Veterans require I-D: info to claim benefits overseas

The Veterans Administration has continued its efforts to check on the possibility of benefit payments to veterans who are unable to establish residence in the United States.

For example, a veteran with service-connected disabilities who is unable to establish residence in the United States, may be eligible for benefits if he is unable to do so because of the nature of his disability.

Interested applicants are eligible for medical benefits from military hospitals and clinics. (If benefits are not available in veterans hospitals, medical care may be obtained through private medical facilities.)

Eligible veterans, as well as eligible widows and widowers, are permitted to pursue degrees in many VA approved foreign schools.

Architect Society opposes bill to preserve historic buildings

The New Jersey Society of Architects said last week that the proposed National Preservation Act, which would permit communities to set up commissions that control the preservation of buildings, is a "subterfuge," but might help to preserve historic buildings.

The bill proposes that governing bodies may establish commissions to identify areas of historic, architectural, archeological, and aesthetic value to the state. Governing bodies may then adopt preservation district ordinances that would govern all structures within the district.

Other structures within the district might have been razed years ago. We feel the concept will not work unless there is a strong effort to pay for repairs and for planning board, legal and architectural expenses.

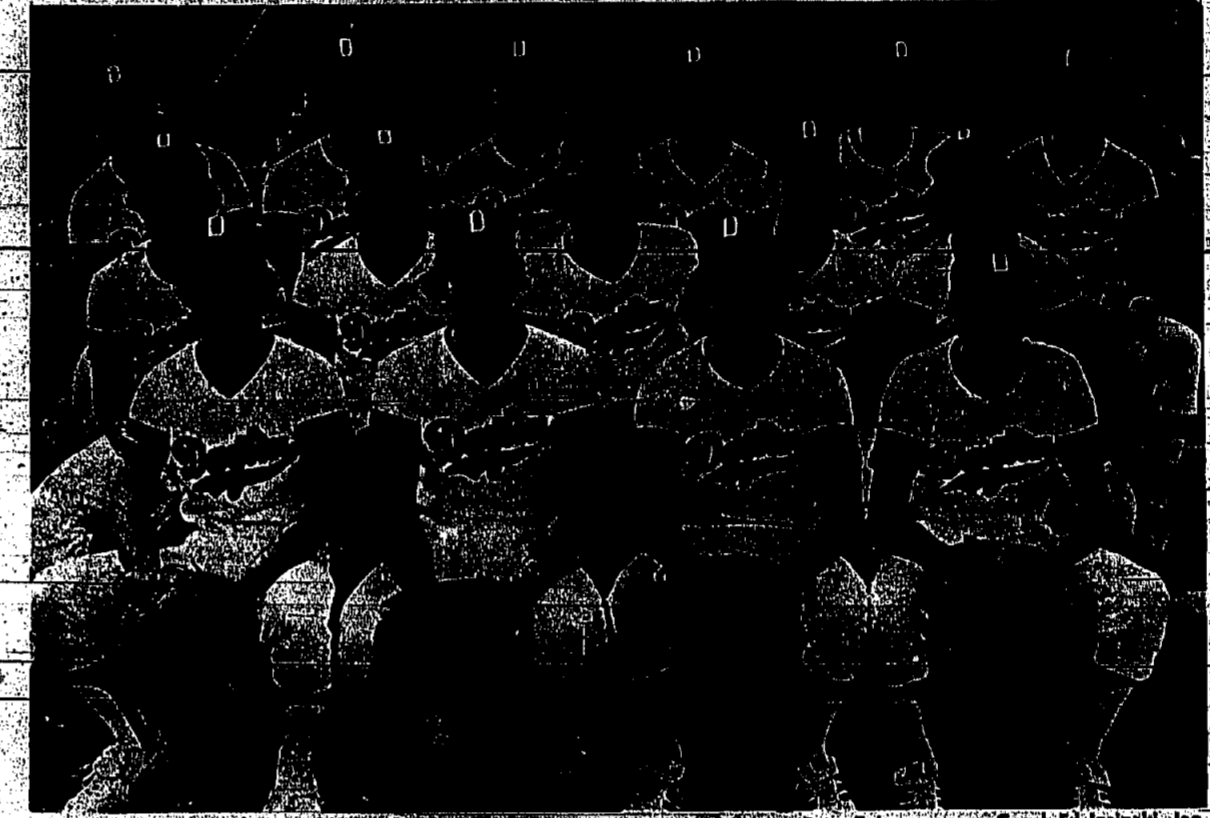
