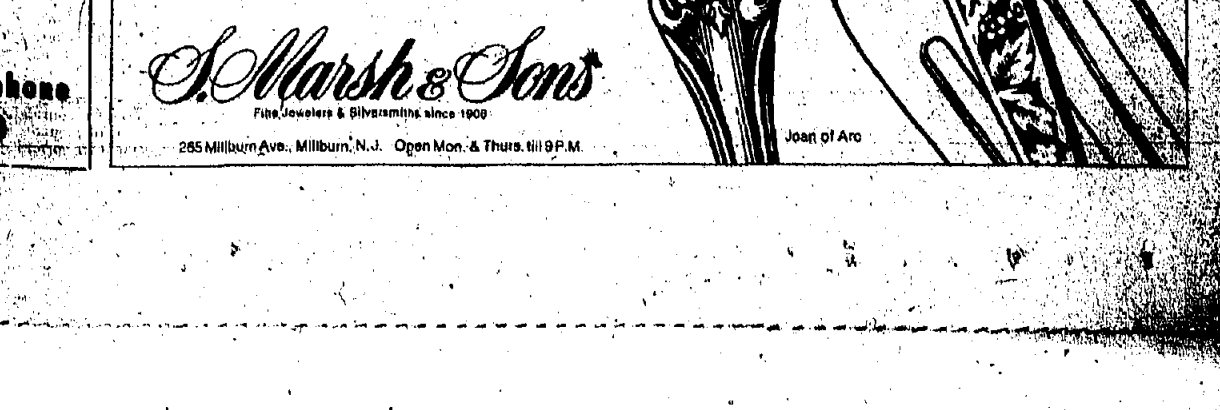

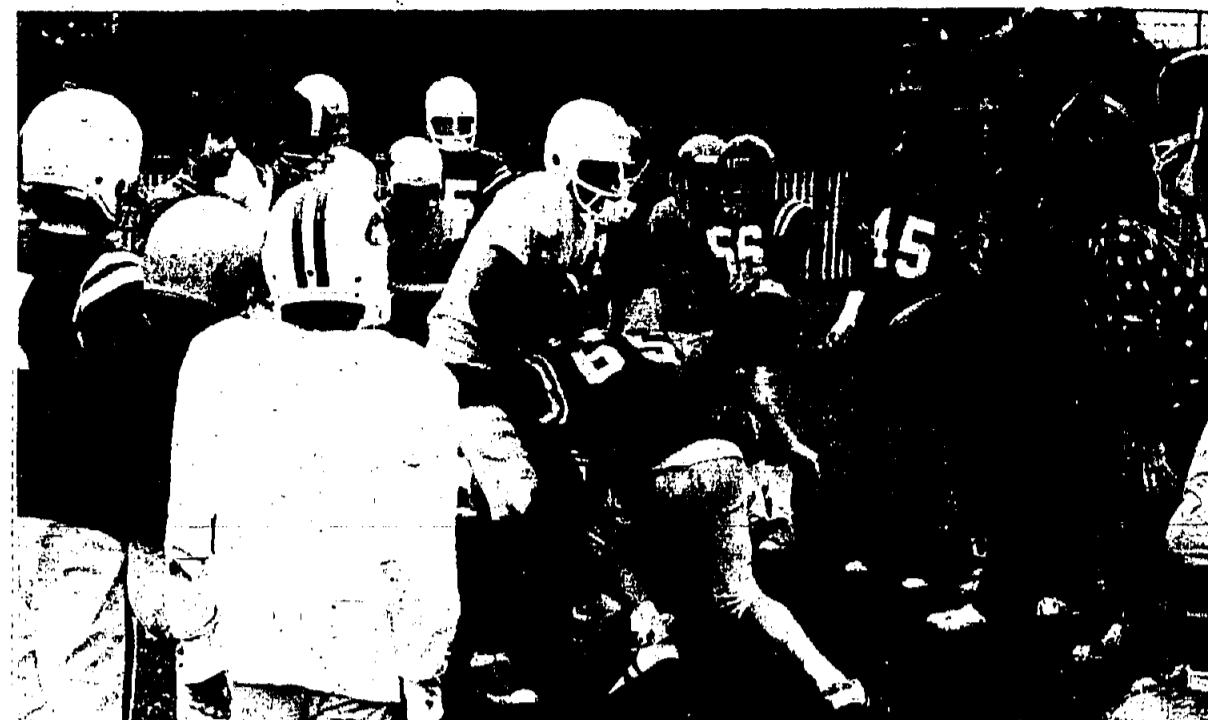

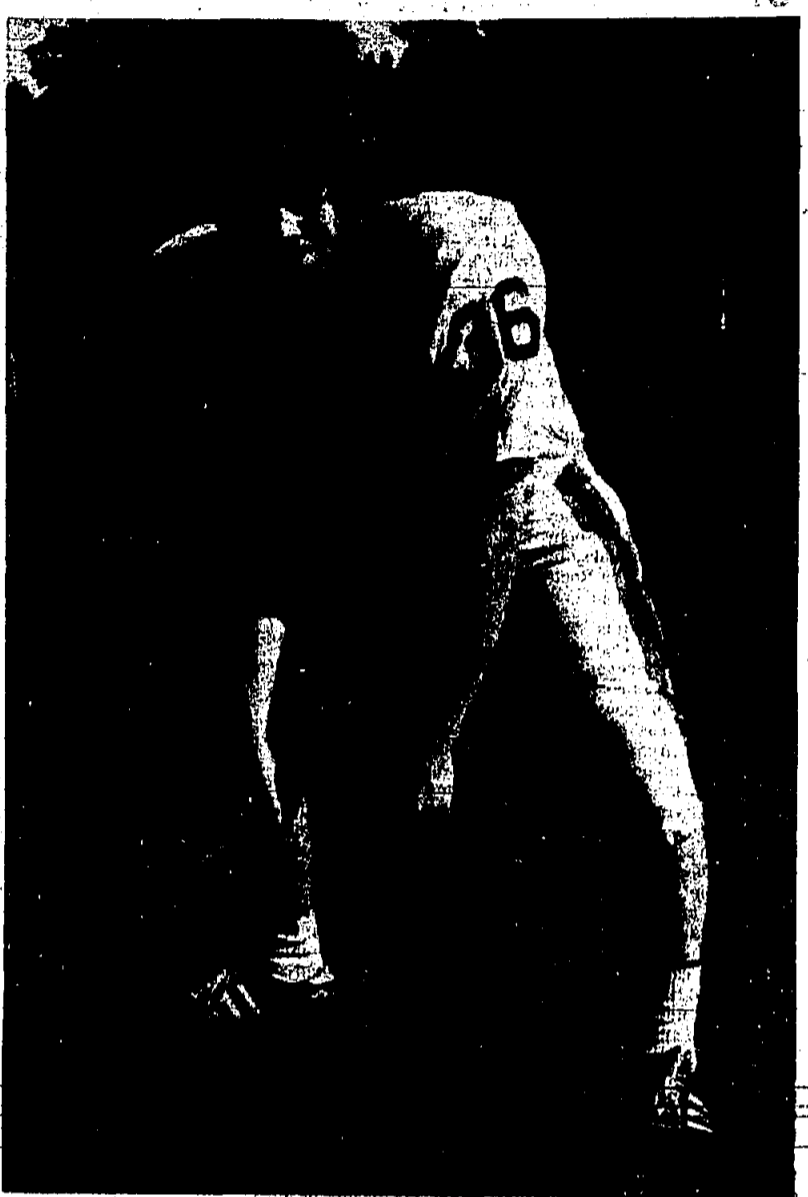
# Harriers finish 6th in Sectional; defeat Verona

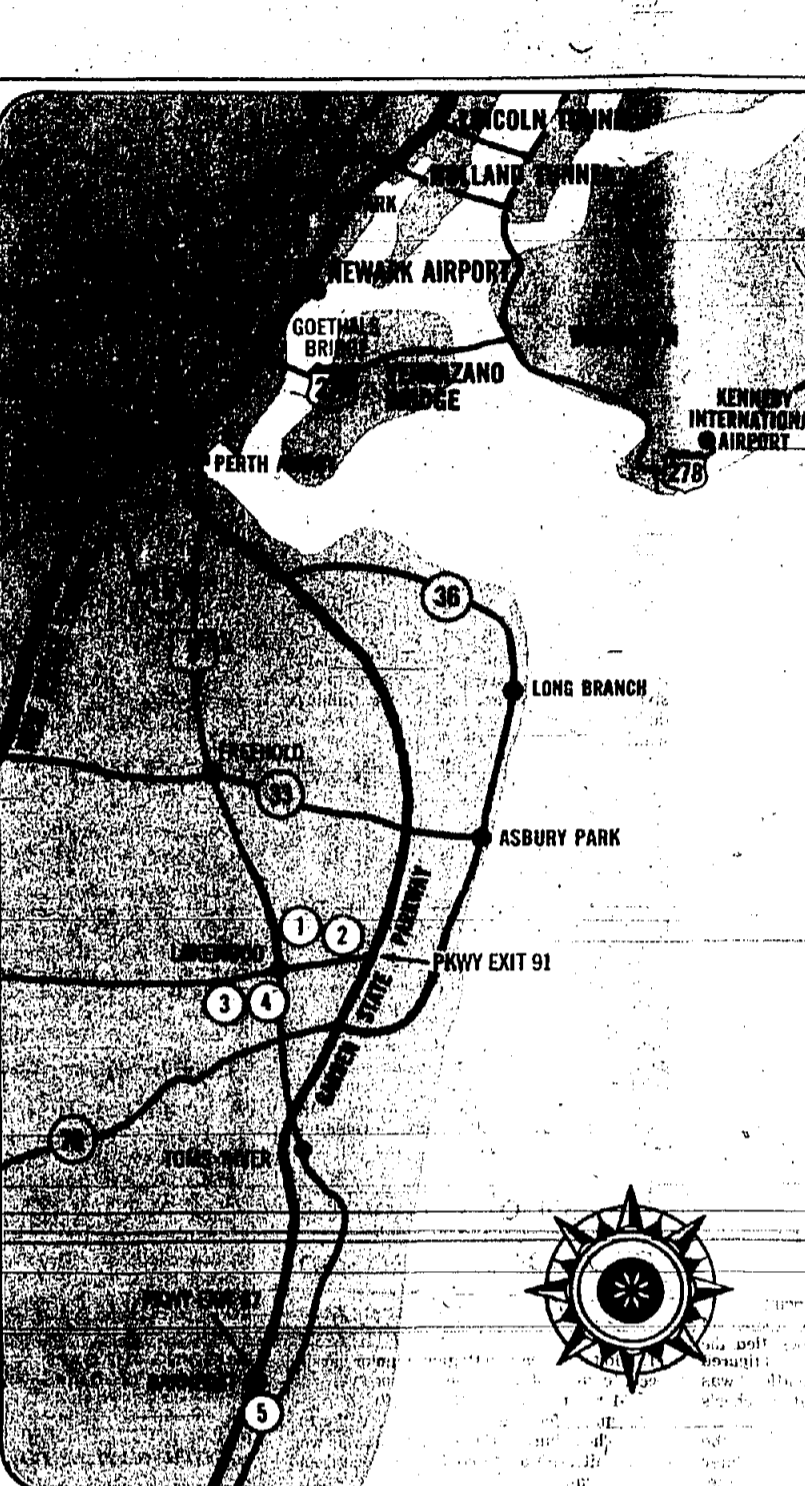

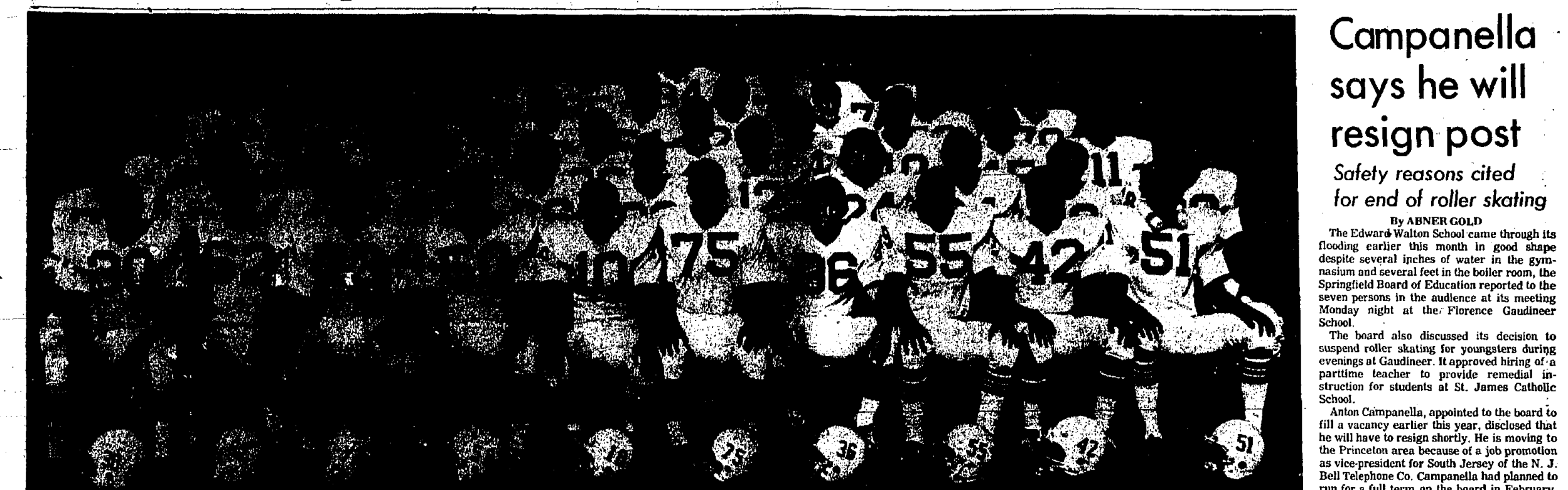
