

Campaign launched to recruit workers in health care field

The New Jersey Health Careers Society has launched a statewide campaign Monday to raise \$100,000 to expand its efforts to recruit more people to enter the health care field.

The campaign is the encouragement and support of Dr. James R. Cowan, state commissioner of health, who said that the work of the New Jersey Health Careers Society "deserves to be supported because it is vital in making the health care system more efficient and in preventing the critical shortage that exists in health care manpower and in helping people of all ages to consider a career in preparing for and entering the health care field."

In addition, some 76 statewide health professional and technical associations, as well as the Medical Society of New Jersey have endorsed the health careers program. Koehler explained that studies made by the New Jersey Health Careers Society revealed that New Jersey is facing critical manpower shortages in almost every kind of position in the health field.

"It is hoped that the total health manpower shortage at the state at this time is 11,775 and that, at the present rate of recruitment and training, the shortage will be 19,343 in 1980.

"This is true," Koehler continued, "whether we talk about hospitals, nursing homes, extended care facilities, industrial health centers, public health officers, nurses and technicians."

Eclipse of moon at 11:38 Tuesday

For you see it, now you don't and if you don't see it, you'll have missed the one opportunity this year to see a total eclipse of the moon.

Patrick J. White of Warren Township, professor of astronomy and director of the William Miller Sperry Observatory at Union College, Cranford, reported that the eclipse will be a total eclipse of the moon on Tuesday and Wednesday. One of two lunar eclipses scheduled for 1971, the total eclipse will be visible in North America.

The Man in the Moon will begin drawing the curtains at 11:38 p.m. The total eclipse will end at 12:52 a.m. Wednesday and will end at 3:26 a.m.

While not considered a major astronomical event, the lunar eclipse will give astronomers an opportunity to study atmospheric conditions and to observe the atmosphere of the moon. Members of the American Astronomical Society, Inc., will take lunar measurements.

Editorial Comment

The job Lincoln began still has to be finished

Tomorrow, unless the Washington chronicles have been up to their funny work again behind our backs, marks the 162nd birthday of Abraham Lincoln.

He will be remembered longest as the president who asserted that no nation can exist half slave and half free. Unfortunately, more than a century after his death the dichotomy between slavery and freedom, in many respects, remains.

Those belonging to minority groups (that is, the current euphemism for black Americans) most often held in economic and social bondage are still locked behind walls which are no less effective for being invisible and usually, illegal.

Efforts to pour more money, and better teachers, into the segregated inner city schools have generally failed, because often not enough money filters through all the eager bureaucratic and political hands that are stretched out and because too many senior educators are unable to adapt to the bold new features required by the crisis situation.

Efforts to reduce the amount of segregation by busing students into and out of the ghetto have run into impassable road blocks.

There has been opposition because of the legitimate desire to retain local schools. The American culture is no longer regarded as a melting pot, where everyone comes out the same old shade of cultural gray. It is rather a tapestry, in which all our heritages are woven together to form a harmonious nation.

And the only way we can deal with the unblendable bits on the landscape created by busing them, the place to start is not in the schools, although the needs of the ghetto schools must retain top educational priority.

The present national administration, heir to the one headed by Lincoln, has made a start by suggesting that suburban towns share the blame for existence of the ghettos by restrictive zoning practices that make the ghetto walls that much higher.

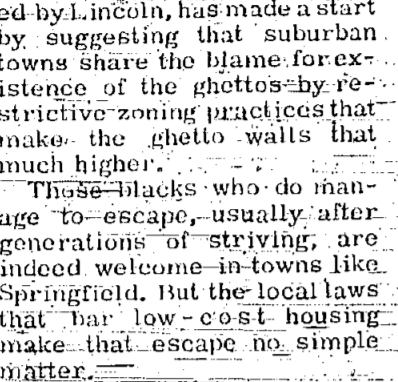
Those blacks who do manage to escape, usually after generations of striving, are indeed welcome in towns like Springfield. But the local laws that bar low-cost housing make that escape no simple matter.

Perhaps the way to solve the problems of the ghetto is not with the schoolroom but with the bulldozer. Just perhaps we should level the Central business district of Newark, for example.

That would leave the nation with one million of people, black, lost, confused, resentful, from all the central wards of all the Newarks.

And then, as has been suggested from Washington, the carefully sheltered suburbs could make possible the kind of housing that would move our fellow citizens into all the Springfields, all the Westmountains, all the Millburgs, the Mountaintowns.

Time To Spare

There's the plight of a woman in the city... My husband recently retired. He has always earned a high salary, with commissions, and we have always lived well.
