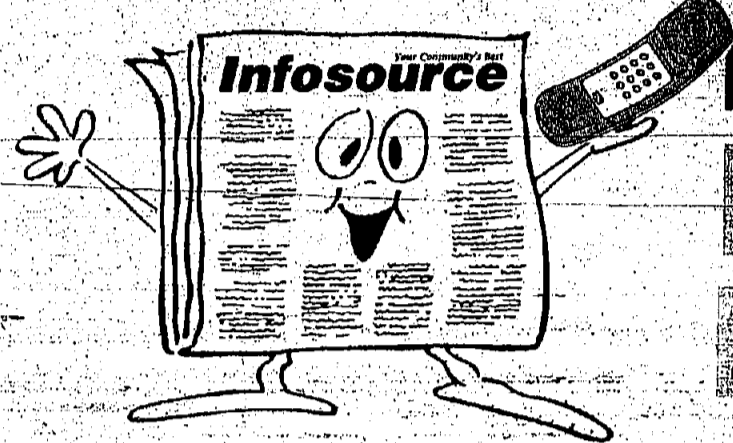

Leonie Piero's exhibition of paintings, "Lina Sana Unbroken Line: Ancestral Struggles" continues at The Gallery of South Orange.

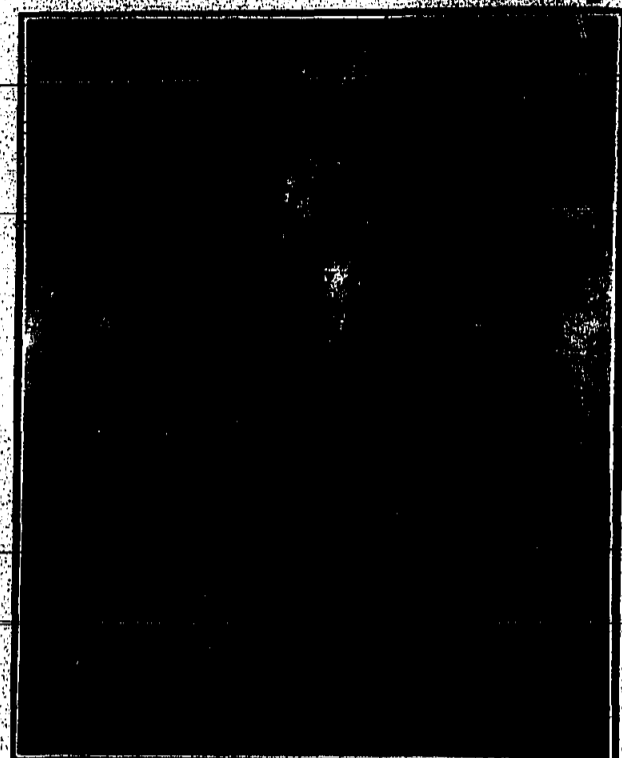

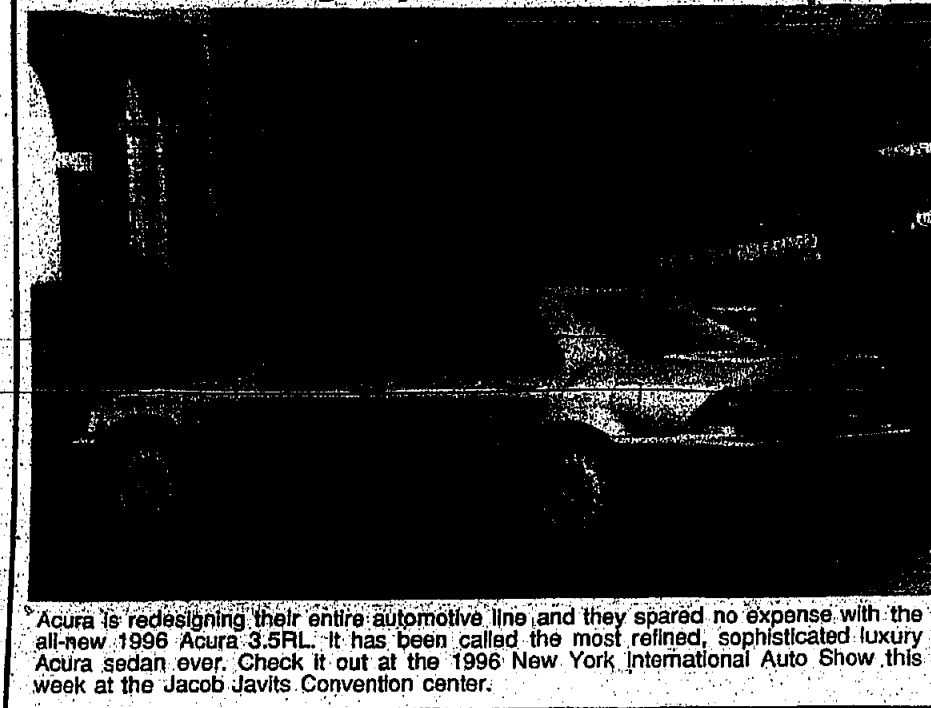
