Rep. Dwyer hails agreement on credit card curb measure

WASHINGTON — A joint House-Senate conference committee has approved legislation, nearly identical to that introduced by Rep. Florence P. Dwyer (R-12th District), which would prohibit the unregulated distribution of credit cards and limit the liability of consumers for the unauthorized use of such cards.

The bill, Mrs. Dwyer explained, would: (1) ban the unregulated distribution of credit cards; (2) limit an individual's liability for unauthorized use of his card by another person; (3) require that credit cards contain a means by which the holder can be properly identified; (4) provide that a cardholder be adequately notified of his rights and liabilities; and (5) place upon card issuers the burden of proof of establishing the liability of credit card holders.

Under the legislation, she said, companies may renew existing credit cards and issue unsolicited cards if holders either originally requested them or actually used them. Noting that the Federal Trade Commission has prohibited the distribution of unsolicited credit cards within their area of jurisdiction and that the House recently passed a bill to ban mailing of unsolicited credit cards under circumstances, Mrs. Dwyer pointed out that both actions would be limited in their application.

The New Jersey congressman also accused a ranking minority member of the Banking and Currency Committee participating in the conference, estimated that up to one million credit cards are lost and 300,000 are stolen each year.

Congresswoman Dwyer noted that the credit card "bill" has risen to \$13 billion, as of June, and the amount of credit outstanding from the use of credit cards.

Over 1,000 consumer credit card holders now live in existence," she declared, "including hundreds of millions of cards, millions of consumers, and hundreds of thousands of businesses, the breadth of this operation has brought with it a series of extremely difficult problems and much personal hardship.

"Innocent victims have been harassed by bill collectors, dragged into lawsuits and jail, seen their credit ratings ruined, and their credit employment placed in jeopardy. The emotional drain, the time and money they have expended there are more than inconvenient to those who have been caught in the credit card trap; they are nightmares."

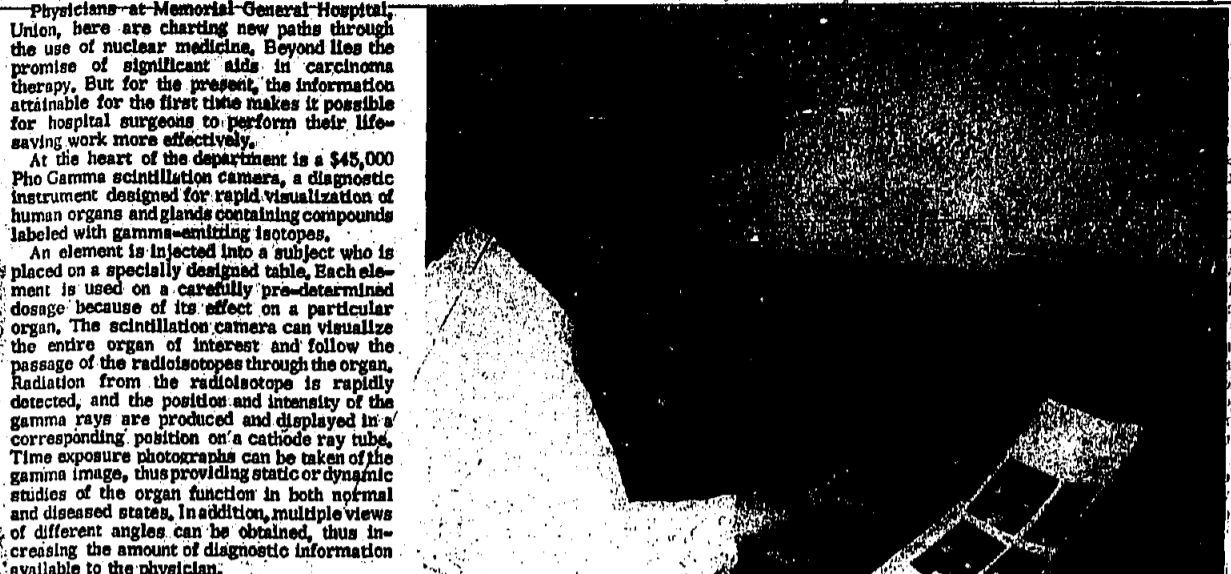

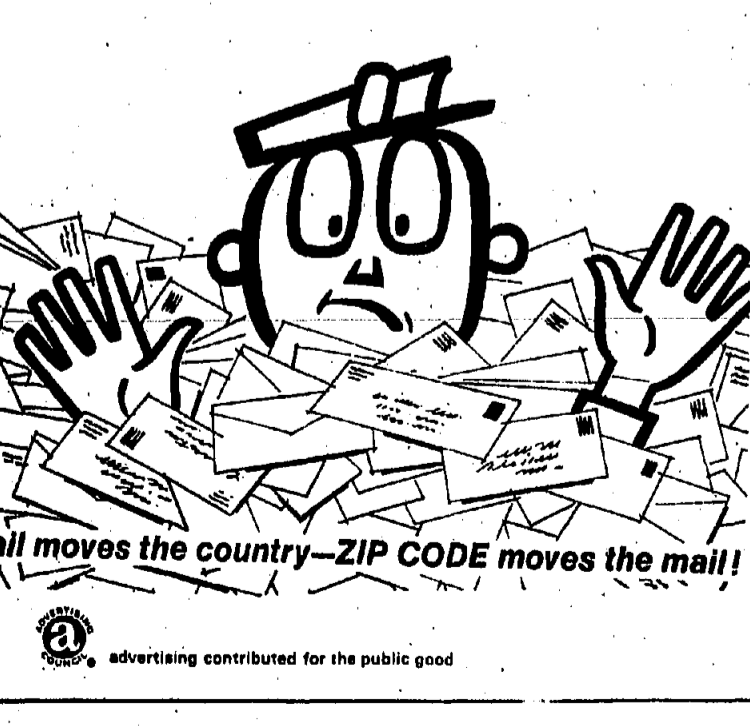

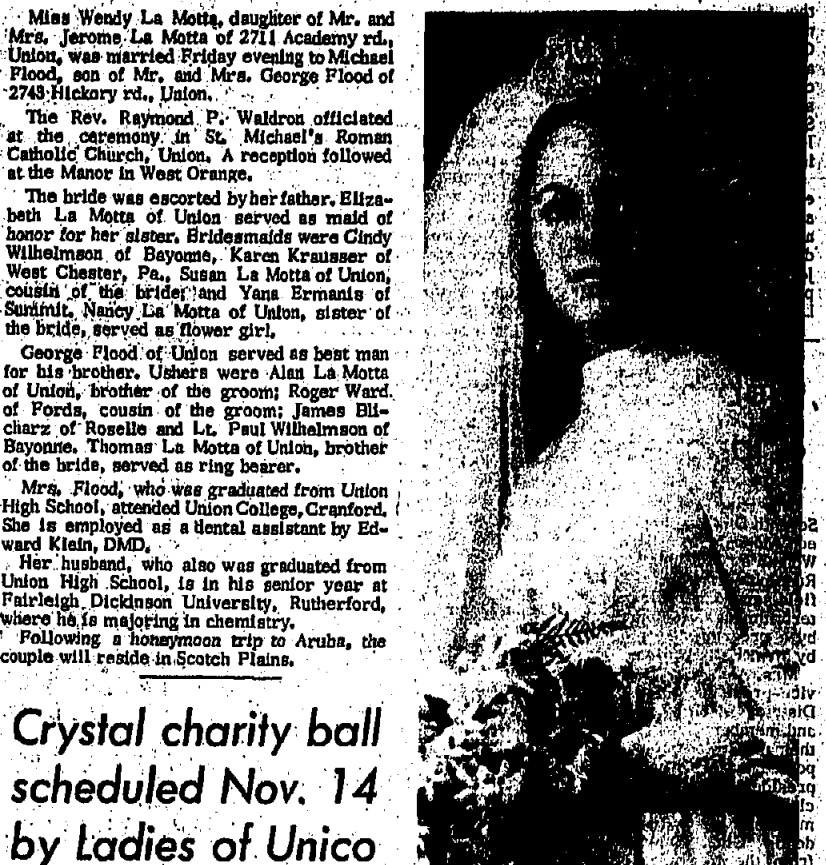
