Balber talks on music Completes 14 college lectures

A Leigh Balber of Springfield has completed a series of 14 lectures he was invited to give at the spring semester of the New Jersey District of Columbia Museum. The lectures, entitled "The Pleasures of Listening to Music," were given under the aegis of the university's Extension Program in October.

The audience ranged from people, a grand piano, recordings, slides and blackboards were used in the presentations.

Members of the class included a mathematics teacher, a physician and a pharmacist—as well as a piano tuner and a man who had worked in a laboratory in which electrical components were used in medical instruments. He has presented programs by such personalities as Bob Hope, Off Kilter, Suzanne Bloch, Benny Goodman and Leopold Stokowski and John Nelson of the Metropolitan Opera Co.

His musical interests started in early childhood. He studied the violin, harp, keyboard, organ and the "whole family" recorder. He has sung in public performances and has been a soloist in choirs.

He has also been a participant in many school and community activities, including the Hillside High School and John Nelson of the Metropolitan Opera Co.



Veterans require
I.D. info to claim
benefits overseas

The Veterans Administration has cautioned veterans to check on availability of benefits before traveling or establishing residence abroad.

For example, a veteran with service-connected disabilities who is not American citizen should carry with him overseas a statement of his service-connected condition issued by VA office nearest to his point of entry. The statement, together with an application for medical benefits, should be presented to the American embassy or consulate office in the country he is visiting.

In an emergency, a eligible veteran is entitled to VA-paid hospitalization if he notifies the embassy or consulate office within 72 hours after hospitalization. Notification of out-patient treatment is not required.

Only in the Philippines are care available for both veterans with service-connected disabilities and non-service-connected disabilities. In the Philippines, the Veterans Memorial Hospital is located there as in the United States, veterans with non-service-connected disabilities are eligible only on a special basis and only if they are disabled to a degree which would entitle them to a disability pension.

Retired dependents are eligible for medical benefits from military hospitals and clinics. GI home loans are not available to veterans living in foreign countries, but compensation and pension payments can be sent to all veterans' addresses, except for certain "bucked" countries.

Eligible veterans, as well as eligible wives, widows and children, are permitted to attend in VA approved foreign schools.

Drew will present summer class on exceptional child

A class on exceptional children has been added to the July 6-Aug. 3 second session of the Summer School at Drew University, Madison.
