



# New software to aid in managing elections

County Clerk Joanne Rajoppi will introduce a new elections management software program with advanced features to speed tabulation results and assist ballot layout. The new program, called WinEDS, is expected to greatly enhance the election process, according to Rajoppi. The program will be operational for the two special school elections on Tuesday in Clark and Springfield.

"I'm delighted to introduce this program this year," Rajoppi said. "The benefit to our voters is tremendous and the efficiency of the program will pay for itself in savings of overtime alone." Rajoppi purchased the \$125,000 software package last year after reviewing several options. It was decided to implement the program after the presidential election.

According to the clerk, WinEDS, designed by Sequoia Pacific Voting Equipment, the same company which manufactures the voting machines, is a Windows-based product which maintains an extensive, permanent database that does not require repetitive input from election to election. Instead, it assists in the ballot format and contest data for any scheduled election. This feature alone, Rajoppi said, minimizes the opportunities for errors in all election preparation steps.

The software also uses the candidate history and allows candidates to move forward from election to election, for example, from the primary to the general, without additional data.

"The program also enhances tabulation functions," Rajoppi said. "While we presently use multiple satellite tally locations to facilitate and speed the tally function, this process is completely external to the software and requires a degree of engineering for each election cycle."

The clerk maintains four satellite tabulation locations through the cooperation and assistance of the municipal clerks in Clark, Fanwood, Summit and Union. She provides each clerk with equipment including cartridge readers and computer hardware.

Union County Information Services also assists with personnel resources.

"With the new program, an established network links the remote tally satellite locations directly to a central server for all tally functions," she said. "This is a tremendous advantage. In the upcoming Clark school election, this means as Clark Municipal Clerk Kathleen Leonard reads the voting cartridges at town hall, the data is immediately available at our central location in the courthouse and can be viewed by staff, candidates and the media. Additionally, it will have an output format which will allow us the immediate placement of the results on the Internet."

The County Clerk's Office is conducting training sessions this week with municipal clerks, the Union County Board of Elections and its warehouse staff to familiarize them with the various functions of the program. "By introducing the program now we will be prepared to place it in general use for the primary," the clerk said.

I asked one vice chairwoman of a local Republican organization and a Democratic chairman in a neighboring town the impact of the conviction by headline. They confirmed what I already knew. The immediate victim is the local political parties, who find it harder and harder to get good people to run for office. The common response is who needs the grief.

What seems to be developing is a desire of the local press to jump into the business dealings of officials both public and private. That's fine, and maybe even the job of the Fourth Estate.

Here's a tip as well. Check into one editor who has a large number of lawsuits charging him with racial and age discrimination. Here's another tip, check into the buyout deal an older reporter got at one daily newspaper, which requires a written pledge not to sue the paper for discrimination.

Periodically, we have the wave of stories on the supposed improper activities of officials. What we don't have is Sherlock Holmes or even Basil Rathbone for that matter to tell us if behind the cold east wind there exists anything more than hot air.

## Paper Mill delivers a 'Wilde' time with 'Ideal Husband'

In Act II of Oscar Wilde's "An Ideal Husband," Lady Chiltern offers guests in her home that most British of traditions, a cup of tea. Mrs. Cheveley accepts, Lady Markby declines.

Admittedly, a play more than 100 years old might not be everyone's cup of tea. But for those with a taste, the brew at the Paper Mill Playhouse in Millburn is potent and pleasing, with more than a little zing.

Friday's opening night of Wilde's delicious comedy of manners was delightful and, surprisingly, thought-provoking. Mrs. Cheveley has the goods on Sir Robert Chiltern, a member of Parliament whose past, like those of many politicians past and present, holds a secret. Mrs. Cheveley's proposition is simple: promote her interests in the House and his secret is safe. However, it's not just a fall from public grace that concerns Chiltern — on the personal front, his wife sees him as the ideal husband, a position he both cherishes and resents.

Television star Stephanie Beacham oozes sex and scandal with every move on the Millburn stage. Her handling of Wilde's dialogue is seasoned with a wit and wisdom which make the epigrams ring true, and give this character with very few redeeming qualities a resonance that makes you desire her company even as you revile her actions. Beacham is great at being bad, and this role admirably showcases her talents.

On the other end of the virtue scale is Fiona Hutchison's Lady Chiltern, whose high ideals serve to undermine her ambitious husband. Hutchison invests a palpable moral backbone in Lady Chiltern, rising above the traps usually found in "good girl" roles. In this actress' hands, the character is not weak and subservient, but a strong, vibrant woman whose strength is not

revealed in obvious ways. This is never an easy task in acting, and Hutchison rises to the occasion with grace and beauty, resulting in a truly effective, intriguing and enjoyable performance.

David Ledingham seemed somewhat stiff as Sir Robert Chiltern, the titular husband. While the character's desparation is understandable, his panic and sputtering seemed more those of an ill-at-ease actor than a theatrical character. *Oftentimes*, his believability lapses as a result.

However, it was Daniel McDonald who stole the show as the delightful playboy, Lord Goring, the Chilterns' best friend and Mrs. Cheveley's old flame. McDonald was deliciously wicked as Goring, who makes it perfectly clear how little he takes society — and himself, for that matter — seriously. He moved through Goring's schemes and postures with a polish and panache that gave a clear glimpse into the heart of this seemingly shallow man. With marriage being a major plot point of the play, it's the marriage of this actor and character that drives McDonald's scenes. The completeness of this performance makes for some very memorable theater.

Paper Mill favorite George S. Irving is at his irascible best as Goring's perpetually disapproving father, the Earl of Caversham. Obviously meant for comic relief in what is already a comedy, Caversham stops the proceedings, owing to Irving's remarkable energy and presence. His con-

stant put-downs to his son become funnier with each passing scene, providing some of the best laughs in a laugh-filled show.

Supporting roles are ably filled by the effervescent, irresistible and riotous Stephanie Cozart as the lovesick Mabel Chiltern; Kathleen Huber, who is absolutely hysterical as Lady Markby; Bill Bowers and Denis Holmes as Mason and Phipps, the quintessence of English butlers; and Rob Breckenridge, Libby Christophersen and Laura Leopard, whose single scene as Vicomte de Nanjac, Lady Basilidon and Mrs. Marchmont gets this play off

to its start with style, wit and insight into the realities and illusions of the society of the era, never sacrificing well-crafted laughs for tedious plot exposition.

Director James Warwick has done a beautiful job preparing this Victorian dish for 21st-century crowds. His subtle and able touch keeps the somewhat archaic language completely comprehensible, while the timeless issues of political scandal and fear of public disgrace carry the plot to an audience all too familiar with the concepts. The dialogue flows trippingly, and the scenes move us through the

story with equal polish. The pacing does seem to slow down by the final scene, but this is inherent in the script, not the approach.

Furthermore, Warwick has perfectly captured the tone and style of the piece, so important in handling Wilde, a touch apparent in each element of

the production. It is important to remember that, when first presented, this was a contemporary play which poked fun at the society of the day. That the political/social satire should still be so effective and ring so true, without seeming like a nostalgic "mellerdrammer," is nothing short of genius.

The set design by Michael Anania is breathtaking, particularly the Chilterns' morning room, with its glass-walled and plant-filled conservatory fully visible upstage. That this wonder of a set actually "morphs" into three different locations is, in itself, impressive; that each location so perfectly and completely serves the script is art.

David Murin's costume design is a wonder to behold, from the lavish ball gowns, to the ornate hats, to the gentlemen's coats and cloaks. And, as befits good theater, each piece of clothing subtly tells us something important about the person in the attire. Visually, this production is astounding.

On the heels of the very modern "Art," "An Ideal Husband" may seem to many to be a little stodgy, but do not be deceived. This play's message and theme are timeless, and the handling given it by the Paper Mill production is superb, delivering a delightfully witty and wicked good time.

## Series at UCC attempts to 'overcome hatred'

During the last week in February, Union County College will be host to "Overcoming Hatred/Creating Community," a series of events open to the community dedicated to creating a more civil society through an understanding of the roots of hatred.

The week of events will also serve as a bridge between the end of the College's observation of Black History Month and the beginning of Women's History Month.

All events are free and will be at Union County College's Cranford campus, 1033 Springfield Ave. Unless otherwise specified, each event will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the Roy W. Smith Theater.

The week's events were made possible by a grant from the New Jersey Council for the Humanities, a state program of the National Endowment for the Humanities. Additional support was provided by The Chase Manhattan Bank, The Karma Foundation, The Haremza Foundation, Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders and the Division of Cultural and Heritage Affairs, and CEPAC and the Union County College Student Government Association.

Throughout the entire week, from Monday through March 1, an Art and Photography Exhibit will be on display in the Tomasulo Art Gallery, in the Kenneth MacKay Library. The works in the exhibit are on loan from the New Jersey State Museum in Trenton and the Haremza Foundation Collection. The various pieces will depict the Holocaust and other examples of persecution, and will include works by Charles White, Jacob Landau, Ben Shahn, Alex Nozick, and Edward Kufko. Gallery Hours are Monday through Thursday, 1 to 4 p.m.; Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings from 4 to 6 p.m.

On Monday, UCC Professor Emeritus Oscar Fistein will read from his book, "I'll Sell You a Million Jews" at 6 p.m. in the Tomasulo Art Gallery. Following this event, The Theater Project at Union County College will present dramatic readings in a presentation titled "It Can't Happen Here — The Rise of Nazi-ism in the 20th Century" in the Roy Smith Theater beginning at 7:30 p.m.

On Tuesday, Virginia Apelian, member of the Union County College Board of Governors, Union County College Foundation Trustee and president of the Union County College Alumni Association, and who is an expert on the Arme-

nia Massacre, will present "Who Remembers the Armenians?" Her program will also feature a multi-media presentation on that atrocity, including the film "Where Are My People?" Following Apelian's presentation, the cultural dance group Shushi Armenian Dance Ensemble of St. Vartan Cathedral in New York, led by Artistic Director and choreographer Seta Kantardjian, will perform traditional dances.

On Wednesday, with performances at 3:30 and 7:30 p.m., The George Street Playhouse will present the socio-drama, "And Then They Came for Me," a play about two surviving friends of Anne Frank. Live actors will reenact their experiences as teenagers in hiding and in concentration camps during World War II, while Anne Frank's friends, Eva Schloss and Ed Silberberg, "participate" on video.

On March 1, a Panel Discussion will be held with panelists representing different races and ethnic groups who have had experience with atrocities and other forms of discrimination. The following panelists will discuss their experiences: Qaaim Saalik, a specialist in African-American culture and history; Fredrika Bey of Newark, representing the Muslim community; Chief Crazy Horse, the Leni-Lenape Indian Tribe, Mahwah, and Eric Freedman, president; and Rabbi Arthur Vernon of Ahavas-Shalom, the last synagogue in Newark.

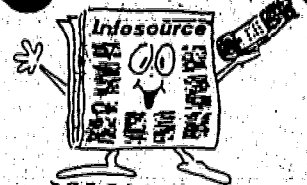

## Simple guidelines help avoid wedding tension

According to *Elegant Bride* magazine's editor-in-chief Linda Stansbury, there are some important ground rules for avoiding potential conflicts between brides and bridesmaids.

## Attention deficit disorder can be aided with alternative medicine

Alternative medicine has influenced mainstream healthcare and continues to do so in many ways. It has influenced the use of dietary considerations in cancer treatment, the treatment of ear infections in children, as well as zinc and echinacea in cold remedies, and more. It is no wonder that doctors have seen its usefulness in treating symptoms associated with attention deficit disorder with or without hyperactivity.

Treating attention deficit disorder is a challenge for the family, teacher or teachers, and other professionals that get involved. Jeffrey Kavalin D.C. has chosen to become one of those "other professionals."

"I am a chiropractor by training that has earned a diplomate in addictive and compulsive disorders," Kavalin said. "I have worked with the 'alternative population' in schools and have seen the devastation these children endure while trying to get an education."

Kavalin adds that although the alternative programs appear to be a catch-all

for a host of children that don't fit in, including attention deficit, drug and alcohol abuse/addiction, and defiant behavior, his focus is on A.D.D. with or without hyperactivity population, adult and child.

"We are more aware of this disorder than ever before in our history and therefore more prone to diagnose children suffering from the symptoms," he continues. "However, adults have gotten through the system and continue to suffer without being diagnosed. Their symptoms might include being disorganized, unable to complete tasks begun in earnest, easily distracted, food cravings and the need to self-medicate."

"My approach is based in current research in the field of brain chemistry. It is a non-drug-based intervention. It is based on the serotonin-dopamine system in the brain. The focus is to help the body stabilize this system by the use of non-invasive techniques. There may be the need to use supplements in order to aid this process. The use of non-invasive/non-needle acupuncture is accomplished

by electrical stimulation. Lastly, specific low-force chiropractic adjustments are used to positively influence the nervous system."

This three-fold approach, Kavalin adds, along with a supportive home environment is key to making a difference in dealing with A.D.D. Commonly, positive changes are seen between the sixth and eighth week. The care plan continues until the 12th to 16th week for maximum impact. Follow-up is scheduled on an "as needed" basis. The protocol may be used with current drug interventions, such as Ritalin and Adderall, without conflict. The goal in this area would be to reduce the amount of and the need for the drug therapy.

"Overall, there is no 'magic bullet' in dealing with attention deficit disorder," Kavalin concludes, "but there is an approach that makes sense and gives back control to the individual."

## Trinitas Hospital's 'breast health' program reaches out to Hispanic women

Few issues in women's health are as important as the early detection of breast cancer.

When detected early, the likelihood of a cure is high. Unfortunately, when breast cancer advances beyond the earliest phase, the fatality rate among women increases dramatically.

An important part of the mission of Trinitas Hospital in Elizabeth is to reach out and serve the health needs of the community. There is a concern that in the Hispanic community, many women do not have access to early diagnosis and treatment of breast cancer due to factors such as lack of health insurance, language barriers, and a cultural tradition that may cause some Hispanic women to forego preventative health care for themselves because they focus on the welfare of their families.

The Hispanic community represents a large segment of the population in the Union County area. In the 1990 census, Hispanics comprised 39 percent of Elizabeth's population. The figure is expected to be considerably higher in the 2000 census — 58 per-

cent of Elizabeth students in the 2000-01 school year are Hispanics. Consequently, it is a problem that must be addressed.

Prompted by this concern, Trinitas Hospital instituted the "Breast Health and You" program in 1999. Adapted from a program that was developed by the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation, the objective is to provide an aggressive outreach campaign to increase the awareness of Hispanic women about the importance of the early detection of breast cancer. The program is designed to use community peer educators, called "comadres," who have undergone thorough training to provide breast health education workshops to Hispanic women. Their goal is to increase the likelihood that more women will choose preventative care to save lives and reduce health care costs.

The comadres are Hispanic women who reside in the community. Their knowledge of the traditions and culture of the Hispanic community strengthens the bonds of trust with workshop participants, which makes

it easier to discuss and share information that is essential to the success of the program. It also paves the way for the comadres to recommend strategies to overcome certain barriers that prevent many women from practicing preventative health. For instance, a common complaint is that women just don't have enough time to go for screenings. The comadres are trained to encourage women to overcome any obstacles that interfere with getting regular screenings.

Prior to the breast education workshops, the outreach coordinator and the comadres conduct an outreach campaign to generate interest among women in the Hispanic community. The workshops are targeted to small groups of women and specifically focus on teaching women how to perform breast self-examinations and to supply information about where to obtain mammograms and clinical breast exams. During the workshop, the comadre identifies and discusses the risk factors of breast cancer and the importance of early diagnosis. The comadre explains the procedures of a

mammogram and illustrates the technique of breast self-examination on a breast model, using the "Triple Touch" method developed by the American Cancer Society. She also presents two videos to reinforce the workshop information. The first video illustrates the importance of early detection of breast cancer, while the second video reviews the technique of breast self-examination. The workshop concludes with a question-and-answer period. The comadre also distributes a list of community agencies that provide mammograms and clinical breast examinations either free or at a reduced rate. Each workshop participant receives "take home" brochures to reinforce what they have learned and to pass on to family members, friends and co-workers.

Trinitas Hospital is committed to improving the health of the citizens in the communities that it serves. The "Breast Health and You" program is one of the strategies to accomplish this goal. The community interest in the program has led Trinitas to begin planning the expansion of the prog-

ram to other minority groups.
