## David Wasserman: 'loving, well-loved,' a special young man

A loving young man and a well-loved young man were the words Rabbi Reuben R. Levine of Temple Beth Ahm used to describe David Wasserman, Springfield, at his untimely funeral service last week.

Mr. Wasserman died last week at the age of 18 in a tragic accident in Delaware. Friends and teachers describe Mr. Wasserman as a brilliant student, a natural leader, a personable and happy young man.

"His greatest gift was his personality. He always was happy, never down," said Arthur Krupp, who taught him as a sophomore at Jonathan Dayton in Newark and accelerated Algebra II and as a senior in advanced placement calculus.

"Whenever he walked in a room, he brightened it up," said his older brother, Eric, a teacher in Flemington. "He had the greatest sense of humor," he continued.

"He was the kind of kid everyone liked. No one had a bad thing to say about him," said Bob Lowe, who coaches varsity baseball at Dayton.

Mr. Wasserman was an excellent student all the way around," said his mother, Mrs. Howard Wasserman, who was also a varsity player and as a junior varsity player under the coaching of William Kinder.

The award has been renamed the David Wasserman Memorial Sportsmanship Award, Lowe said.

He was taken to Wilmington Medical Center by helicopter. He died as that evening, state police said.

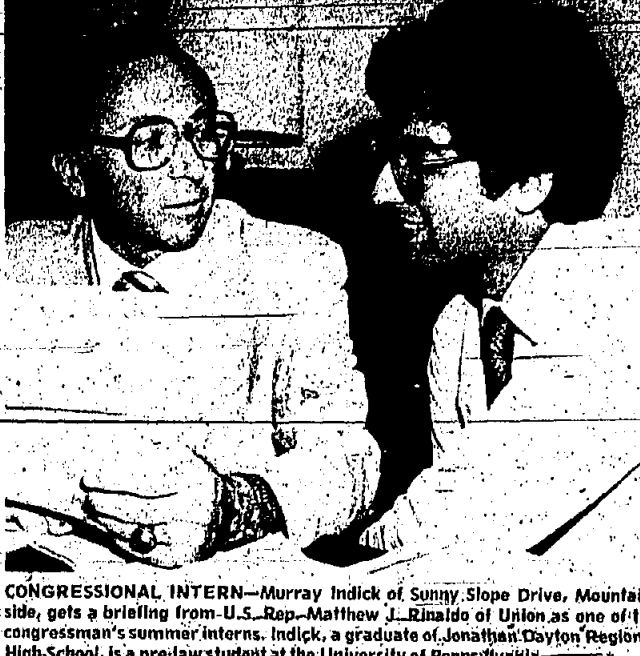
