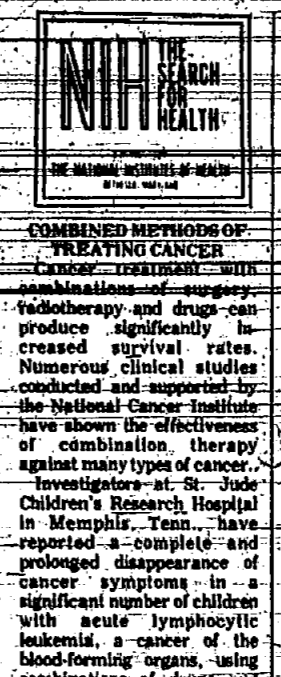


Wilson announces she'll run for second term in Assembly
