the Republican side, former Summit Councilman Al Dill Jr., former Richard mayor Wally Shackelford and Richard Revilla of Elizabeth were selected in the freetholder primary.

Scutari is chairman of the freetholder board while Stender served in that position in 1997. She also is chairman of the Fanwood Democratic Committee. Scutari seeks re-election in his second term while Stender aims for her third.

A lifelong resident of Fanwood and South Plains, Stender served on the Fanwood Borough Council from 1987 to 1990 and in 1991 was elected a four-year-term as mayor.

Vice chairman of the freetholder Board last year, Scutari served one

Access 2000 grants are available to educators

The second phase of the Union County Access 2000 Teacher/School Technology Grants program is underway. All public school teachers in Union County are invited to apply for grants for classroom/library/computer hardware, software, peripherals, or for teacher technology training scholarships for workshops, conferences and seminars.

Teachers may apply for individual grants of up to \$500, or cooperative grants of up to \$1,000; schools may request up to \$2,500 for larger collaborative schoolwide projects, all focusing on integrating technology into the classroom.

"As we enter the 21st century, knowledge of computers and technology is absolutely vital for young people entering the job market," said Freetholder Chairman Nick Scutari. "This is an exciting part of the Access 2000 program because it will give teachers, or groups of teachers working together, the opportunity to pursue new ideas and projects for their classrooms."

The freetholder board developed the Access 2000 program last year to ensure that every pupil in Union County has access to state-of-the-art computers and software, high-speed Internet connections and teachers trained in computer and technology by the end of the year 2000.

These grants will be directly into our classrooms to seek out both individual teacher creativity, initiative and commitment to additional training as well as professional collaboration in the area of technology," said County Manager Michael Lipolis.

Initial phase of the program, \$150,000 in competitive grants will be provided to teachers in the county's 23 school districts. Highest consideration will be given to proposals that demonstrate need in the area of technology, can be matched through funding from the school district, PTO, education fund and can be shared or replicated; incorporate innovative ideas/approaches; and advance hands-on student use of advanced tools. Proposals must be implemented in the 1999-2000 school year.

"We are excited about the potential to expand the grant program by partnering with school districts, parents and community groups, corporations and businesses interested in providing matching dollars to increase technology opportunities for our students and teachers," said Susan Pepper, director of the Access 2000 program.

Access 2000 is a three-year, \$3-million partnership between the Union County Board of Chosen Freetholders and the county's 23 school districts. The program is providing school districts with funding to purchase new computers and state-of-the-art software and fund teacher training in computer and technology.

So far, more than \$2.2 million has been granted to school districts. Another \$350,000 has been allocated to develop a county-wide Internet network consortium to provide high-speed Internet access to schools at lower costs to schools.

"This is a direct investment in the 76,800 pupils attending school in Union County," said Scutari. "We expect to pay off with better economic and educational opportunities available to them when they graduate. We also want to educate businesses that Union County can offer them a highly-trained, well-educated workforce."

Application forms are available in each school building and from Technology coordinators in each of the districts. Documentary explores question of Love's innocence or guilt

The Video Detective

Uta Courtney Love has anything to do with the death of Kurt Cobain? Was Kurt Cobain's death a suicide as reported in the media or was it murder? These are the questions that are explored in depth by documentarian Nick Broomfield in the film "Kurt and Courtney." Cobain, for those who don't know, was the lead singer of grunge rock band "Nirvana," the Seattle based group that skyrocketed to fame in the early 90s. The band's magical rise ended tragically when Cobain was found dead from an alleged self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head.

Cobain was found dead on April 4, 1994. His wife, Courtney Love, was away at the time and Cobain's body was discovered by his friend, Tim Corey, and a private detective who had been hired a week earlier by Love to watch Cobain while she was away. The first suggestion of a conspiracy theory was born as soon as the police arrived at the scene. There were no fingerprints on the shotgun that fired the bullet. The private detective goes on to reveal in Broomfield's film as why he is completely convinced that Cobain was murdered. One reason he gives beyond the missing fingerprints is that Cobain had an incredible knowledge of heroin in his body at the time of his death. Such high tolerance for the drug, that it would be "nearly impossible for him to get so much into his system, but it is his mouth and not the trigger."

The detective, over the last four years, has spent his life saying prayers, crying, and even setting up a Web site dedicated to all the evidence and information he has found. Broomfield himself never takes a stand on either side of the murder/accident argument but tries to let the individuals he interviews speak for themselves.

Another bizarre figure is El Duce, the enigmatic looking lead singer of a "hard rock" band who claims Love offered him \$50,000 for "which" Cobain "has an extremely strained relationship with Love, and does nothing to dispel the idea that she killed Cobain."

Kean professor authors book on treatment of the disabled

Kean University Professor Arthur Shapiro has authored a book on changing attitudes toward disabled persons in school settings.

In his book, "Everybody Belongs: Changing Negative Attitudes Toward Classmates with Disabilities," Shapiro, an associate professor of special education, emphasizes the importance of fostering positive attitudes toward disabled students in the classroom.

The 551-page book provides practical advice about how schools can promote such positive attitudes and dispel myths and prejudices.

Shapiro has been a special educator in the local, county and state levels for over 35 years and has taught at Kean since 1986. Frequently published articles have appeared in "The United Review," Special Education in Schools, Principal and The New York Times. His work on disability awareness led to his appointment as a consultant to the National Project on Public Awareness of Persons with Disabilities of the American Association of University Affiliated Pro-

grams. He has conducted numerous disability awareness workshops throughout the United States. In addition, Shapiro has appeared on more than 20 television shows in the tri-state area and has been interviewed by more than 30 newspapers and other media, including United Press International.

Shapiro received a Media Arts Award for his television show on disability issues, "Equal Access," which appeared on the CTN Network throughout New Jersey. The show will again be offered on CTN in the near future.

Shapiro is a member of The Society for Disability Studies, The Association on Higher Education and Disability and The Council for Exceptional Children. He earned his B.A. at Rider University, his M.A. at the College of New Jersey and an Ed.D. at Rutgers University.

Elizabeth 'buckles down' on traffic safety measures

Mayor Chris Bollwage announced that the City of Elizabeth has received a federal grant to increase city-wide use of seatbelts through stricter enforcement of state laws. The grant also provides funding to improve driver education, all as part of the Mayor's "Walk-Smart, Drive-Smart, Elizabeth" Pedestrian Safety Program.

"Our primary concern is for the safety of our city's children," stated Mayor Bollwage. "As part of my New Hope for our Children program, we have developed and implemented several new safety initiatives such as Walk-Smart, Drive-Smart."

The grant, known as Operation Buckle Down, provides funding for seatbelt literature and overtime enforcement of the state's seatbelt law. Elizabeth's city-wide ramp of seatbelt use averages approximately 40 percent, according to Lt. Edward Baginski of the Elizabeth Police Department's Traffic Division. The city is concerned about this issue because, although the use of seatbelts and child safety seats significantly reduce the number of deaths and the severity of
