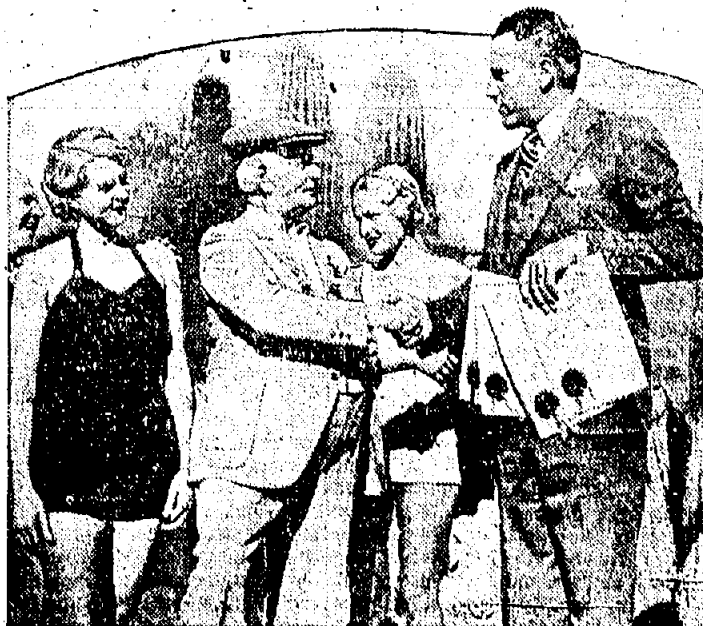

Tallest and Shortest at the Capitol



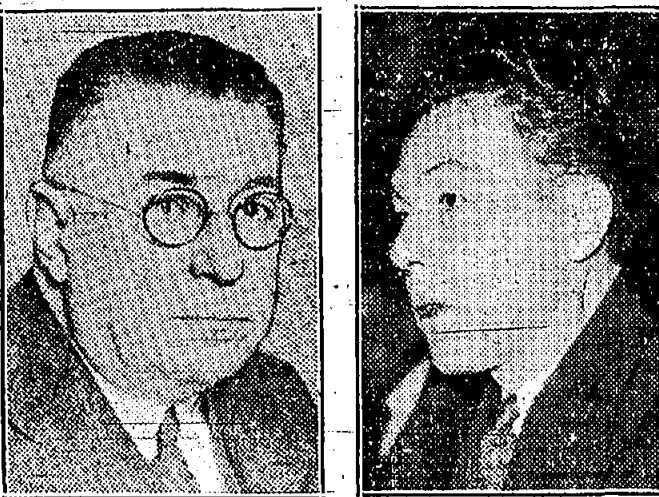

Their Arrest Ordered by Senate



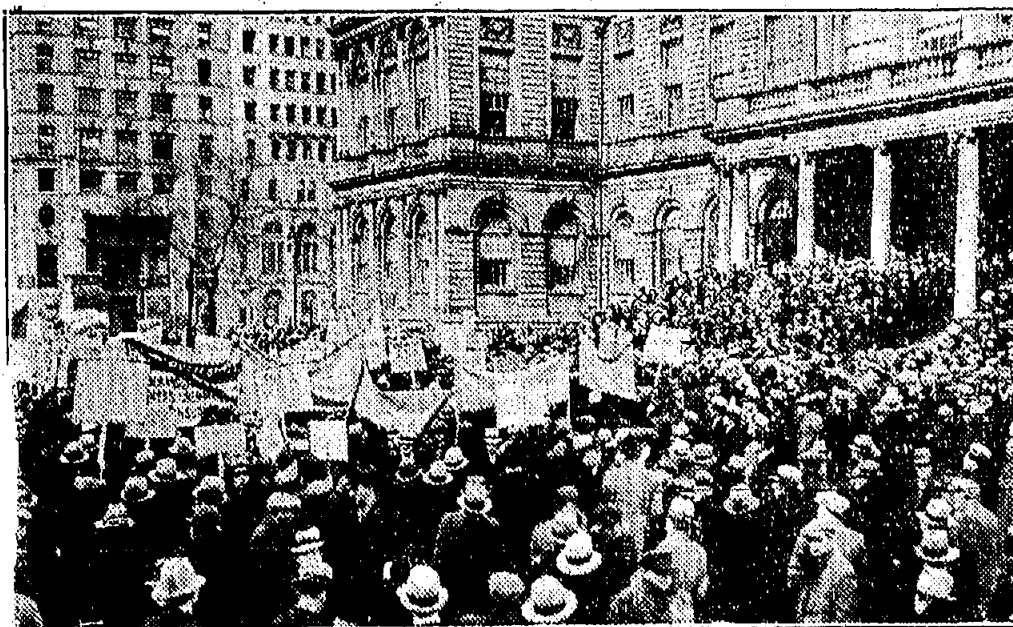

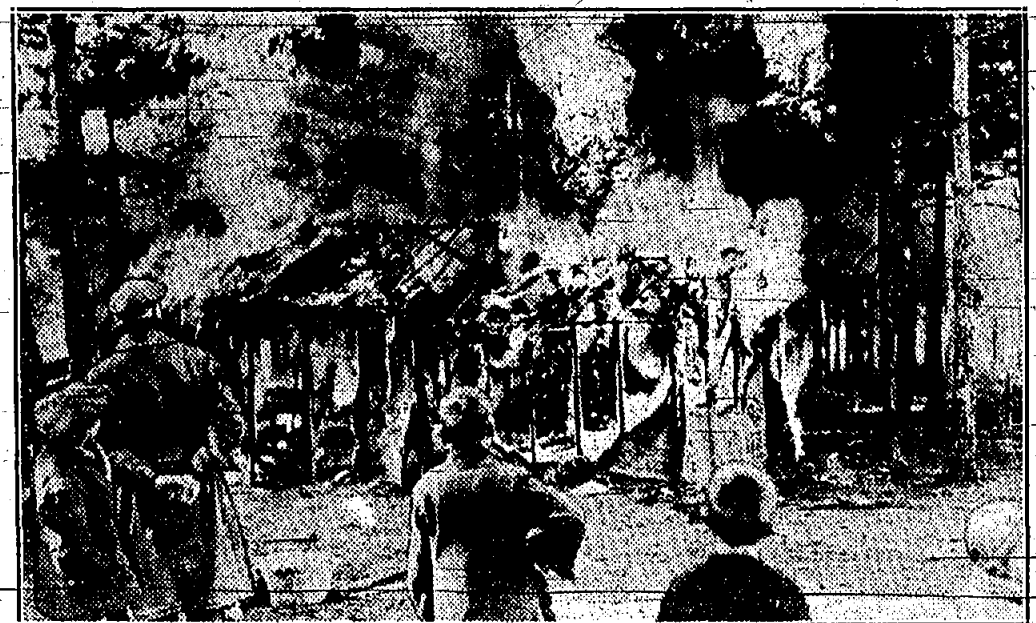

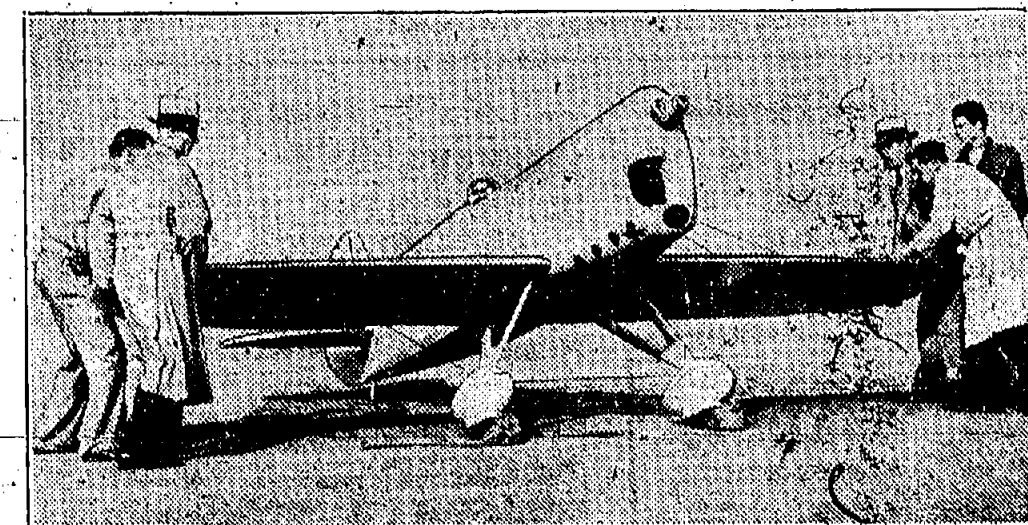
Miss Marjorie Brooker of New York is glimpsed in a snappy rubber bathing suit, sunning on the sands at Miami Beach, Fla.
