### Trailside to show color film Sunday on 'Deep Frontier'

"Deep Frontier," a color, sound movie showing the Trailside Nature and Science Center's Trailside Nature and Science Center at the Washington Reservation Sunday at 2 p.m. The film shows the viewer the recent research being done on life and minerals beneath the sea.

Also on Sunday, at 3 and at 4, Donald W. McQuire, director of Trailside, and Elmer W. Miller, educational assistant, will present a program entitled "The Universe and Dr. Biseau." The story of the Century galaxy will be discussed, including a simplified version of its construction to the science of astronomy and of Pittsburgh.

The Trailside Planetarium can seat only 100 people. A performance is necessary to bring a ticket from the Trailside office the day of the show. Tickets are issued on a first-come, first-served basis. Children under eight years of age are not permitted in the Planetarium chamber.

On Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, at 4 p.m., Miss Irma H. Hoyer, educational assistant at Trailside, will present a performance of her talks for children. The topic to be discussed during the four week series is "Building in Scandinavia." The talks will be illustrated with color slides.

The Trailside Nature and Science Center is open to the public every day except Friday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. The public is invited to visit the Nature Center, tour the Planetarium area, view the thousand exhibits and participate in the scheduled programs.
