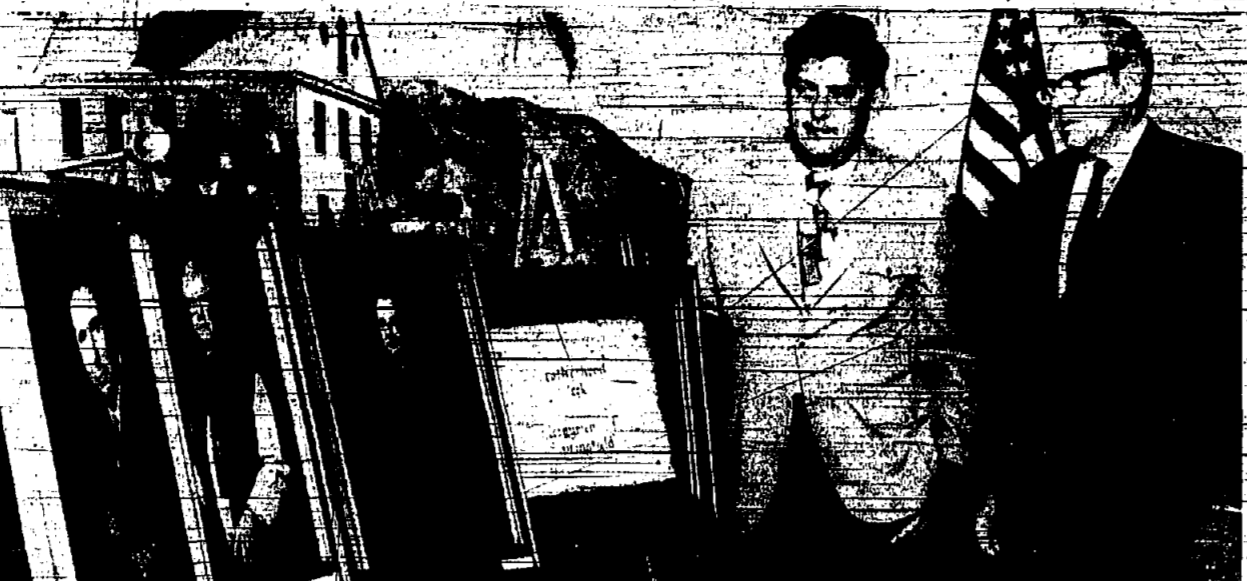

Pupils given preventive dentistry

In observance of Children's Better Dental Health Week, students enrolled in the dental assistant program at Union County Technical Institute, presented a program on preventive dentistry for youngsters at the Shackamaxon School.

Four booths on various aspects of dental care, each manned by a local dentist and several UCTI students, were set up and the Shackamaxon students visited each one throughout the day on a rotating basis.

The booths included displays and explanations by the dental assistants of X-Ray procedures and uses, the making of false teeth cavities, and overall preventive dental care. Students saw the workings of an actual drill and mock-up tooth being filled. They were also taught how to use dental floss.

Diet, proper toothbrushing techniques and regular checkups were among the topics discussed. The UCTI students distributed sugarless gum and featured a show-and-tell presentation on dental health.

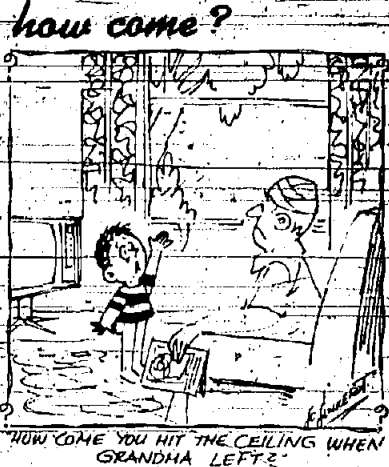
The dentists who assisted with the program were Dr. Robert Seater of Scotch Plains, Shackamaxon school dentist and chairman of dental education for the Board of Education, Dr. Thomas Guglielmo of Fanwood, and Dr. Robert Grill of Scotch Plains.

The visit to Shackamaxon for Children's Better Dental Health Week was arranged by Mrs. Genia Berk, associate dean for health careers.

Union County Technical Institute offers dental assisting as a one-year program which prepares a student to perform chairside and office duties for practicing dentists. The student study dental anatomy and physiology, first aid skills with dental materials and tools, pharmacology, and dental ethics. Practical experience in area hospitals and dental offices is also included in the program.

Two-year programs in dental hygiene and dental technology that lead to an Associate in Applied Science degree are offered by Union College. The dental hygiene program features studies at Union College, UCTI, and the College of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey. These graduates are qualified to perform some dental procedures, such as cleanings, X-Rays, and fillings.

The dental laboratory technology program prepares students to construct the various appliances prescribed for the patient by the dentist.

Capital investment discussed by prof

Three factors which an entrepreneur must combine to start a business—land, labor and capital—were discussed by Prof. Henry Buckwalter last week at an economics workshop for 22 Union and Mountaintop teachers.

Prof. Buckwalter, chairman of the economics department at Bloomfield College, told that the average amount of capital investment in manufacturing firms in the United States is \$24,000 per worker. He said this means that the American worker has more dollars invested in the plant and equipment he uses than any other worker in the world.

This talk was one of a series in the workshop program being sponsored by the First New Jersey Bank of Union and Springfield State Bank to acquaint teachers with economic principles and their application.
