**'Nutrition Network' offered for teachers**

UNION—Cecilia V. Maher of Stockton Road assisted in development of a week-long nutrition education course given at New Jersey colleges this summer.

The course, "Forming a Nutrition Network: Science, Culture, Education," was presented at Kean College, Monmouth College and College of St. Elizabeth/Fairleigh Dickinson University. More than 75 teachers attended.

Maher is a nutrition consultant for the Dairy, Food and Nutrition Council Inc. at Cedar Knolls, co-sponsor of the program.

A graduate of Immaculate College in Pennsylvania, with a master's degree from Rutgers University, she is a member of the executive board of the New Jersey Dietetic Association and a former college instructor.

She said the objectives of the course were to enhance nutrition teaching skills of participants, update nutrition information and emphasize the advantages for educators of "networking" and sharing resources.

Subjects covered included malnutrition and learning, drug-nutrient interaction, nutrition and cancer, use of media in nutrition education, assessing nutrition information resources and anthropology and nutrition.
