The drive will again be conducted by a mobile unit of the North Jersey Red Cross, New Jersey's oldest and largest blood banking organization.

St. James Church will be the host group for the visit, with its chairman, Mrs. Helen Stickle, in charge of the proceedings. All other donor groups have been invited and expected to participate.

They are the John P.T.A. including parents of the over 7000 old high school students; Temples Bath-Ash and Sha-Arey-Shalom; the Presbyterian Church; Lions-Club; Santa Lucia; Balfour Golf Course employees and the staffs of the Gov. Livingston and Jonathan Dayton Regional High Schools.

Anyone else interested in joining the program, either as part of a new group or as an individual donor, this week was invited to do so by calling Mrs. Stickle at 662-7242 or Mrs. Sue Kalem at 378-6862 for appointments or further information. Members of all donor groups were asked to make their appointments through their own chairman, making appointments in advance, whenever possible, greatly facilitates the entire bloodmobile operation, Mrs. Stickle said.

Donors must be in good general health, be between the ages of 17 and 65 and weigh at least 110 pounds. (Those between the ages of 17 and 19 need written parental consent before donating.) Persons may donate every eight weeks, up to five times a year. Women who have been pregnant within the past six months must postpone donation; those taking medication on a regular daily basis and those who have had surgery within the past year should check their acceptability by calling Mrs. Kalem.

Donors with a history of malaria or hepatitis cannot be accepted; weight donors were urged to check with their own physicians first. Every donor is given a complete physical, including bloodmobile and each donor's acceptability is decided by him.

Giving blood is described as "simple and nearly painless," requires about an hour from registration to examination and post-donation refreshment. The donor's medical history is taken, as are his temperature, pulse, blood pressure and hemoglobin. Following a brief examination by the doctor, the blood is drawn by a nurse or technician, afterward he is served coffee and cake. All donors were again reminded to eat their regular meals on the day of donation. (Continued on page 2)

Stokes disclosed that Richard Jenke, municipal hydraulics consultant, will attend to explain plans for drainage improvements on Haggan Golf Club property, which would relieve flooding in the area of West and Kipling avenues. He added that he had written to golf club officials seeking formal permission for construction of retention basins.
