The marathon is a thinking skills convocation presented by members of the Union County Gifted and Talented Association. Marathon coordinator and Springfield teacher of the gifted and talented, Sandy Einhorn, said Tuesday that this is the fifth year the event is being held. "It's always hosted by Gaudineer," she said.  
Einhorn said the assembly is based on a track meet motif in which students run a course composed of five activity stations. Four teams of between eight and 10 members were assembled for this year's marathon. Each team is made up of students from the three districts.

## Town nets \$133K in grant funding

The Township of Springfield received \$133,500 from the Union County Community Development Block grant program earmarked for capital improvements, according to Assistant Engineer Sam Marlini.  
Springfield received \$27,000 for barrier-free curb cuts, \$78,000 to install an elevator in the municipal building, \$8,500 for its senior nutrition program and \$20,000 for restrooms at the Catwood House, he said.  
The township requested \$66,320 for municipal property curb cuts to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act and was expecting to pay the additional \$5,000 cost, Marlini said. The township might add an additional \$5,000 to \$10,000 to complete the cuts, he said. During an earlier interview, Marlini said making all of the cuts would take approximately three years. The township recently installed 15 to 20 new curb cuts.  
Springfield received the total amount for which it applied toward the ADA-compliant elevator in Town Hall. The elevator would cost approximately \$94,000 to install, so the township will have to pay for the additional \$10,000, he said.  
Construction on the elevator hopefully will begin as soon as possible, since the township has already missed the 1992 deadline, he said. The next step, Marlini explained, is to hire an architect to develop the plans.  
Communications Jeffrey Katz said grant money is usually distributed by the end of the year and then there is a one-year time frame to use the funds

## Township further studies affordable housing options

The township is one step closer to creating affordable housing in Springfield and satisfying a Fair Housing Act and Supreme Court requirement after officials met with a court-appointed master to discuss possible plans.  
Members of the Township Committee and Planning Board met with David Kinsey, court-appointed master, to help Springfield comply with Mount Laurel II, a 1993 Supreme Court Decision.  
The township has already acted on one of Kinsey's recommendations to create a joint committee with representatives of the Planning Board and Township Committee.  
Kinsey was appointed to the case by Superior Court Judge John Pisano.

Springfield adopted a housing element and fair share plan in 1992 and submitted it to the Coalition on Affordable Housing in 1993. But because of a mid-1993 Supreme Court decision, which required municipalities to provide the opportunity for affordable housing, COAH did not approve the plan because it was under court jurisdiction, Kinsey explained. Therefore the court appointed Kinsey to help the township comply with the Mount Laurel II decision.

The township has no plan in place, he said. After the municipal officials review recommendations, the town is obligated to submit a revised plan to the court for review, since it is a legal issue, Kinsey said.  
Kinsey said he made some suggestions and pointed out some areas in the plan which could be changed. The township has a lot of choices of how it wants to comply. What it actually chooses is up to the municipality, he said he is just there to be helpful.

Springfield Township Committee representative Jeffrey Katz said the joint meeting has gone over the master's report, and if it is approved the municipality will be able to meet its affordable housing needs. Details of the recommendations can not be discussed because of pending litigation, he added.

Rebecca Donington, Planning Board attorney, said the board is trying to prepare a new affordable housing plan according to the law and

### All-Area Wrestling Team grabs success

Dave and Ron Bubnowski, Tarantino, Ott, Francesca repeat selections

The clear cut king of Union County wrestling this year was Union, so it comes as no surprise that the Farmers placed five on today's annual All-Area Wrestling team.

Union's first-team representatives include Dave Bubnowski (103), Greg Francesca (140), Ron Bubnowski (145), Frank Giordano (160) and Jayson Washington (heavyweight).

Union, which finished 12-2, had one of its best seasons ever. The Farmers finished No. 1 in Union County and No. 2 in the state after winning Parsippany Tournament, Union County Tournament, District 10 Tournament and Watching Conference championships.

About the only title Union did not win was the North Jersey, Section 2, Group 4 crown, falling to Randolph for the second straight year in the final.

Both Bubnowski and Giordano joined fellow All-Area wrestler, senior Anthony Barra (152) of Roselle Park, as Top 8 in their weight state tournament finishes. Dave Bubnowski, a sophomore, and Giordano, a junior, will have a chance to finish even higher next year.

The Bubnowskis are also two of five repeat first-team All-Area selections. Dave Bubnowski was first-team last year at 103 and Ron Bubnowski was first-team at 135 in 1992. Francesca, first-team at 140 this year, was first-team at 130 last year and Frank Tarantino of Roselle Park is a repeat selection at 119. Chuck Ott was first-team at 125 last year and first-team at 135 this year.

Rahway (9-2) finished second in District 11 and Roselle Park (8-5-1) reached the North Jersey, Section 2, Group 1 semifinals. Other area teams to post winning records were Linden (7-5) and Johnson Regional (6-5). Dayton Regional (4-8) and Roselle Catholic were the only area schools under .500.

**FIRST-TEAM**

**103 — DAVE BUBNOWSKI, Union:** The sophomore was the most successful area wrestler this year. He won Parsippany, UCT, District 10 and Region 3 tournament titles en route to a superb 20-2 record. He repeated as UCT and District 10 champion and has a 52-8 two-year mark.

"It was a delight to start our wrestling matches with either a 3-0 or 6-0 lead," Union coach Al Lilley said.

Bubnowski reached the quarterfinals of the state tournament and his only losses were suffered in Atlantic City, both by decisions. He was victorious in one of two wrestling matches in A.C. and finished the season with 15 pins and one technical fall.

"He wrestled better at the end of the year," Lilley said. "I think it was a matter of it all coming together."

**112 — TERRINE BASS, Linden:** This senior compiled a 15-4 record and had six pins. Bass finished second in District 11 by pulling off his biggest win, a pin of Westfield's Kevin Sullivan in the semifinals. Linden coach Theodore Thompson said Bass uses his quickness and determination to win matches. Thompson also said Bass is a very quick learner, something he proved with his first season.

**119 — FRANK TARANTINO, Roselle Park:** The senior, another repeat first-team selection, went 23-2, with his only losses coming by one point each. Tarantino won the Westfield Tournament, was second in the UCT and was a District 10 champ. His only losses were to John Cuccolo of Cranford 3-2 in the UCT final and to Louis Torres of Rahway 5-4 in the Region 3 quarterfinals. He had previously defeated Torres 8-5 in a UCT match.

Last year Tarantino was 20-11, finishing second in District 10, fourth in Region 3 and fifth in the UCT. Tarantino recorded 11 pins this year.

"Overall, he had an excellent year for himself," Roselle Park coach Sam Appello said. "Coming back to win the districts after losing in the UCT was a good achievement."

**125 — TOM WYSOCKI, Rahway:** A sophomore, Wysocki is already 10th all-time in school history with 40 wins. He won Outstanding Wrestler honors for winning District 19 for St. Joseph's of Montclair.

This season Wysocki was 20-4 with 10 pins. He won the Woodbridge Tournament, finished second in the UCT and was fourth in Region 3.

**130 — MIKE HARRIS, Linden:** The Tigers' captain and four-year varsity wrestler went 19-3 with 12 pins and finished third in the District 11. The senior also was named Outstanding Wrestler for winning the Woodbridge Tournament.

Harris, who lists Central Connecticut and Kean College as his college choices, has a great knowledge of the sport and a willingness to learn according to Thompson.

**135 — CHUCK OTT, Rahway:** Last season's District 11 champion and All-Area first-teamer at 125, the junior had another fine season despite not participating in the districts.

He went 15-2, winning by pin 12 times to increase his career pin total to 20. That's third on the school's all-time pin list and his 46-11 overall record qualifies him for seventh all-time.

Ott won the Woodbridge Tournament for the second time and finished second in the UCT.

**140 — GREG FRANCESCO, Union:** Another first-team repeat selection, the sophomore made our team at 130 last year after winning his first District 10 title.

He posted a 20-6 mark this year and won his second straight District 10 championship. Francesca was second in the UCT and in Region 3, both times losing to fellow sophomore Cory Posey of Westfield, who he went 0-3 against this year, losing all three matches by decision.

"He had a fantastic year for us," Lilley said. "He pinned his way through the Parsippany Tournament and was a big scorer for us."

Francesca had nine pins and two technical falls. He was 19-8 last year and has a two-year record of 39-14.

"He proved he can wrestle with the best in the state," Lilley said.

Francesca reached the Super Regionals competition of the state tournament where he was eliminated by Dave Baatis of Lyndhurst, a senior.

**145 — RON BUBNOWSKI, Union:** This senior reached the farthest of any area wrestler, finishing fifth in the state at his weight class. He was also the area's winningest wrestler with a 30-3 mark. All three of his losses came by decision and he recorded 17 pins.

Bubnowski made quite a comeback on the mat this year after missing most of last season when he contracted mononucleosis.

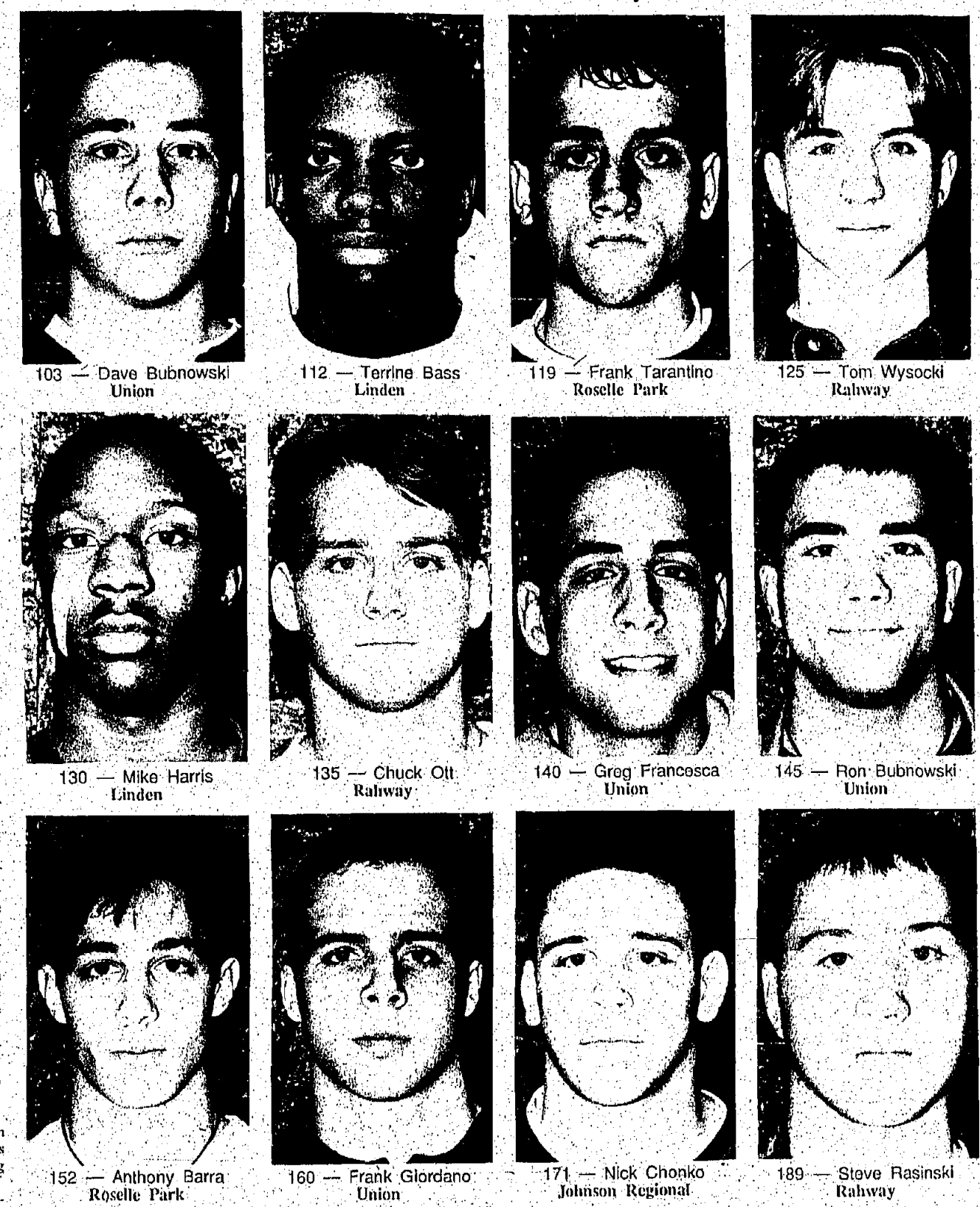
"He worked out during the summer and played football and came back very strong," Lilley said. "He had an outstanding year."

Bubnowski was a Parsippany, UCT and District 10 champion and finished third in Region 3. He lost to top-seeded Dave Hughes of Jefferson 4-2 in the state quarterfinals, but came back to win two of three wrestling matches to finish fifth in the state. Hughes was the eventual state champion.

Bubnowski was 4-0 last year before he decided to sit out the remainder of the season and went 21-5 in 135 two years ago, winning Parsippany Tournament and District 10 titles and earning first-team honors.

**152 — ANTHONY BARRA, Roselle Park:** An honorable mention selection at 152 his sophomore and junior years, the senior reached the quarterfinals of this year's state tournament, his second consecutive appearance in A.C.

Barra went 28-4 this year after qualifying for last year's state tournament, going 1-1, and finishing 24-8. He finished his career as Roselle Park's third all-time winningest wrestler with 90 victories. John Ranieri, who wrestles for Kean College, is the leader with 98, one more than Chris Tokarski's 97. Barra passed Jamie Shirner's total of 88.



**152 — ANTHONY BARRA, Roselle Park:** "Just to be able to make it to A.C. is a huge achievement, everyone's goal," Appello said. "He should hold him back a bit, but he still had a great season for us."

Barra sustained a minor shoulder injury during practice the week leading up to the District 10 Tournament.

Despite his ailment, Barra went on to win the District 10 title and finished second in Region 3, losing a tough 11-9 overtime decision to Parsippany's Mike Bismar.

Barra captured his second consecutive UCT title when he defeated Dave Stauffer of Elizabeth 5-3 in overtime.

In the state quarterfinals, Barra lost to eventual state champion Brian Brady of Madison Central 2-1. Both are members of the Edge Wrestling Clinic in Kenilworth.

Barra's only regular season loss came against Brian Eklaf of Scotch Plains 4-3 in overtime at 160. He defeated Angelo Carter of Pemberton 4-2 in overtime in his first wrestling match in the state before being eliminated by Jason Brown of Oakcrest 13-3.

**160 — FRANK GIORDANO, Union:** This junior had a monster year for Union. He was 13-6 at 140 last year and this year had to lose weight to wrestle at 160.

He finished 26-5 and reached the state quarterfinals, losing to eventual state champion Tim Hatcher of Randolph 18-11. No one had previously scored that many points against Hatcher, the overwhelming favorite to win the state's 160 title.

"He was a solid wrestler for us last year, but he wrestled scared," Lilley said. "He improved a great deal this year and was a lot more aggressive. He absolutely took off by winning the Parsippany Tournament and he just got rolling after that."

Giordano was a UCT and Region 3 champ, pinning Eklaf both times for his titles, the first time in just 19 seconds and the second in 1:40. He finished second in District 10 and had 15 pins.

**171 — NICK CHONKO, Johnson Regional:** In his third year on varsity—the previous two at Brearley Regional—the senior proved that, when focused, he could wrestle with anybody. He finished second in District 11 and the UCT, losing to Westfield's Paul Haly both times.

Chonko's 18-6 record this season was remarkable considering he went 1-10 as a sophomore and 9-10 as a junior. His 18 wins included 11 pins and a third-place finish in the Woodbridge Tournament, where he ended up losing to a two-time district champion.

**189 — STEVE RASINSKI, Rahway:** The senior finished 11-3 this season, including seven pins, and compiled a 41-13-1 three-year record. He is a two-time District 11 champion and finished second in Region 3 this year, losing to Summit's Bob Bickel, whom he had pinned earlier in the season. Rasinski also finished fourth in Region 3 at 169 last year.

Rasinski is especially potent with one particular move.

"He likes to work a 'Russian Tie,' which is his best move," Rahway coach Fred Steuber said. "He scored most of his victories with it."

**HWY — JAYSON WASHINGTON, Union:** The junior proved his way through the Parsippany and District 10 tournaments and finished 21-6. He wrestled on the junior varsity last year and was 1-1 in varsity matches.

Washington, who had 14 pins, finished fourth in the UCT and was defeated by senior Jose Negron of Elizabeth 5-0 in the Region 3 quarterfinals.

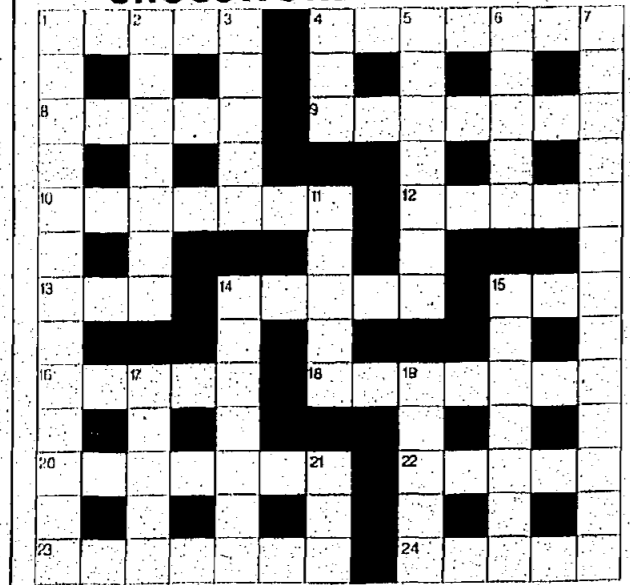

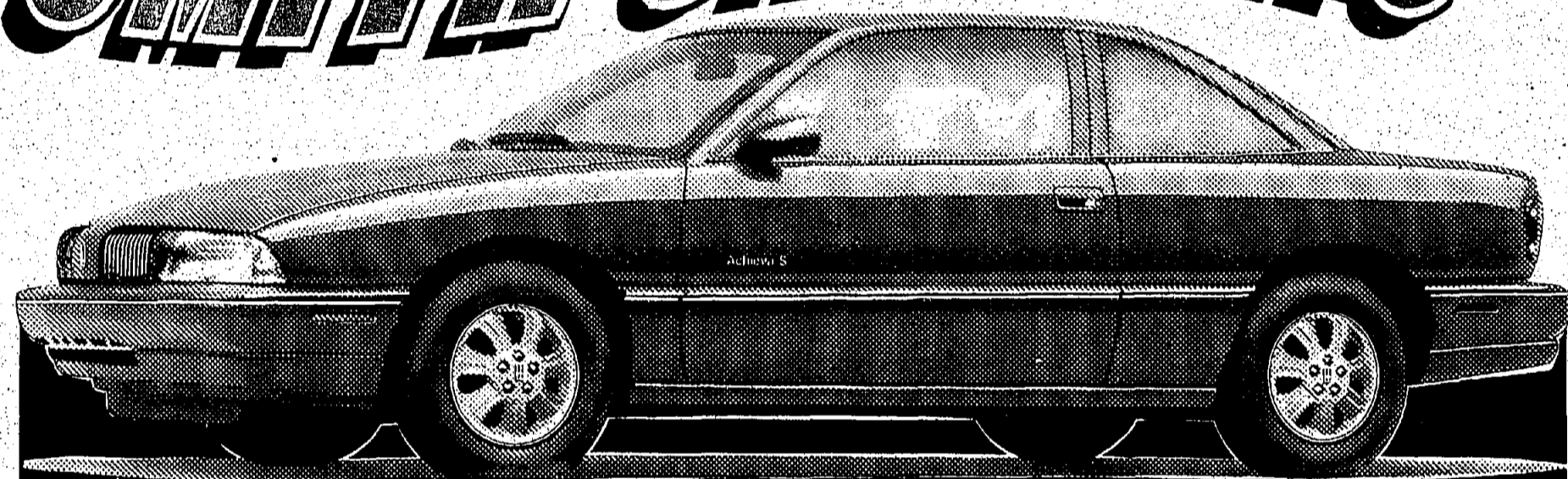


