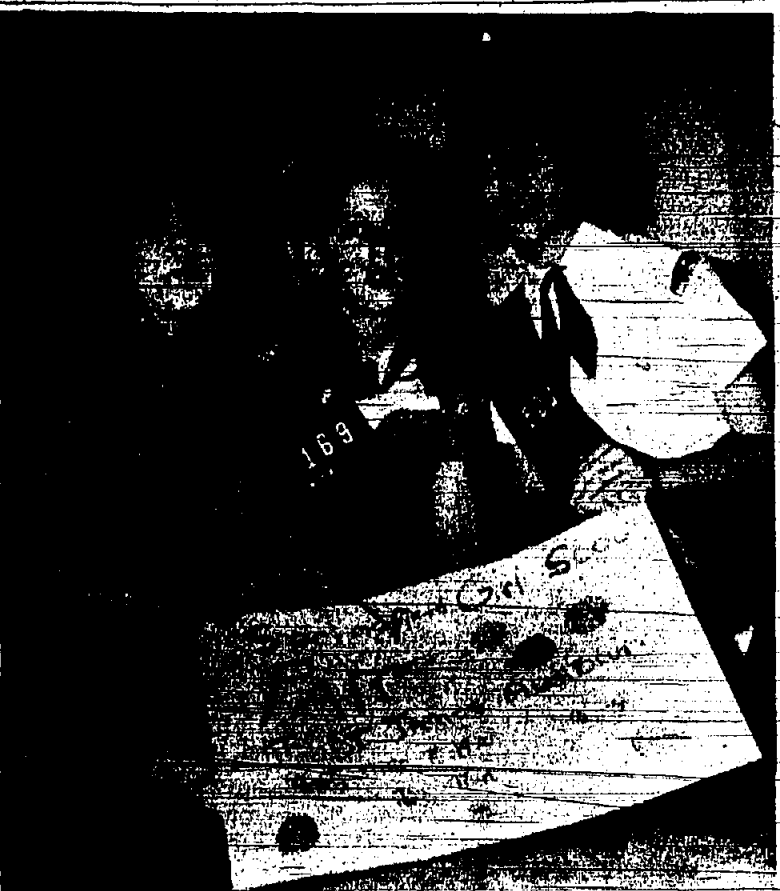

### Girl Scout fair to mark anniversary celebration

Throughout the country the Girl Scouts of America are preparing to celebrate their 58th birthday, proclaiming the week starting Sunday as Girl Scout Week.

The Springfield Community Girl Scouts are celebrating Girl-Scout week by having a fair, to which an invitation has been extended to the community of Springfield. It will be held on Saturday, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at St. James Church.

Mrs. Lee L. Andrews, Jr., chairman of the fair, said, "It is the Springfield Girl Scouts' way of demonstrating to the community what an aware and active group they are."

All Brownie, Junior, Cadette and Senior troops are participating. Some troops will display and demonstrate the arts and crafts they worked on throughout the year. Some troops will entertain with Girl-Scout songs and dances and some troops will display work they have done in homemaking, citizenship, health and safety. Others will exhibit camping equipment and camping skills.

There will also be an art show with all troops participating. Mrs. Dexter Forco, chairman of the art show stated that there will be crayon sketches, water colors, graphic arts, pastels, all paintings, mosaic, wire, clay and wood sculptures and papier-mache exhibits.

Any girl from the age of 7 to 17 interested in joining Girl Scouts will be able to register that day with Mrs. Lee Johnson, Girl Scout Paper.

A local scout spokesman stated: "Girl Scouting was founded in the United States on March 12, 1912, by Juliette Gordon Low. A better world for girls was what she had in mind when she brought the idea of an American Girl Scout movement to her native Savannah, Ga. from England."

"She dreamed of girls learning to be active, vital citizens of their country — which they are today. Their attitude is expressed simply in the theme they've adopted for the next three years — 'Awareness — Action'."

"The girls' activity is producing 'Picnic,' and there are still openings for all those who are interested in any and all phases of production and set decoration. ### 3 Dayton seniors are Merit finalists

Edward C. Smith, president of the NMCS, in announcing the selection of the three Dayton seniors pointed out that they "share the honor with about one-half of one-percent of the graduating secondary school seniors in the nation."

As three of about 15,000 finalists, they will remain in the Merit Scholarship competition. The selection process is now under way and the approximately 2,800 winners of Merit Scholarships will be notified confidentially in late March. The winners' names will be announced publicly by April 30.

### PTAs join for meeting on Monday

#### Trenton plans expected to have wide local effect

The Springfield PTA Council this week announced final plans for the meeting "What's the Future of Our Local Schools" to be held Monday at 8 p.m. in the girls' gymnasium of the Florence Gaudineer School.

Dr. Victor J. Podesta, New Jersey's assistant commissioner of education, will speak on "Consolidation and Regionalization in the Schools."

His talk is expected to deal with several current proposals for consolidation of the state's smaller school districts, including the so-called Mancuso Report prepared for the State Department of Education.

The report urged that all districts with less than 2,500 students in grades kindergarten through 12 be merged to create larger school systems. Springfield has some 2,000 in grades K-8, plus another 1,000 in high school.

It also called for expansion of all regional high school districts downward by absorbing the elementary school sending districts. Springfield is a member of such a regional high school district.

The Springfield Board of Education last month officially voted its opposition to the proposals as a threat to local autonomy in education.

John O. Berwick, Springfield superintendent of schools, will introduce Dr. Podesta. Mrs. Leonard Harris, president of the Jonathan Dayton Regional High School PTA, will be moderator for questions from the audience. Mrs. John Knowles is president of the PTA Council.

DR. PODESTA is an alumnus of Jersey City State College and holds the degrees of master of education and doctor of education from Rutgers University. He continued his advanced studies at Harvard University. Dr. Podesta has been honored as the outstanding alumnus of Jersey City State.

As assistant commissioner of education, he is responsible for internal administration of the Department of Education and coordinates the work of all divisions. He also maintains liaison with the governor's office, the legislature, other state agencies, the federal government, county superintendents of schools and the general public. Podesta formerly served as superintendent of schools in Plainfield and in Vineland.

Mrs. Knowles, as PTA Council president, was in charge of arrangements, assisted by delegates from all local schools, The Thelma Sandmeier School PTA was represented by Mrs. Martin Grossbarth, Mrs. Edwin Corey.

### Bloodmobile makes visit to township on March 18

Plans for the forthcoming Red Cross Bloodmobile visit to Springfield are well under way. It will take place on Wednesday, March 18, from 1:30 to 6:30 p.m. at Temple Beth Ahm, Balmisroil way.

The purpose of the blood program is to maintain at all times a large inventory of blood and blood derivatives. Fresh blood is usable as whole blood for only three weeks. By participating in the program, groups of individual donors assure themselves of normal blood needs in advance. The credits accumulated in this way are good anywhere in the U. S.

Canada, Puerto Rico or the Virgin Islands. In addition to securing credits for whole blood, donors and group members are entitled to free blood derivatives, such as gamma globulin for measles and hepatitis prevention.

Donors must be between 18-61, in good health, and weigh over 110 pounds. Persons between 18 and 21 who are not married or in the armed services must have the written consent of their parent or guardian. Women who have been pregnant within the past 12 months must postpone donations.

At least eight weeks must elapse between donations, and no person should give more than five times a year. Persons taking medication on a regular basis should check their acceptability with Mrs. Daniel Kalam, 376-0582. Weight watchers and other reducers were urged to check with their own physician.

The procedure for giving blood is simple and painless, and requires about one hour. Donors do not fast, but eat their regular meals, although rich, fatty foods prior to donation are to be avoided. Temperature, pulse, blood pressure and hemoglobin are checked. In case of doubt, the donor is seen by a physician, who is at the scene at all times. One pint of blood is drawn by a skilled nurse; the donor is served light refreshment and is ready to leave.

Transportation will be available to anyone requiring it. Donors may call Mrs. Kalam at 376-0582 to arrange for it. Appointments can be made through her, or through the individual donor group chairmen. They are: Mrs. Edward Kaye, St. James Church, Joint PTAs; Mrs. Sally Chesley, Presbyterian Church; Tom Geddes, Temple Beth Ahm; Mrs. Charles Draziger, Temple Beth Ahm; Wallace Callen, Saks 5th Ave.; Mrs. Toby Auerbach.

Mrs. Kalam noted: "The goal for the forthcoming visit is 100 pints of blood. By collecting this amount, it is hoped that the needs of the township and the groups can be met for another six months, as they have always been met in the past. Give, so others can live!"

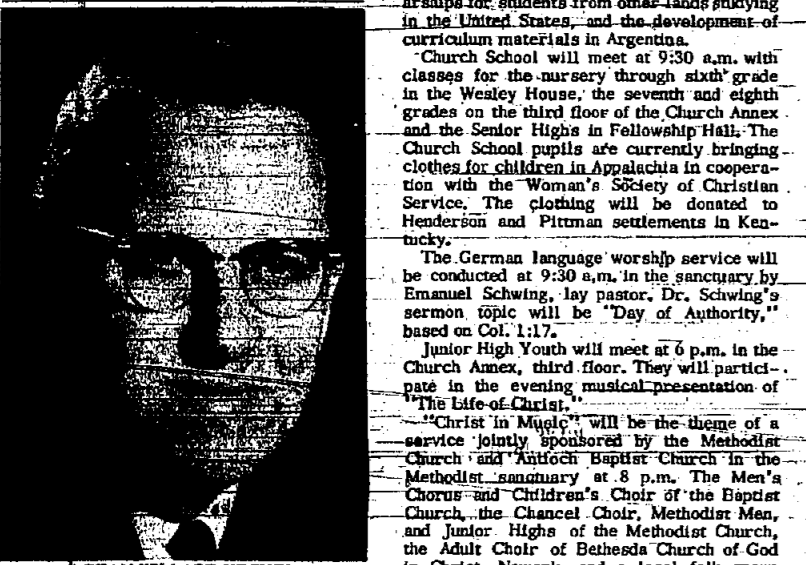

### SEARCH FOR HEALTH

Shingles is caused by virus hitting a nerve. For several days the pain may be unbearable and may be tender and burn with pain.

Depending on which nerve is attacked, shingles can be mistaken for various other disorders at this stage. Such pain occurring in the abdomen has been mistaken for appendicitis or a gall bladder attack.

Some patients recover from shingles without complications, even though they do not see a doctor. Others are left with complications which might have been avoided.

There is no sure means of avoiding these complications. Some physicians have found that gamma globulin given to shingles patients, beginning in the first two days of the disease, speeded disappearance of the rash and prevented complications.

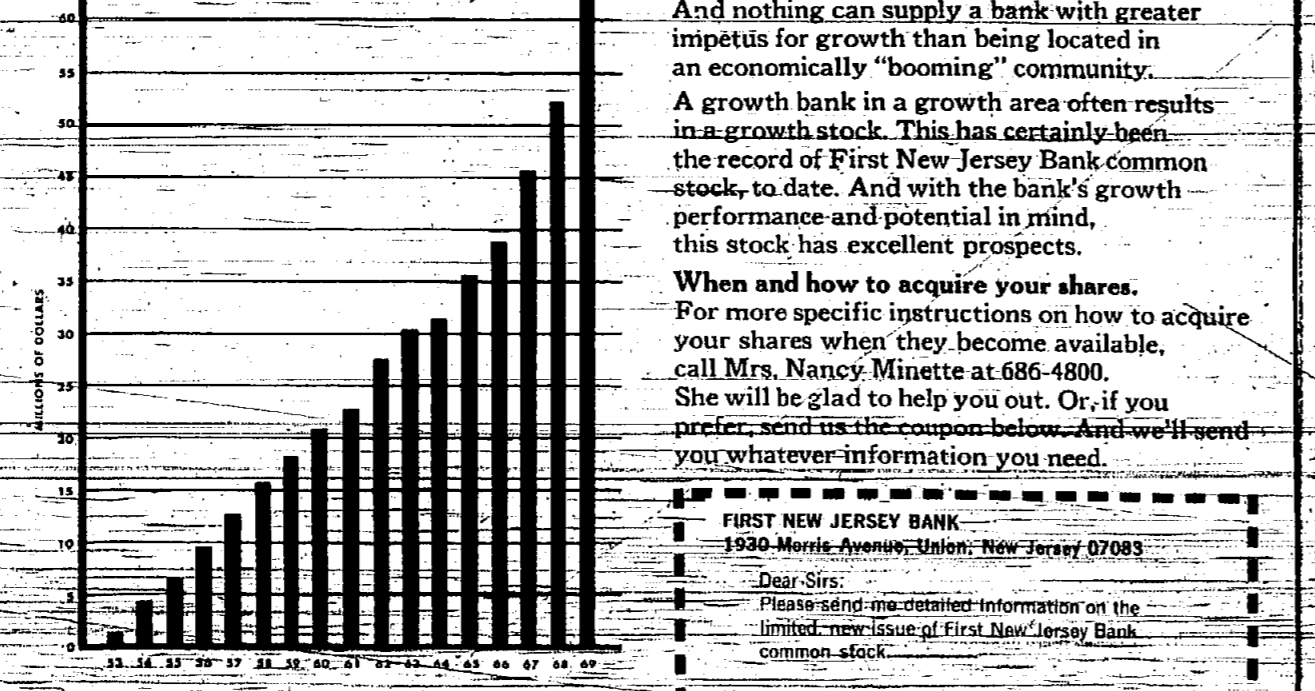
Some day there may be a vaccine against the shingles virus. Most scientists are convinced that the shingles virus is the same one which causes chickenpox.

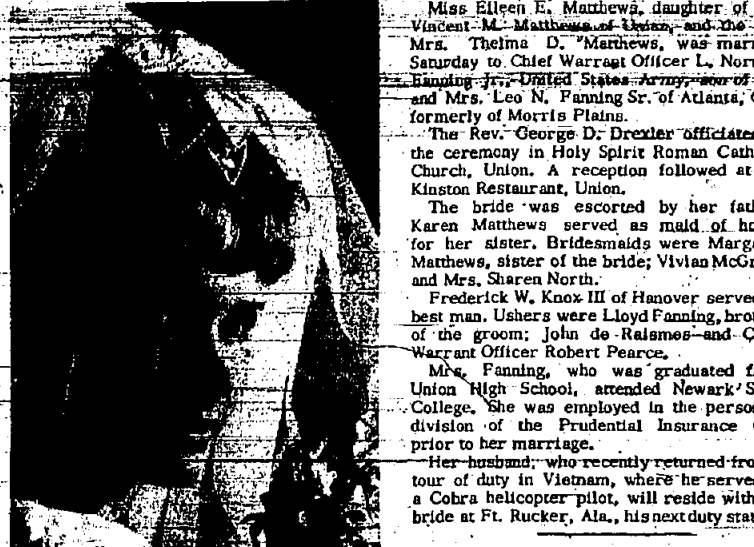

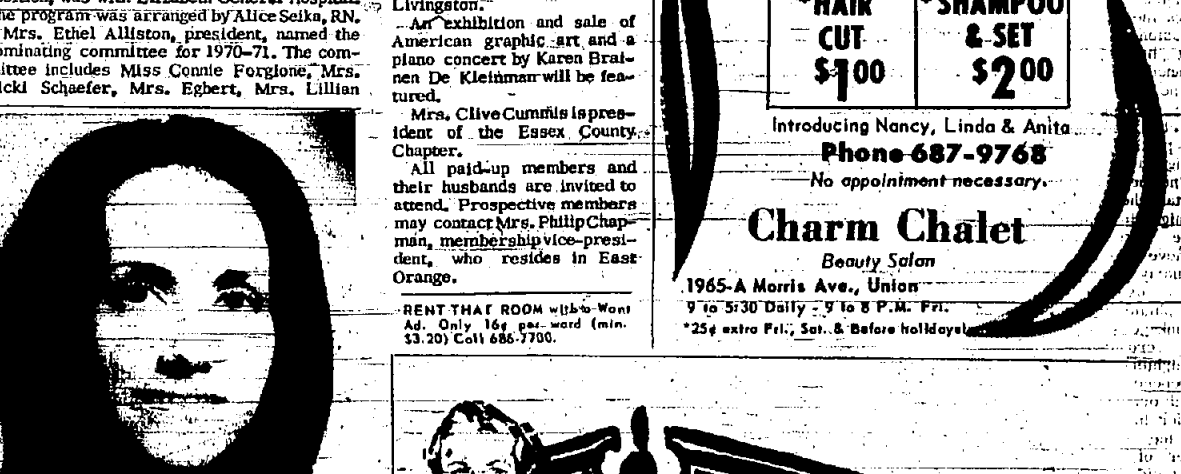

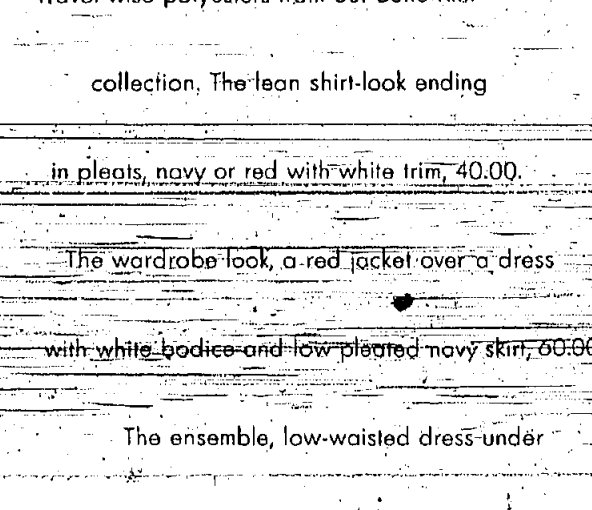
