Drug abuse program set at Regional

One of the most extensive public service programs yet initiated on the problem of drug abuse will be presented in a three-part series on March 22, 29 and April 5 at Jonathan Dayton Regional High School. It was announced this week by the Springfield Mayor's Commission for the Prevention of Drug Abuse and the Union County Regional Adult School.

The program, "Drugs: A Turning Point" will feature discussions on what the local schools and the regional high school are doing about the problem, practical guidelines parents could follow on developing better understanding between themselves and their children, and a community "rap" session.

The series is being held in cooperation with the Springfield Council of PTAs. There will be no charge.

"We believe a turning point can be reached in drug abuse," Dr. Joseph Tamburo, assistant superintendent for the Springfield public schools, and a planning committee member, said.

"This series will attempt to focus on the ways the schools are trying to turn the corner, and how this turning point can be reached through better communications between parents and their children."

Harry E. Linkin, adult school director for the Union County Regional High School District, said a highlight of the evening programs will be chance for the audience to participate in the discussions, which will feature highly qualified speakers in the field of drug use and abuse, and family living.

"The 'rap' session, a give and take discussion with regional high school students, rehabilitated ex-addicts—a psychologist, the police, the mayor's commission and members of the audience, will give adults the opportunity to take part in a far-ranging discussion of the problem," Linkin said.

The programs will be held in Room 19-20 of Dayton Regional High School from 8 to 9:30 p.m.

Besides Dr. Tamburo and Linkin, other members of the planning committee who have been working on the program for some six months are Mrs. Lucille Weiss, health teach-

Regional board sets timing for its expansion proposal

The Regional High School District Board of Education this week disclosed plans for two meetings to act on its expansion bond proposal, which is expected to go before the voters in a referendum some time in May.

The referendum will mark the board's third attempt in three years to win voter approval for new facilities to deal with what has been termed "critical overcrowding" in the district's four high schools.

The board will hold an adjourned regular meeting Tuesday at 8 p.m. in its offices at Jonathan Dayton Regional High School, Springfield, to consider a resolution calling for debt statements from the six communities which make up the district. This step is required by state law as part of the procedure leading to a referendum.

After that, the board will hold another adjourned regular meeting at the same place on Tuesday, March 16. The business at that time will be a resolution setting the date of a building program proposal to go before the voters of the six towns in a special election, and also setting a date for that special election.

If the board passes the resolution as expected on March 16, the referendum date is anticipated to be some time in May, according to an informed source.

The total cost of the expansion plans is expected to be substantially below the \$6 million limit set by the board several months ago when it authorized preparation of new plans. The proposal which lost at the polls last spring had a price tag of nearly \$7 million.

Board members met in executive session last week to inspect schematic drawings for the expansion, which is scheduled at all four high schools. They conferred again this Monday with Frederick Elsasner, architect for the project, and they will meet again this coming Monday to complete preparations for the regular adjourned session on Tuesday.

The first expansion plan was defeated in 1968. It called for all Mountaintop students to attend Gov. Livingston Regional High School, Berkeley Heights, as they had for more than a decade. This plan drew opposition in Springfield from citizens who said that Gov. Livingston would be twice the size of Dayton, leading to unequal educational opportunities.

The 1970 proposal would have sent all Mountaintop students to Dayton, in order to equalize the size of the schools. This was strongly opposed by many Mountaintop voters, who did not want their youngsters to attend Dayton, rather than Gov. Livingston.

The plan to be voted on this spring will also send all Mountaintop youngsters to Dayton, according to the resolution which authorized preparation of this latest proposal.

Plans near completion for visit of Bloodmobile

Plans for the coming Red Cross bloodmobile visit to Springfield are well under way. It will take place on Thursday, March 18, from 1:30 to 6:15 p.m. at Temple Shalom, South Springfield avenue.

Participating donor groups and their chairmen are as follows: PTAs, Mrs. Stanley Kroeger-Saks; Mrs. Frank Auerbach; Temple Shalom, Mrs. Charles Danziger; Temple Beth Ahm, Wallace Callen; Presbyterian Church, Mrs. Thomas Geddes; St. James Church, Mrs. Edwin Kaye. Donor appointments can be made through the individual chairmen, or by calling Mrs. Daniel Kalem at 376-0582. Transportation may also be arranged through her.

A chapter spokesman added: "Donor must be between the ages of 18-65, in good health, and weigh over 110 lbs. Unmarried persons between 18-21 must have written parental consent. Women who have been pregnant within the past 12 months must postpone donation. At least eight weeks must elapse between donations, and no one should give more than five times a year. Persons taking medications on a regular basis should check their acceptability with Mrs. Kalem; weight watchers and other reducers are urged to check with their own physicians.

"The procedure for giving blood is simple and painless, and requires about one hour. Donors should not fast, but eat their regular meals, although rich, fatty foods prior to dona-

tion are to be avoided. Temperature, pulse, blood pressure and hemoglobin are checked; a brief medical history is taken by a registered nurse. The donor is served light refreshments and is ready to leave.

"The purpose of a blood bank has always been to maintain, at all times, a large inventory of blood and blood derivatives. However, as a result of recent newspaper articles about the threat of serum hepatitis, it is known there is now an ever more urgent need for voluntary blood donations.

"Because not enough blood is collected in this way, hospitals must often rely on buying blood from commercial banks to fill their needs. Since, at the present time, there is still no foolproof test for detecting serum hepatitis in the blood of the donor, the only way to prevent the spread of this disease through blood transfusions is through the ample availability of voluntarily donated blood. In areas where this is the main source of blood, serum hepatitis is a virtually unknown disease.

"So bear in mind that, when donating blood, you are not only assuring yourself, or members of your group, of your blood needs in advance, but also of the fact that your donation will lessen the chances of having someone receive bought blood whose donor may not have given a truthful medical history, and who may transmit a dangerous illness.

"Give, for everyone's better health."

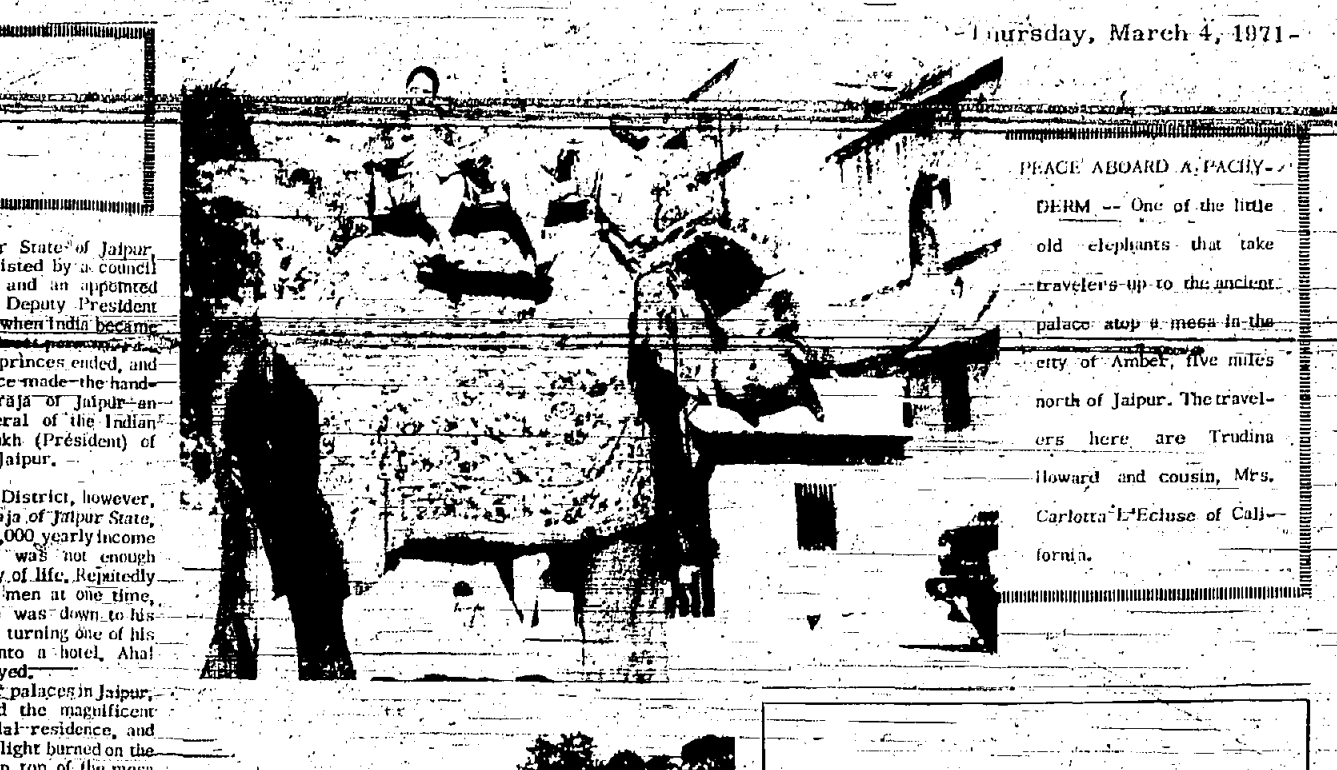

Tracking the cockroach

Pest may hold a cancer key

If survival is a virtue, then very few organisms can match the cockroach, says Rutgers entomologist who is researching the pest behind the scenes.

The cockroach is a pest because of its ability to survive in the most inhospitable environments.

Using chemicals, it's possible to cause a type of tumor in the cockroach, he says, but that defense mechanism is not the key.

Dr. Sushan's particular interest is the cockroach's resistance to cancer - much stronger than that of man.

The act provided for state funds for education and for local school districts to raise money to make up the difference. But, until 1871, these acts also offered local boards the alternative of raising the school tax to the point where the state would not have to contribute a cent.



St. Barnabas 'detectives' solve case

The humidifier you bought to "improve the climate" in your home may have become a secret enemy, according to St. Barnabas Medical Center "detectives" who recently solved the case of a young child who became ill after using a humidifier.

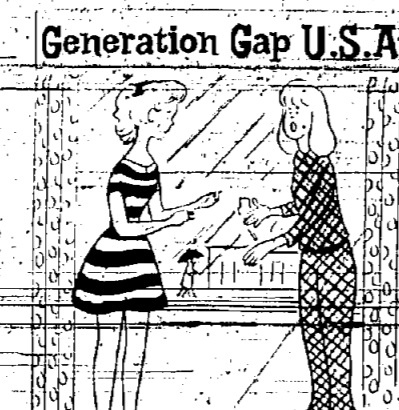
Dr. William J. Weiss, chief of allergy services at St. Barnabas Medical Center, said the child's illness was caused by a "dirty" humidifier. The humidifier was found to be contaminated with mold and bacteria, which were being blown into the child's room.

The case involved a young child who had been hospitalized four times over a period of 15 weeks with symptoms of coughing, sneezing, runny nose, and wheezing. Each time the patient returned home from the hospital, he became ill again within a short period of time. When he entered St. Barnabas Medical Center for the fourth time, he was found to have a severe allergic reaction to mold and bacteria.

The medical laboratory team studied his sputum and nasal secretions and identified the organisms that were causing the illness. The organisms were found to be mold and bacteria, which were being blown into the child's room by the humidifier.

Dr. TOURVILLE NOTED that the reservoir was not removable and was inaccessible for cleaning. "Millions of families that operate a humidifier in their homes," said Dr. Weiss, "run the risk of incurring allergic lung reactions as a result of stagnation of the water reservoir in the apparatus. The contamination is sprayed into the air along with water vapor from the humidifier."

This potential health hazard can be avoided, he said, by cleaning the water pan of your humidifier frequently. Don't let the humidifier make more than a few drops of water per day or so. When you buy a humidifier, make sure the water pan can be removed or is easily accessible for cleaning.
