The Committee announced that a public hearing on the new budget will be held on an increase in the tax rate of about four points, as opposed to the eight-point increase which would have been caused by the former budget proposal. The \$1.25 would have instead a three or four cent increase per \$100 assessed valuation to the average taxpayer. Welches said the proposed increase was triggered by a hike in pension contributions and energy costs, over which, he said, the town has no control.

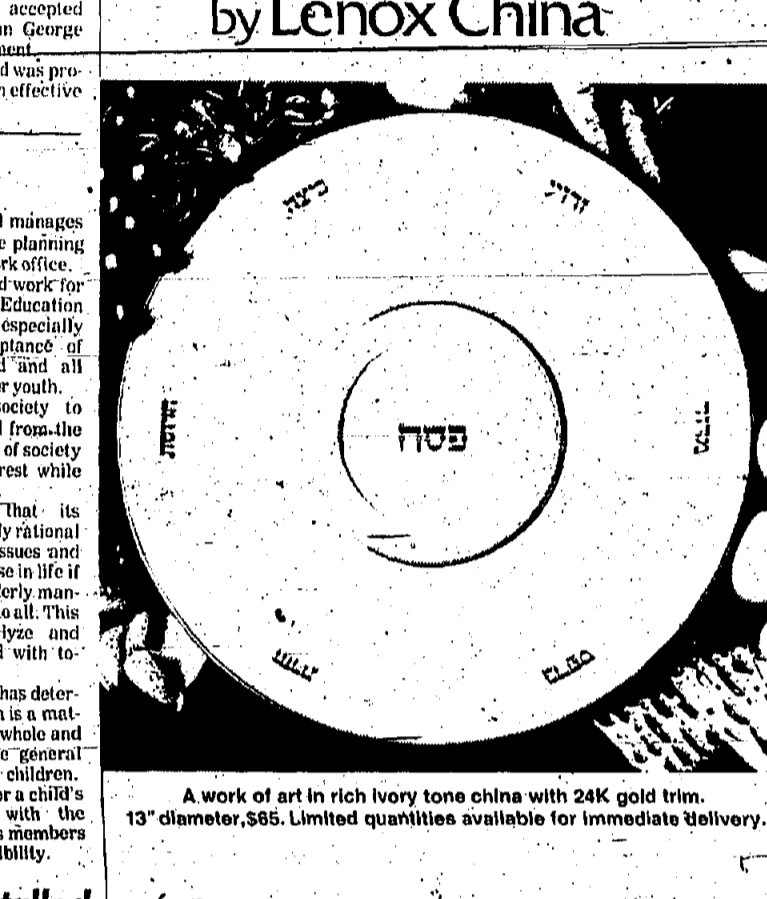
