The immediate subject of the research is cheerleading, and he decision will be reflected in the number of girls' sports teams in the high schools.

:All high schools are under a state mandate to move toward: parity in boys' and girls sports. Before the end of the decade here must be an equal number of boys' and girls' teams, ncluding varsity, JV and freshman squads. If the two groups of cheerleaders, fall and winter, can be

listed-among the girls' sports, according to a board spokesman, that reduces by two the number of girls' sports required. The school board had been adding one girls' sport a year at each high school—at least until it collided with the budget cap this year.

The number of varsity sports is approaching equality, but the boys have many more freshman and JV squads. (Coed teams are not credited to the males or females.) The board seems to be acting in good faith in its efforts to resolve the problem, but a ruling in tavor of the Regional District will result in a slowdown in growth of female athletics. Specific sports vary at each school, but there have been discussions of adding field hockey, girls' soccer and JV

basketball, to give a few examples.
