A number of states have instituted "consumer hot lines," which are well publicized telephone numbers that citizens can call to get quick action on their complaints.

AS AN ENVIRONMENTALIST, the "consumer hot-line" would be a number that can be called during the check-out process in the store.

Naturally, the division wishes to contact the complainants who record messages on a tape when the clerk is not available to help.

Psychologically, the knowledge that one has articulated his concerns to someone who has a position to provide some help can be most reassuring.

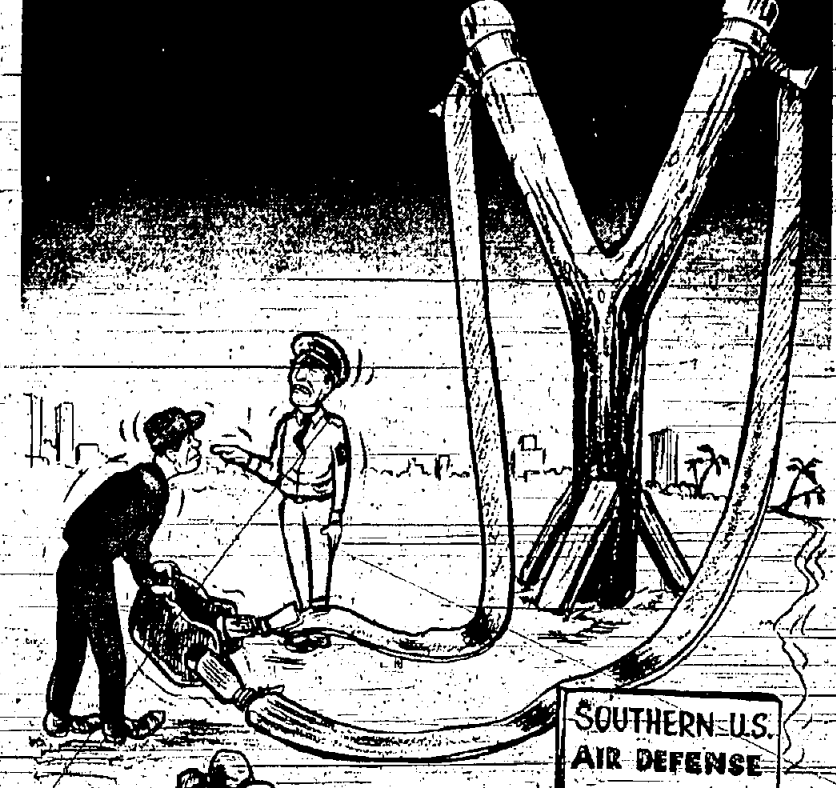
Further, there are many people who feel self-conscious about writing a formal letter of complaint. There also are those who are hesitant about traveling in person to a government agency to register their complaints.

Since many of the matters brought to the attention of the Division of Consumer Affairs are not legally actionable, the routine complaints are processed without the usual court battles.

Upsala students put finger on thumbing

Find generation gap in ideas on hitchhiking

Hitchhikers have the best chance of getting rides from like-minded young men and women, Upsala College students have concluded in a survey paper resulting from a study to measure the attitudes of students at the college toward hitchhiking. The study was conducted by students at the college who are hitchhikers themselves. They also reported that most young people feel hitchhiking should be legalized while the majority of older people believe it should not be.

Older people, they point out, are reluctant to pick up hitchhikers because they have more respect for life and learn to be more cautious with strangers. Most tend to pick up hitchhikers "because they are young and they will be caught, unless they are hitchhiking in a rural area." Miss Velle and Hall also reported that the students' survey revealed that most young people feel hitchhiking should be legalized while the majority of older people believe it should not be.

Their surveys were based on questionnaires and through written questionnaires of 100 residents of Roseland, North Caldwell, Parsippany and Mount Tabor. "In general people were very receptive and treated us politely and some with great hospitality," the Upsala freshmen said. 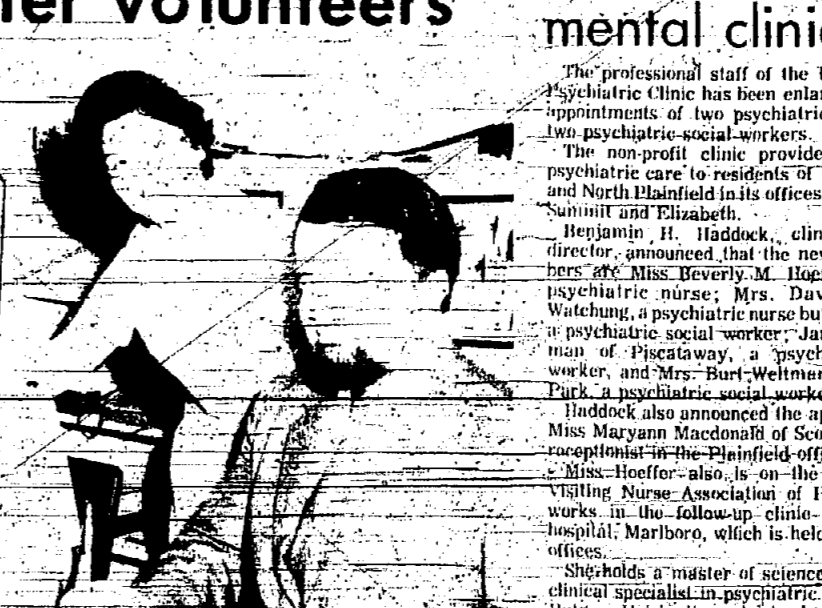

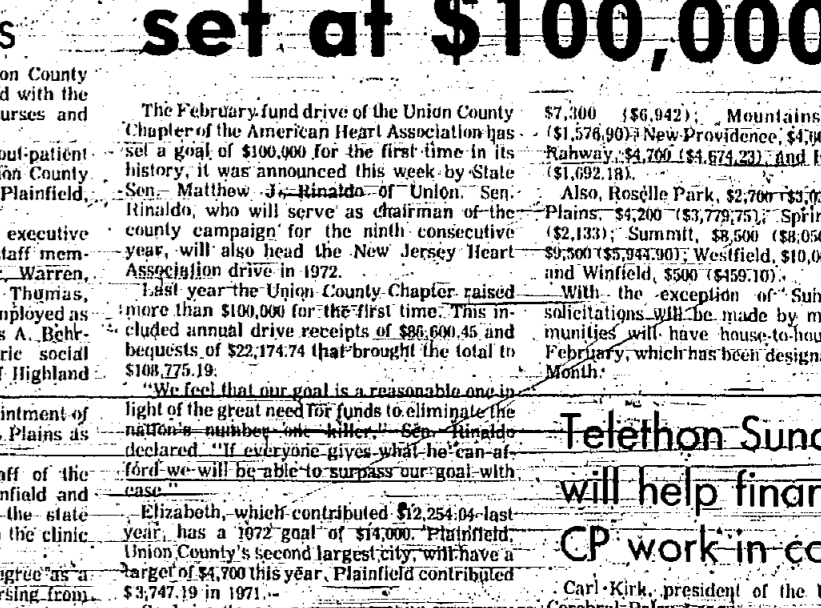

Bank assets up by 2.1 pct. in '71

The assets of First New Jersey Bank grew 2.1 percent to \$67,965,291 in the year that ended Dec. 31, it was announced this week by Frank M. Pitt, chairman of the board. Total assets stood at \$72,520,380 as of Dec. 31.

Pitt pointed out that the bank's assets more than doubled in five years, from \$38,858,155 on Dec. 31, 1966.

The First New Jersey chairman also said the bank's earnings, including bond profits, were \$1.60 per share before taxes on \$25,407,347 shares at the end of 1970.

First New Jersey's deposits increased from \$84,670,041 to \$78,107,457, while loans went from \$45,961,455 to \$50,248,597 during the year that ended Dec. 31.

Pitt also noted that the gains were recorded during a year in which the bank sustained the expense of opening its permanent office in Middlesex, one of three communities in which First New Jersey launched new branches in 1970.

Sperry Observatory to host meeting of science teachers

The William Miller Sperry Observatory on Union College's Cranford campus will play host to the New Jersey Science Teachers Association on Saturday when the organization's Earth Science Section will meet at the facility from 9:30 a.m. until 1 p.m.

In making the announcement, the observatory's director, Prof. Patrick J. White of Warren Township, noted that the statewide association will be represented by 50 members of the specialist section under the chairmanship of Norman Gardner of Metuchen, a teacher in the West Orange school system.

Following an informal breakfast from 9 to 9:30 a.m., the business portion of the meeting will be held to discuss such topics as "Phenomena of the Sun" and "Variable Stars." Members of the Amateur Astronomers, Inc., which operates the Sperry Observatory in cooperation with Union College, will lead the discussions. John Byrman of Westfield, president of AAT, will head the portion of the program dealing with the stars while Edward Pearson, also of Westfield, and first president of AAT, will handle the segment dealing with the sun, with special emphasis on sun spots.

Detailed information regarding the observatory's target-mounted telescopes is also on the agenda. Cornelius Arnold of Cranford, a member of AAT, will explain the intricacies of the 12-inch reflector scope while Richard Blum of Princeton will point out the workings of the new, 16-inch refractor scope which is now in the process of being installed. Umos, is chairman of AAT's telescope design committee, which headed the refractor project.

The Sperry Observatory was dedicated in 1967 and has been instrumental in aiding many thousands of men, women and children to learn more and more about the study of the heavens. The facility is the second largest of its kind in the state and believed to be the only ob-

servatory to be located on the campus of a two-year college.

Union College is pleased and proud that the New Jersey Science Teachers Association will be meeting here on the 26th. Prof. White declared, "More and more organizations are becoming aware of the facilities we offer at the Observatory and are taking advantage of them in order to further their members' knowledge of astronomy."

The director said "this is one of the main reasons why the Sperry Observatory was erected and when it comes to helping others learn about the seemingly bottomless pit above us... the sky's the limit."
