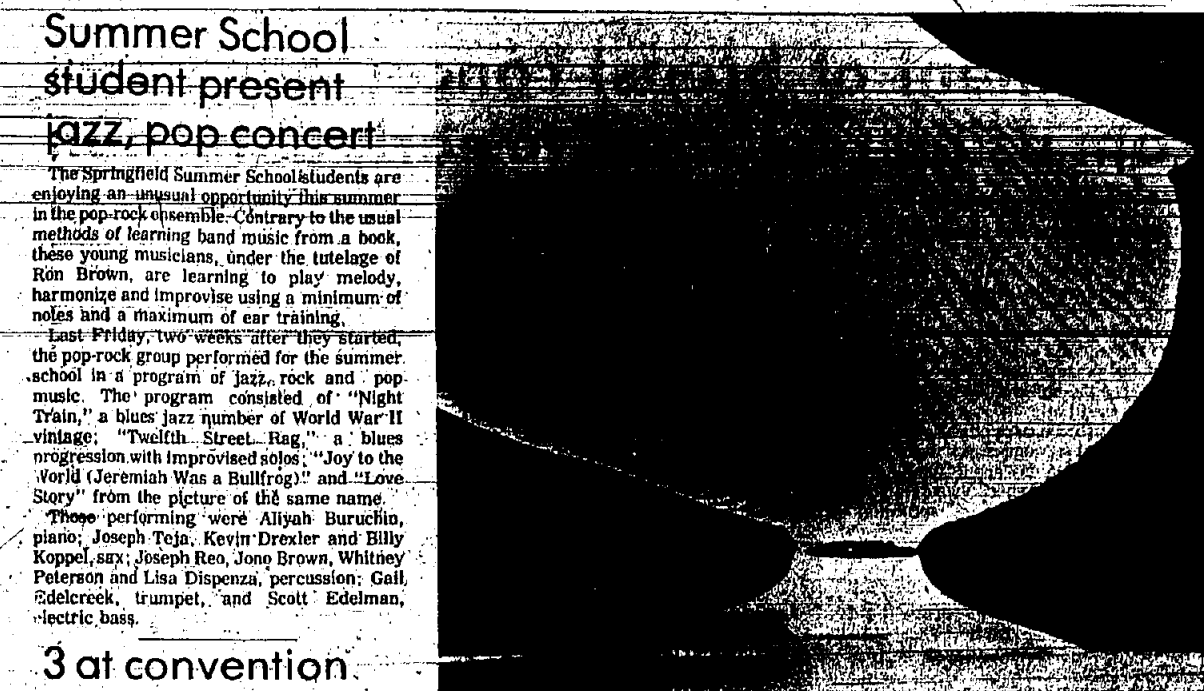

Dear Larrie:
I put a \$30 down payment on a chandelier for my dining room and had planned to pay this off on a weekly basis. A problem arose when my new dining room set was delivered. I then realized the chandelier I had on layaway would definitely not fit in with the new dining room table. I returned to the store and asked for a refund. The manager refused to refund my \$30, saying that it is a store policy that no refunds be made on lay-away items. Larrie, I don't recall the manager saying anything about lay-away's no-refund policy nor was it noted on the receipt I held. Is it right for this store to keep my money without returning my \$30, right?
Dear Disturbed:
No. The store should be subject to civil regulation of this act states that unless the seller makes perfectly clear on the layaway agreement and on subsequent payments receipts that there will be "no refund," he is obligated to cancel the contract and return all monies at the request of the buyer.

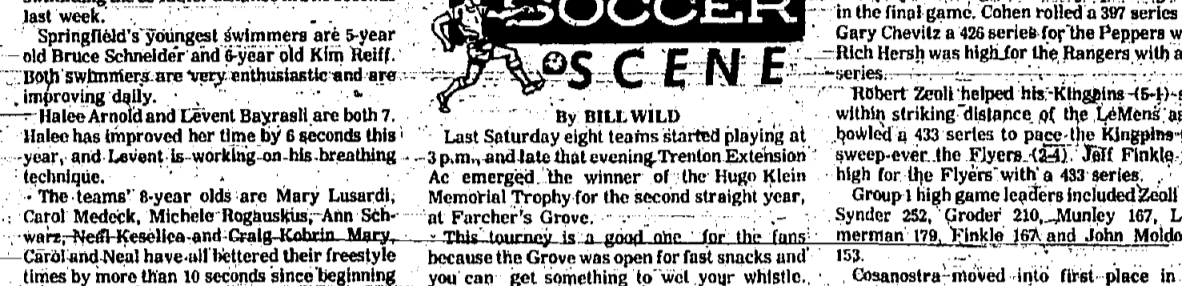

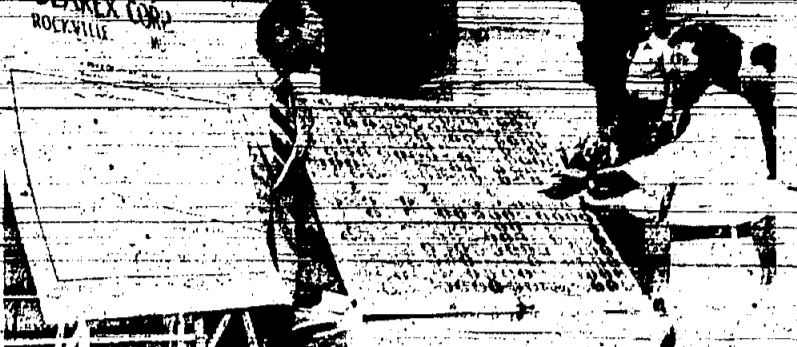
