## New Process Developed In The Making Of Metal

Lester D. Supro, of East Orange, co-owner of Metals and Residues, Inc., a local Springfield manufacturer of high temperature metals, has recently developed a new process for making a metal that will stand a greater degree of heat than most metals which are currently used today in such fields as atomic energy and electronics.

This high temperature metal is known as molybdenum, or as it is known in the industry, "moly". It is silvery-white in appearance and has a melting point of 4750 degrees Fahrenheit; approximately 2000 degrees higher than the

melting point of iron, which is only 2800 degrees.

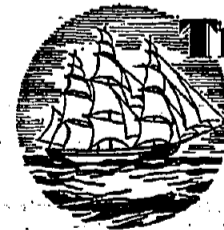

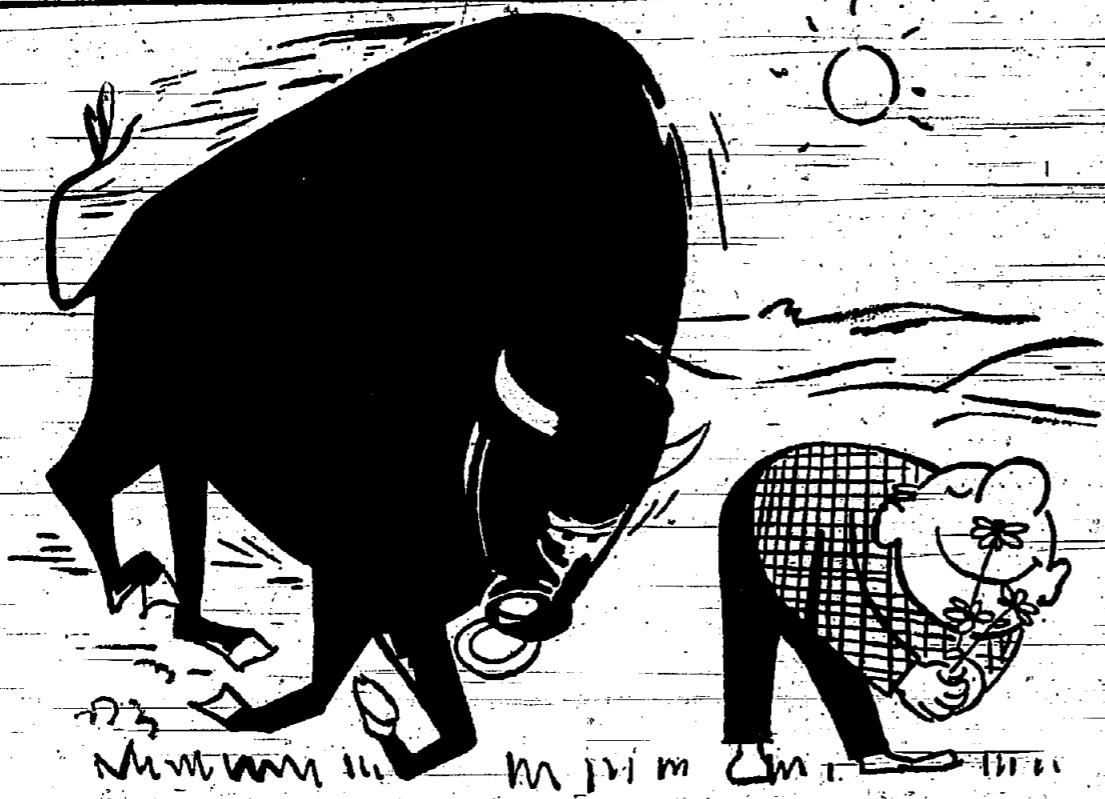
