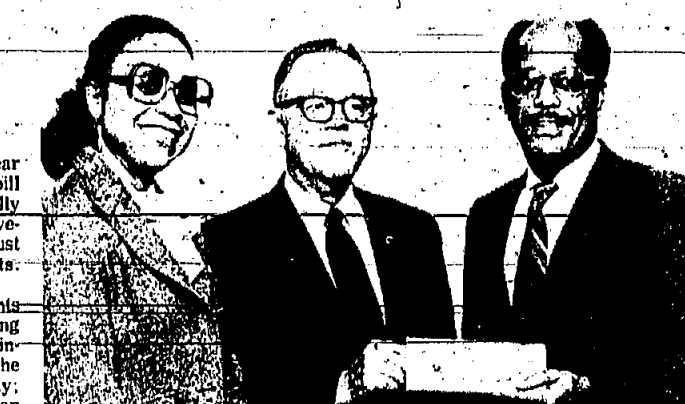

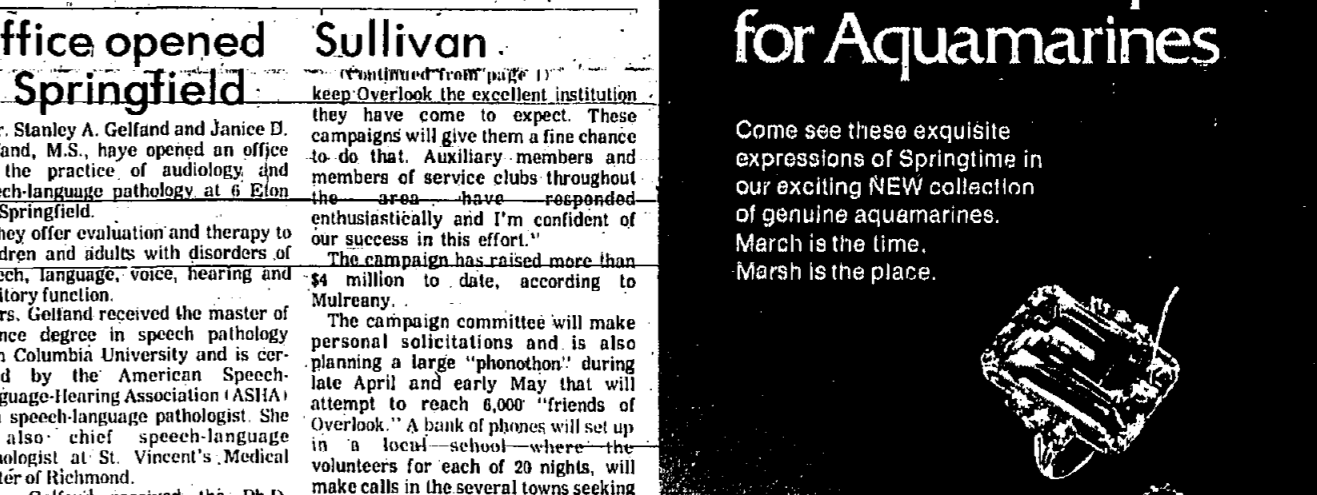

Acid rain, a 20th Century phenomenon, has caused widespread damage in New York and Pennsylvania and poses a severe and increasing threat to New Jersey.

It is spreading with such devastating impact that I have asked Congress to authorize an in-depth investigation of the problem and of ways in which it can be brought under control.

There is particular cause for concern in New Jersey, for the state has more than 500 lakes and rivers, and all of them could become contaminated by a spread of acid rain. The health of 7.5 million people living in the state could be endangered. Crops valued at millions of dollars could be ruined and thousands of buildings structurally weakened.

Extensive environmental harm already experienced in neighboring states illustrates the seriousness of the acid rain threat to New Jersey, and the urgent need for national and international remedies.

Acid rain observes no state or even national boundaries. It can be created in one industrial area and strike hundreds of miles away.

Acid rain is created mainly by sulphurous pollutants and nitrogen oxides pouring into the atmosphere from coal-burning plants in such industrial areas as Ohio, Indiana, western Pennsylvania and other Great Lakes states. Auto emissions everywhere contribute to the problem. The pollutants oxidize in the atmosphere and are carried long

Prime Time Where will charity go in the future?

Charity may or may not begin at home, but it certainly grows most of the solicitations consistently come in the form of letters, telephone calls and personal visits.

While this plethora of pleas may occasionally seem somewhat overwhelming, most people still tend to respond to charity appeals generously, but often with a great deal of puzzlement stemming from the general lack of available information about the individual charities seeking contributions. The result of this is turning out to be charity's loss.

"There has been a persistent decline in the propensity of Americans to make charitable gifts," notes Waldemar A. Nielsen in "The Endangered Sector: Much of the blame for this, he feels, can be attributed to the standard income tax deduction for charitable contributions because 'the full deduction is available to nonitemizers whether or not they have given anything to charity.'"

Nielsen, who has been studying and writing about the non-profit sector for years, has a valid point. There is, however, no excuse for the possibility that much of their reluctance to give is directly traceable to the contributors' confusion. People have heard for instance, that there are charities where part of the funds raised go to pay professional fees and lawyers' costs, and where those funds are quite rightly used for the worthy cause for which they are intended, but most people can't tell the difference without a scorecard.

Fortunately, scorecards are now available from the Philanthropic Advisory Division of the Council of Business Bureaus (1150-17th Street NW, Washington, DC 20036) and the National Information Bureau (410 Park Ave. S., New York City 10018). Both will provide you three individual reports on various charities free. PAD requests a stamped, self-addressed envelope to be submitted with your inquiry, while NIB prefers that you use postcards.

Beyond these relatively simple practices, there is increasing public concern about where organized charity—and the entire non-profit sector in general—will be in the future. Does it have a foreseeable future? Or is it being co-opted out of existence by government social service programs?

"While I applaud the intentions of the annual 'Days of Giving' campaigns, contributions for the sick, the aged and the infirm," comments Carl Bakal in "Charity U.S.A.," "what reads me about these campaigns is that they perpetuate the notion that any members of our society should have to depend on anything as a neighbor has provided and adapted itself to changing times and circumstances, evolving from individual acts of private charity to what are still immensely important complex philanthropic public establishments."

"As America continues to change, one expects that its private, non-profit sector will continue to respond to the challenges. If it doesn't, then we may all be in far more trouble than we've ever got to be before."

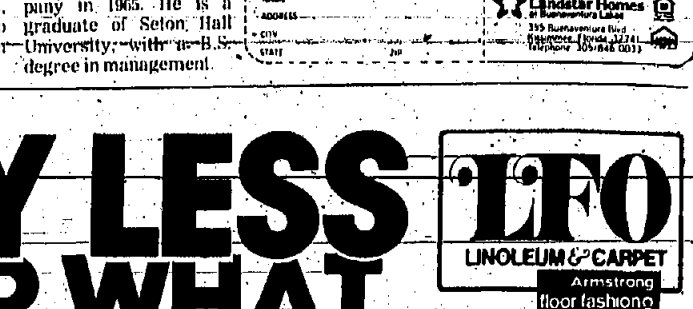

When this man fails, he's a fiery success

A 32-year-old Bound Brook man makes his living setting fires and otherwise trying to destroy things. Fred Stieling is one of thousands of engineers and scientists employed by industry to see how much punishment products can take and still survive. It's called "destructive testing," and from it manufacturers strive to come up with windows that won't shatter, bumpers that don't crumple, shingles that won't burn, and light bulbs that burn for years.

Stieling sets torches to fire-resistant asphalt roofing at GAF Corp.'s research facility at South Bound Brook, to see if flames will penetrate the shingles and spread to the roof's wooden deck.

In addition, special test machines generate 100 miles-per-hour winds and simulate typhoon-like rains to determine if the GAF roof can withstand extremes of weather for long periods of time.

Similar tests are conducted on scores of products by Underwriters Laboratory, an independent, non-profit organization that issues fire ratings for all kinds of building materials and electrical devices.

"It's not enough to know we can pass these tests," Stieling says.

Stieling, a New Jersey native, received a bachelor's degree in chemical engineering from Stevens Institute of Technology in 1969 and a master's degree from Rutgers University. He and his wife, the former Arlene Kiehl of Sayreville, live in South Brook.

"It's getting harder and harder to destroy some of these new building materials," Stieling said. "But that just makes the job more interesting."

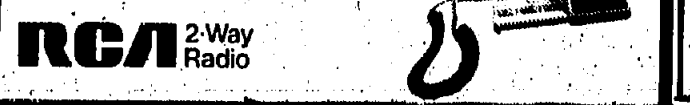

Manufacturer earns 'reward' in community

When Henry Jacobs comes across an unfair situation, he does something about it. In fact, the 75-year-old resident of Paterson has been fighting inequities since the Depression and today contributes both time and money from his plastic tool handle business to community causes.

Born in Brooklyn, Jacobs and his two sisters were sent to live with relatives in up-state New York after their mother died when he was seven. At 17 he returned to New York City where he went to the Pratt Institute to study engineering, supporting himself with a job with the Richmond Restaurant chain.

When the Depression hit, the devastating effect on the work force attracted Jacobs to organized labor with the hope of improving the wretched lives of American workers. John L. Lewis of the United Mine Workers gave him and several other people an organizational fund from which he developed the Congress for Industrial Organizations (CIO) and the United Office and Professional Workers of America (UOPWA).

"Although Henry Jacobs' net worth is recalled, 'I stayed at this for five years and then I was called to service after the attack on Pearl Harbor.' After 18 months in the United States as an enlisted man, Jacobs graduated from Officer Candidate School and was immediately shipped to the China,

Burma, India Theater of Operations, eventually earning five combat stars and 18 awards and decorations during his three years overseas.

In 1945 Jacobs returned to this country, spending six months at Tilton General Hospital at Fort Dix. After his release from active duty that same year, he joined an organization called the China Vets, which actively opposed the federal government's position on China.

"This was during the McCarthy era, and speaking up against government policy made getting a job virtually impossible," Jacobs told a writer from The National Council on the Aging. His difficulties in obtaining employment helped prompt Jacobs to start his own business, which he financed with a loan of \$12,000 on his G.I. and other insurance policies.

"The first year I was in business sales were \$83,000," Jacobs said. "Today, American Polymers is the largest manufacturer of plastic tool handles in the world."

Gregory, who discusses such issues as civil rights, nuclear energy, hunger and health, has written nine books and has recorded numerous albums. Information is available at the student activities office, 627-2044.
